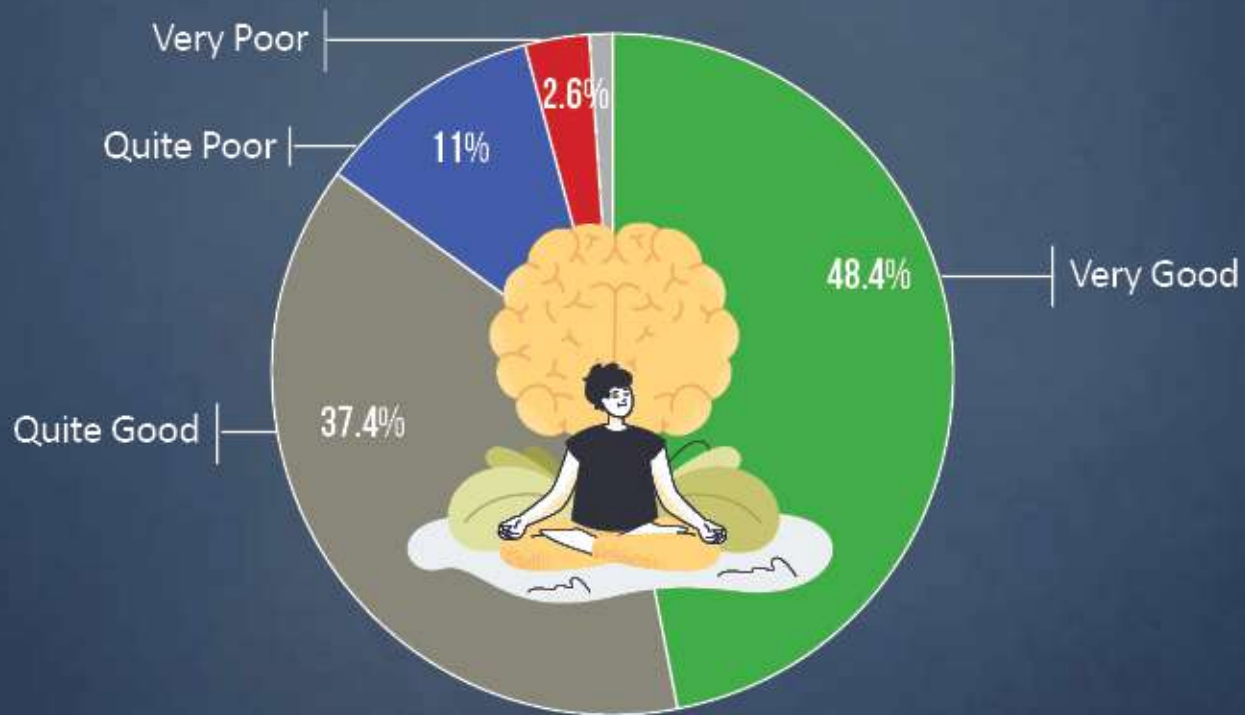

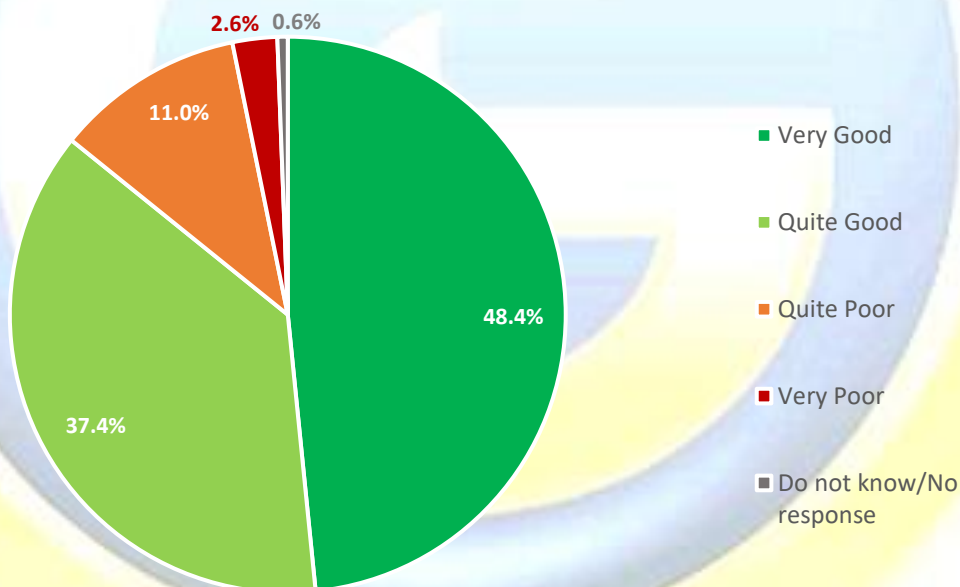

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 13.6% of Pakistanis express concern regarding their mental health and stress, while a majority (85.8%) do not appear to be worried.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “When thinking of your overall health, how would you rate your stress/mental health?” In response, 48.4% said “Very Good”, 37.4% said “Quite Good”, 11% said “Quite Poor”, 2.6% said “Very Poor”, and 0.6% said that they did not know or did not respond.

