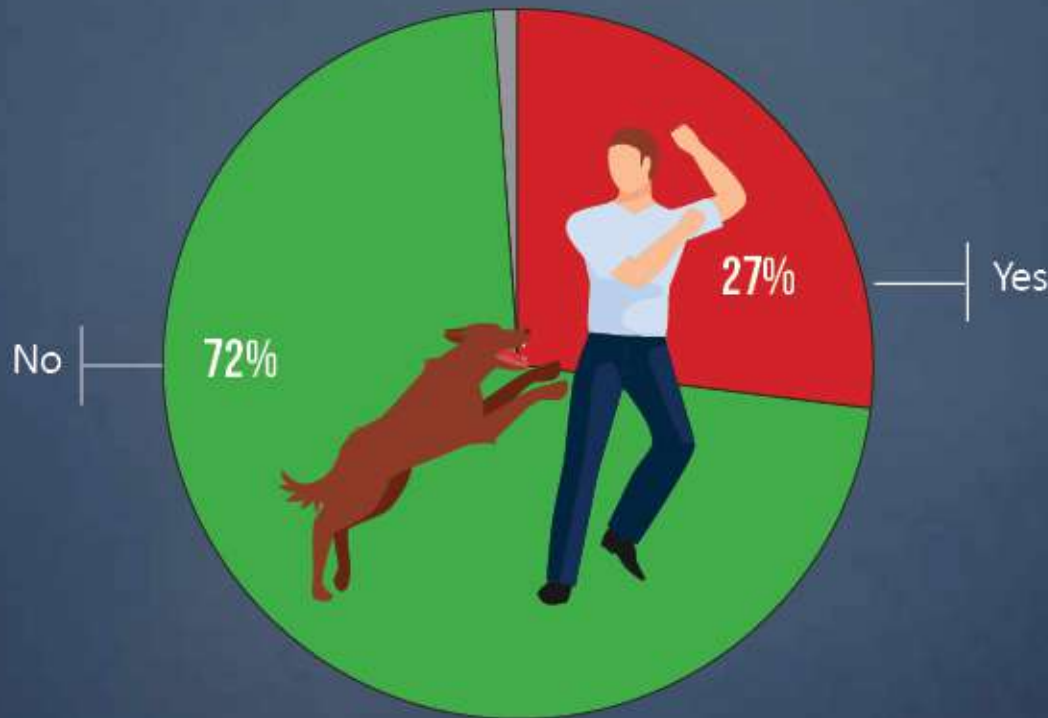

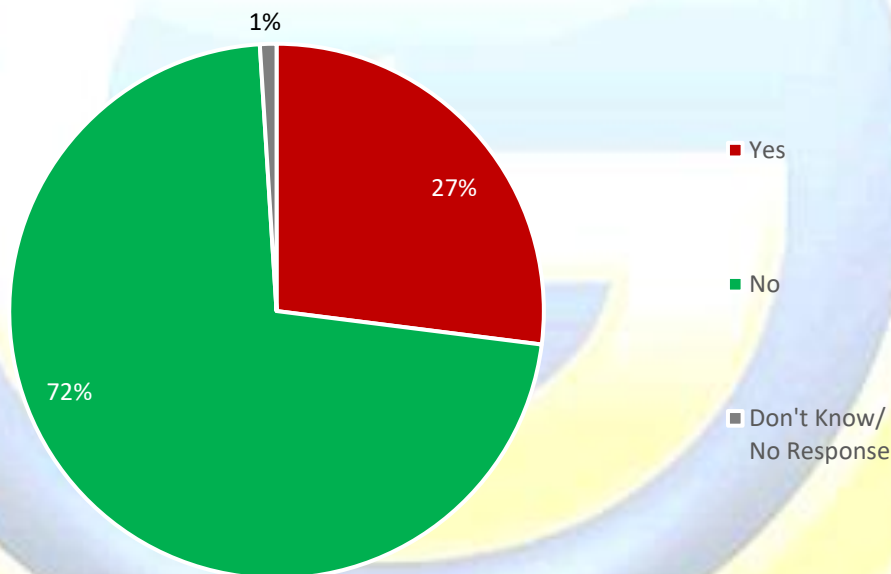
27% Pakistanis report having been followed by a dog, and having had to run away for safety: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 26th July, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 27% of Pakistanis report having been followed by a dog, and having had to run away for safety.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell me if you ever had a dog follow you and you ran away for your safety?” In response, 27% said ‘Yes’, 72% said ‘No’, and 1% said that they did not know or gave no response.

