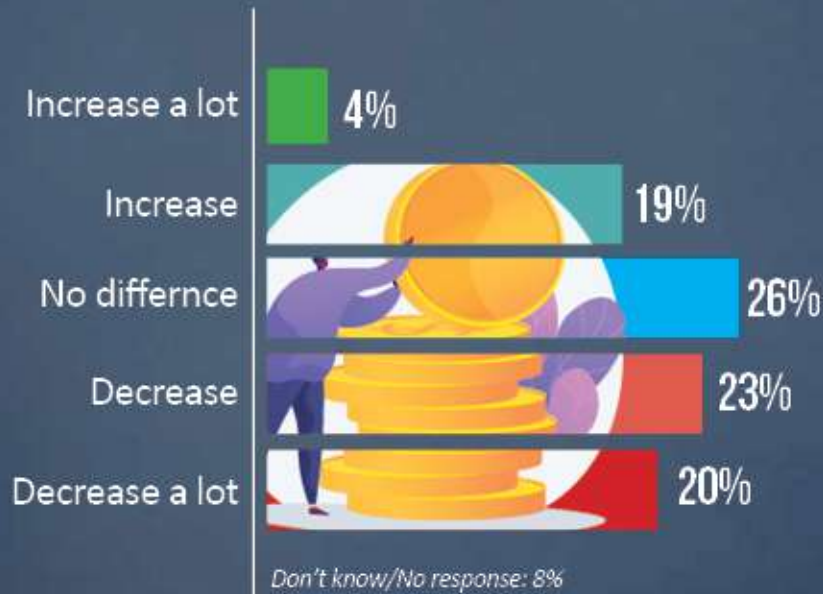

NEARLY A QUARTER (23%) OF PAKISTANIS EXPECT THEIR HOUSEHOLD'S FUTURE MONTHLY SAVINGS TO INCREASE, WHILE 43% EXPECT THEM TO DECREASE: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN AND DUN & BRADSTREET PAKISTAN

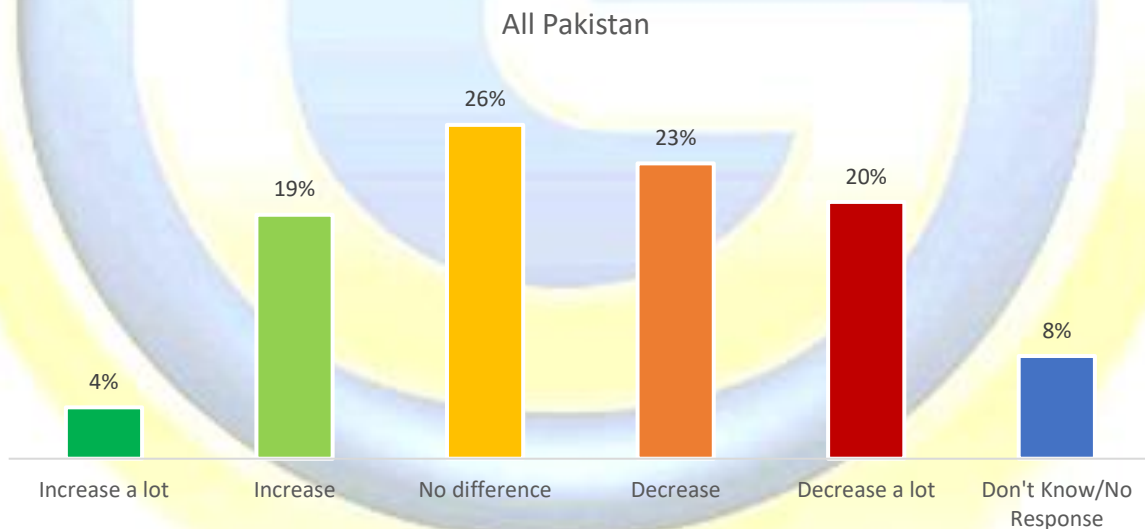

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan and Dun & Bradstreet Pakistan, nearly a quarter (23%) of Pakistanis expect their household's future monthly savings to increase, while 43% expect them to decrease.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, "In the next six months, compared to today, do you expect your monthly savings to increase, decrease or stay the same?" In response, 4% said 'increase a lot', 19% said 'increase', 26% said 'no difference', 23% said 'decrease', 20% said 'decrease a lot', and 8% said that they did not know or gave no response.