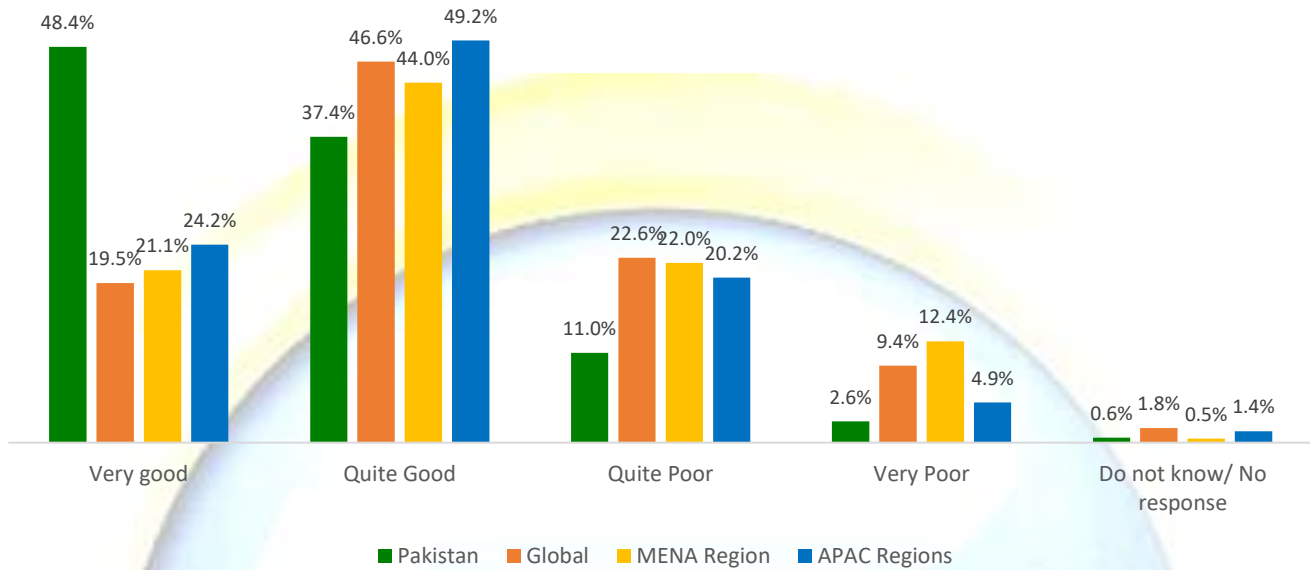
Question: When thinking of your overall health, how would you rate your stress/mental health?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 3rd – 17th January 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Global comparison: Pakistanis appear to be less than half as likely to report concerns regarding their stress and mental health (13.6%), compared to the global (32%) and regional averages for MENA (34.4%) and APAC (25.1%) regions.
