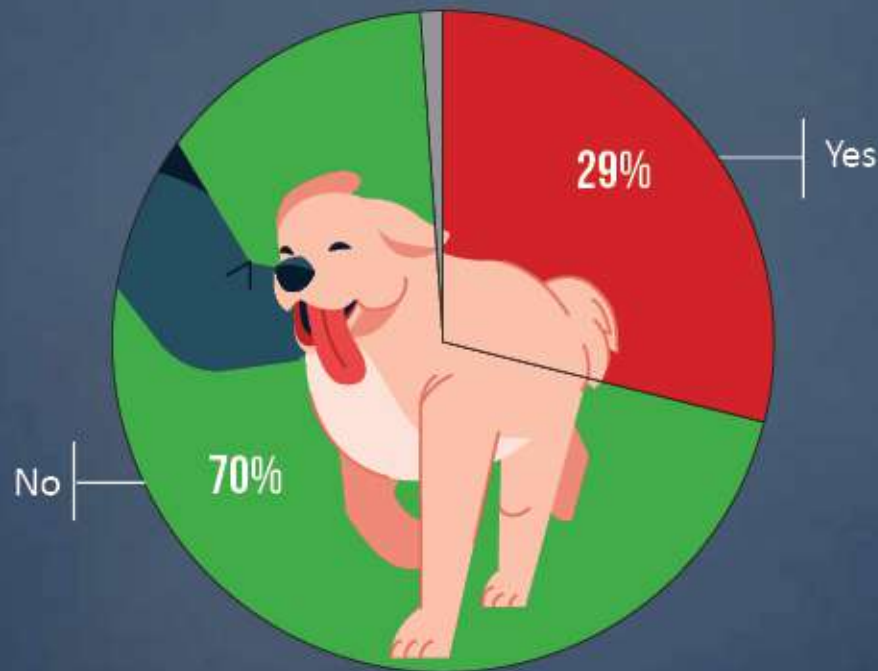

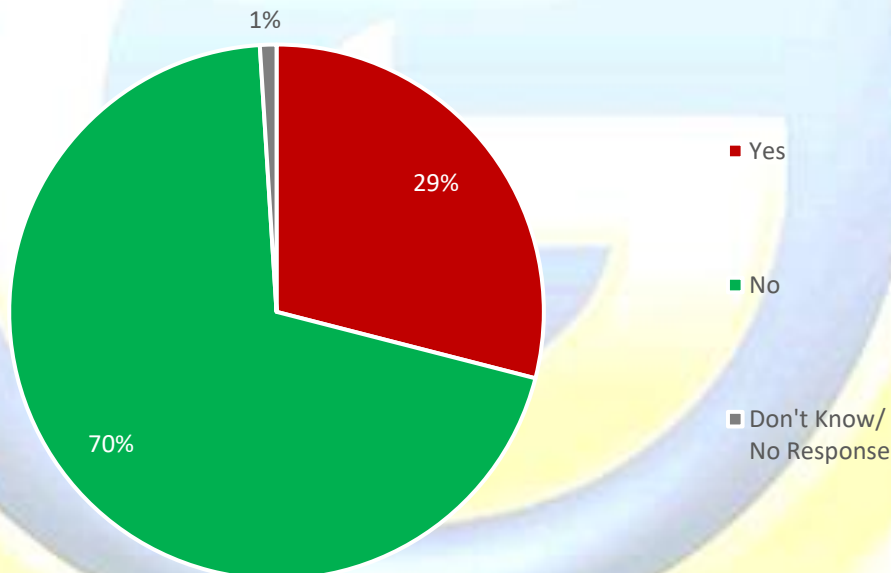
Issue of stray dogs pesters 1 in 3 Pakistani neighborhoods (29%): Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 24th July, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, issue of stray dogs pesters 1 in 3 Pakistani neighborhoods (29%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell if there is a problem of wild dogs in your area posing a threat to the community/area?” In response, 29% said ‘Yes’, 70% said ‘No’, and 1% said that they did not know or gave no response.

