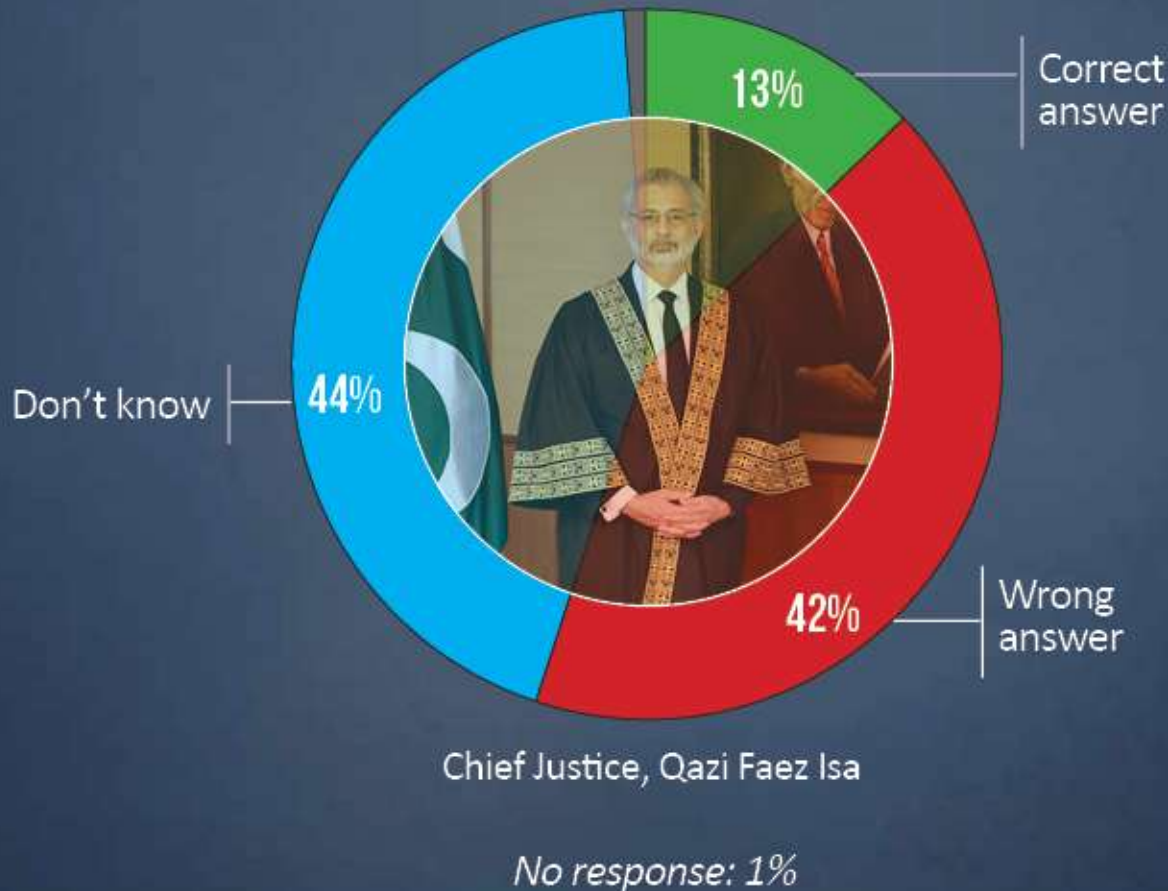

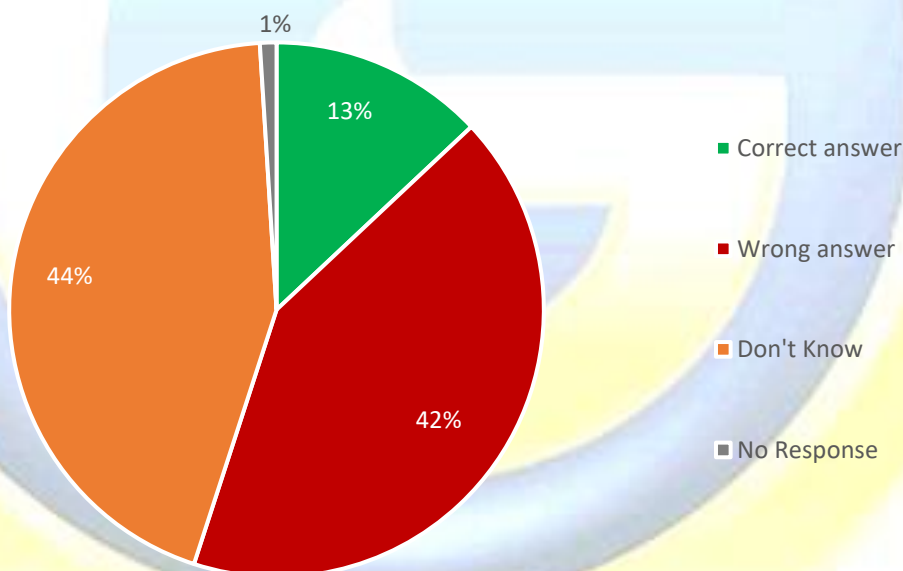

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, only a small proportion of Pakistanis (13%) could correctly name the current Chief Justice of Pakistan; men (23%) and urban residents (19%) being more aware.