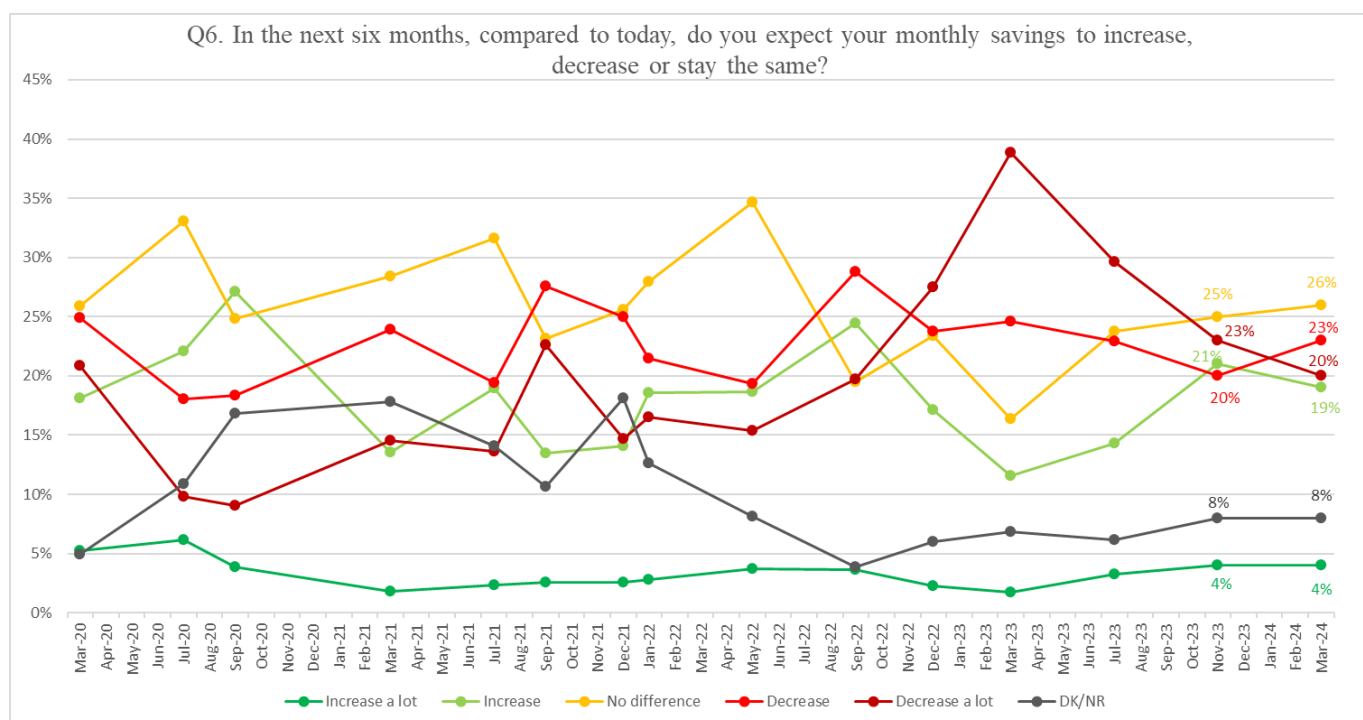
Question: In the next six months, compared to today, do you expect your monthly savings to increase, decrease or stay the same?

The study was conducted and released by Dun & Bradstreet Pakistan and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The study was carried out among a sample of 2,008 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during March 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