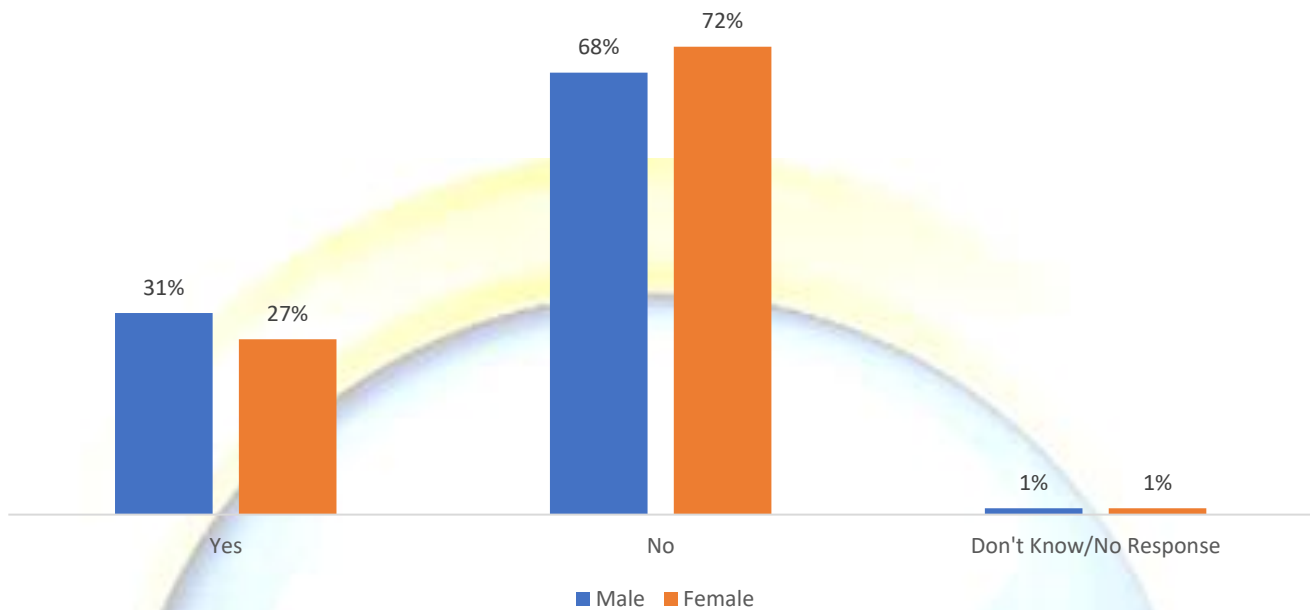
Question: Please tell if there is a problem of wild dogs in your area posing a threat to the community/area?

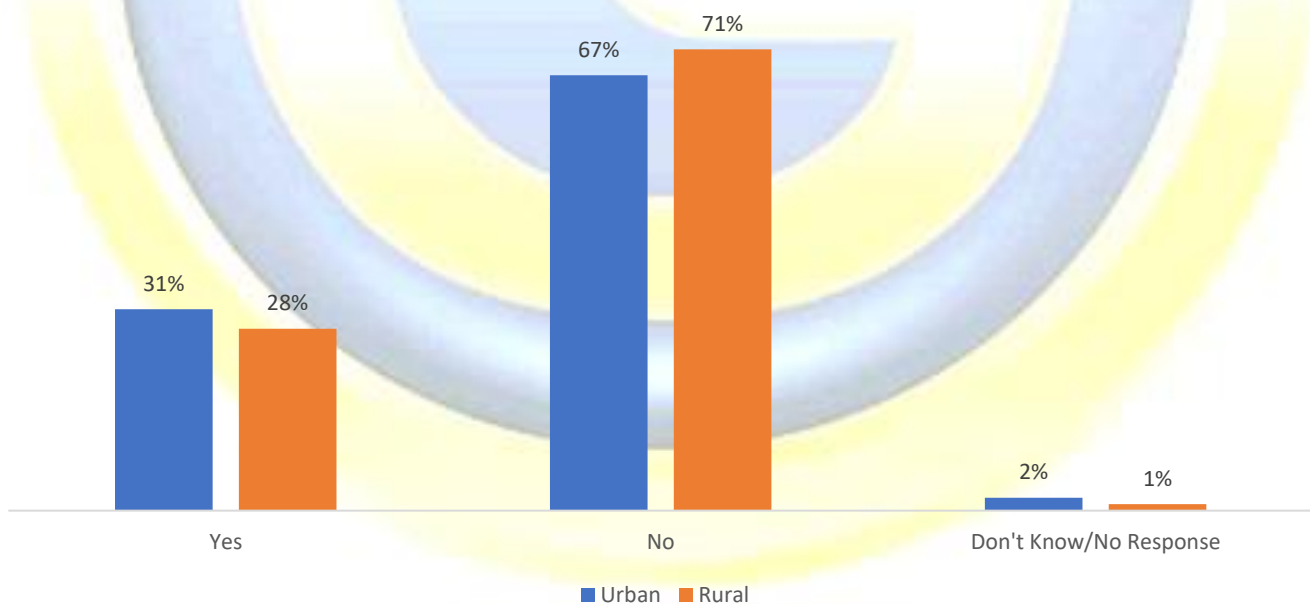
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 769 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 28th June - 10th July 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Pakistani men were more likely (31%) to report a problem of wild dogs in their community/area than women (27%).

Across rurality: While the variation is very minor, residents in urban areas were 3% more likely than their rural counterparts to feel threatened by stray dogs.
