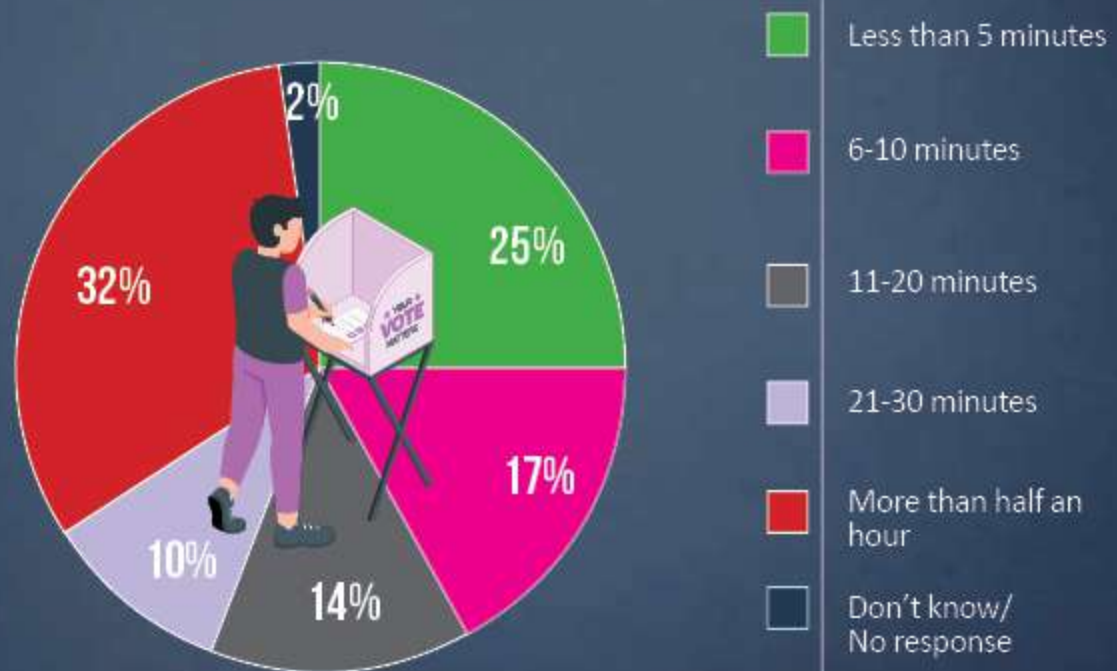

WHILE A QUARTER OF PAKISTANIS (25%) HAD TO WAIT LESS THAN 5 MINUTES TO CAST THEIR VOTES IN THE 2024 GENERAL ELECTIONS, 32% REPORT HAVING TO WAIT OVER HALF AN HOUR TO DO SO: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

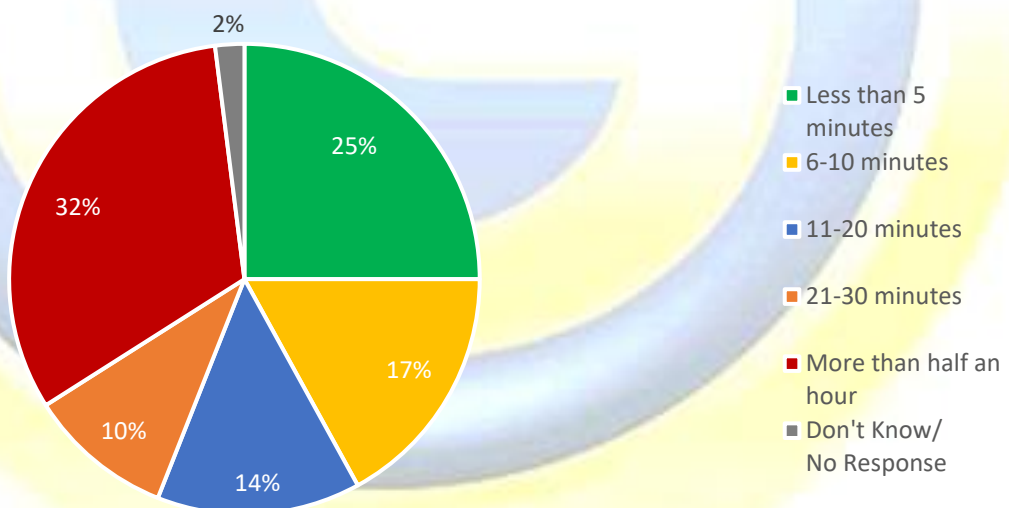

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, while a quarter of Pakistanis (25%) had to wait less than 5 minutes to cast their votes in the 2024 General Elections, 32% report having to wait over half an hour to do so.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country who voted in the recent elections was asked the question, “Please tell us how long you had to wait to vote? (This does not include the time to get from home to the polling station to vote, only the time from waiting in line at the polling station to vote)” In response, 25% said ‘Less than 5 minutes’, 17% said ‘6-10 minutes’, 14% said ‘11-20 minutes’, 10% said ‘21-30 minutes’, 32% said ‘more than half an hour’, and 2% said that they did not know or gave no response.