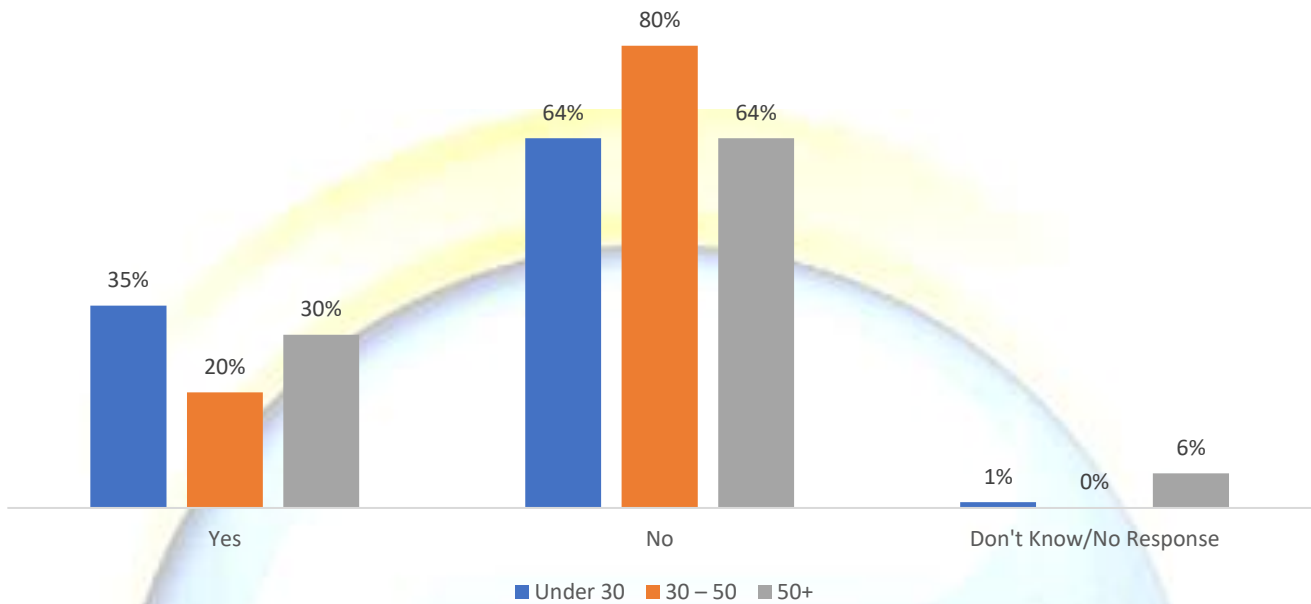
Question: Please tell me if you ever had a dog follow you and you ran away for your safety?

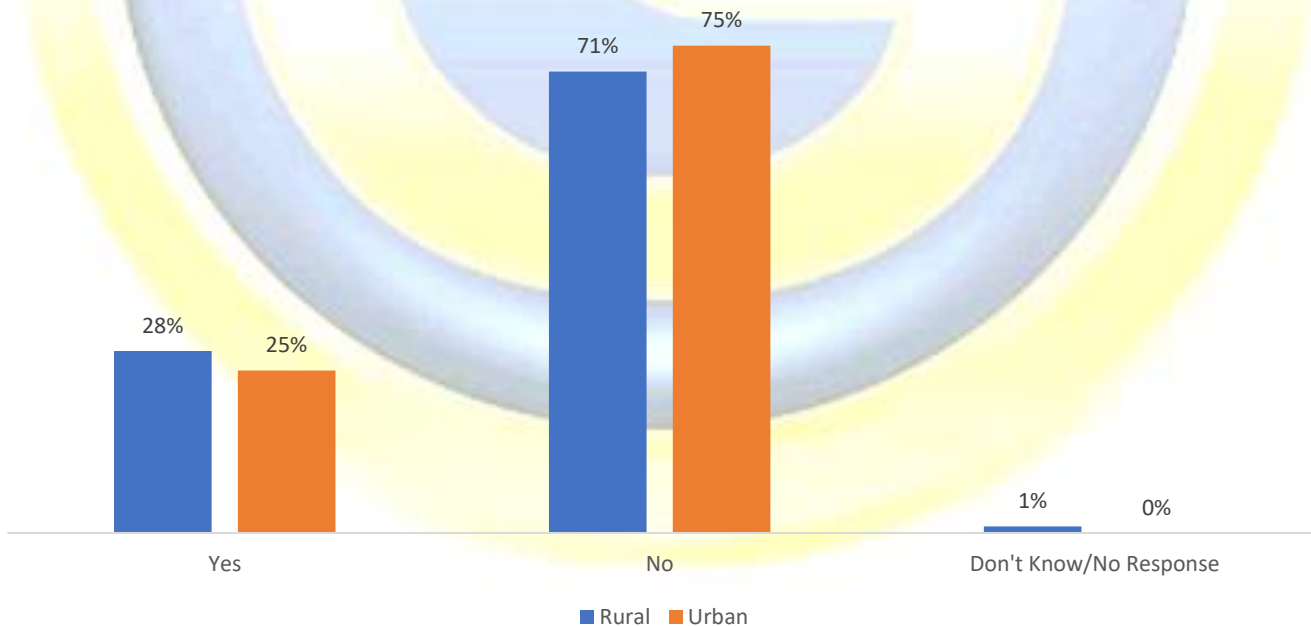
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 769 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 28th June - 10th July 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across age groups: People in the 'Under 30' age group were the most likely to have been followed by a dog after which they had to run away for their safety (35%), followed by the '50+' age group (30%), with the '30 – 50' age group being the least likely (20%).

Across rurality: Pakistanis living in rural areas (28%) were slightly more likely to have been followed by a dog, needing to run for safety, compared to their urban counter parts (25%).