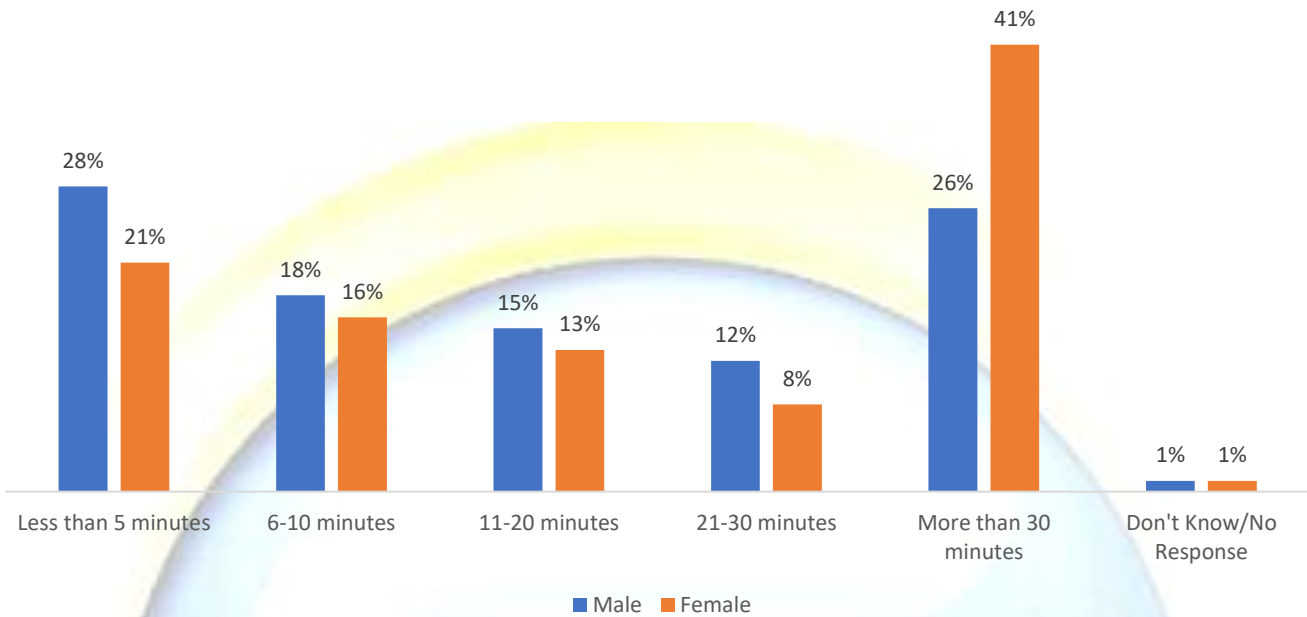

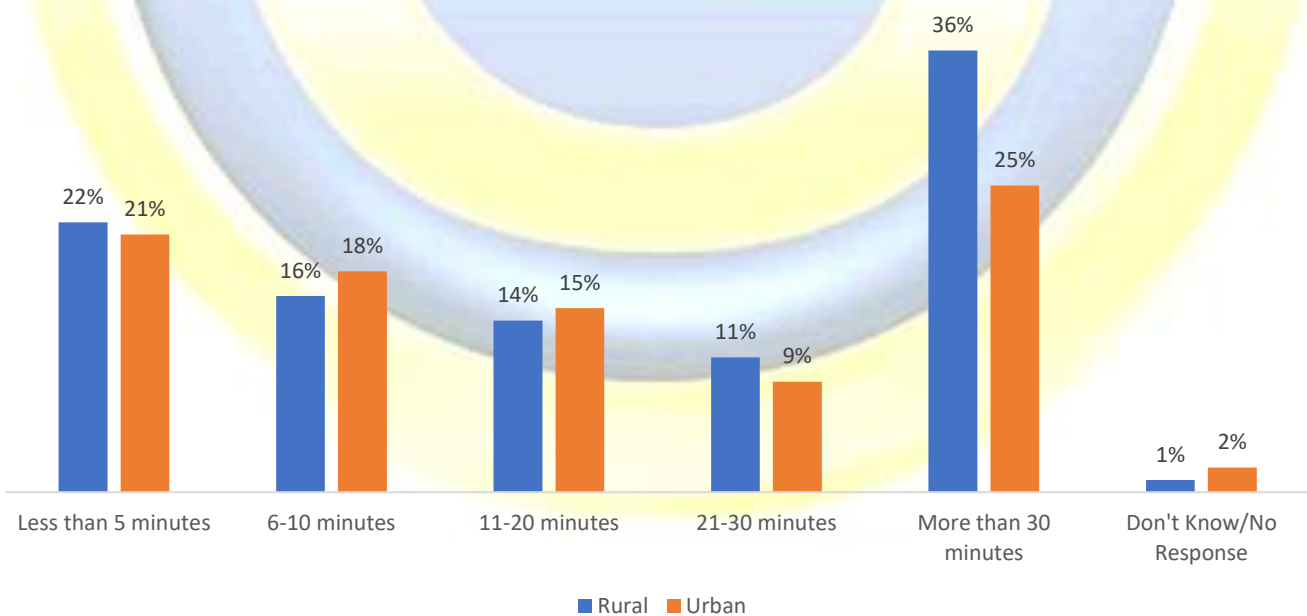
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,017 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 29th February – 15th March 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: A significantly higher proportion (15% more) of female voters (41%) reported having to wait more than 30 minutes at polling stations to cast their votes during the 2024 General Elections, compared to male voters (26%).

Across rurality: A higher proportion (11% more) of voters from rural areas (36%) voters reported having to wait more than 30 minutes at polling stations to cast their votes during the 2024 General Elections, compared to their urban counterparts (25%).