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell me the name of the present Chief Justice of Pakistan?” In response, 13% gave the correct answer, 42% gave the wrong answer, 44% said that they did not know, and 1% gave no response.

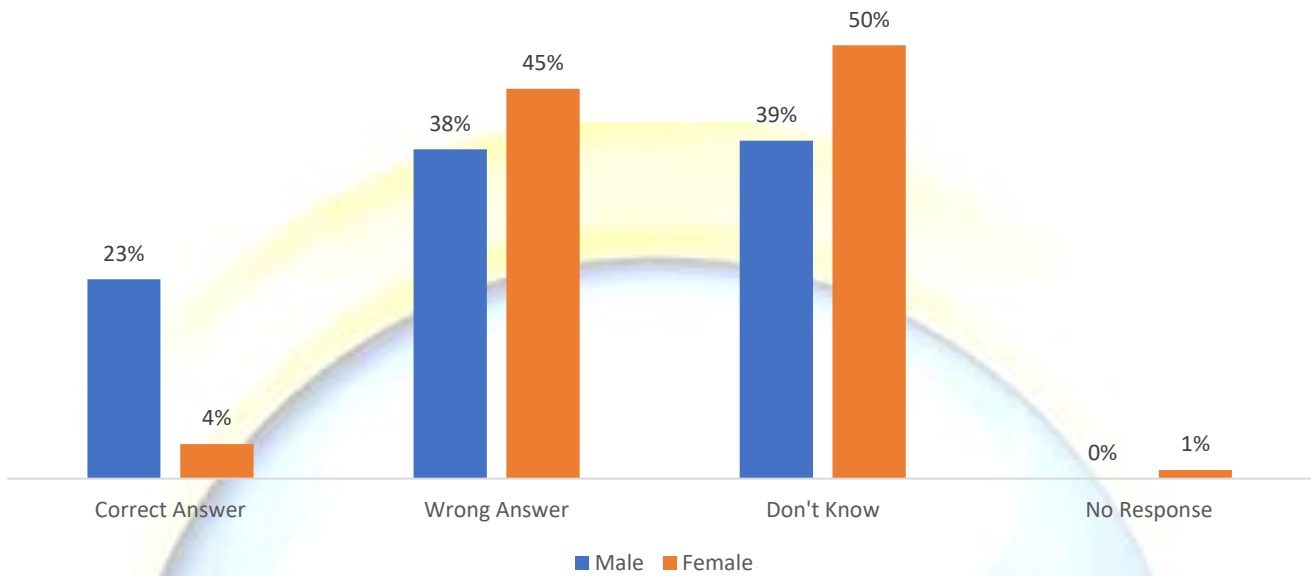
Question: Please tell me the name of the present Chief Justice of Pakistan?

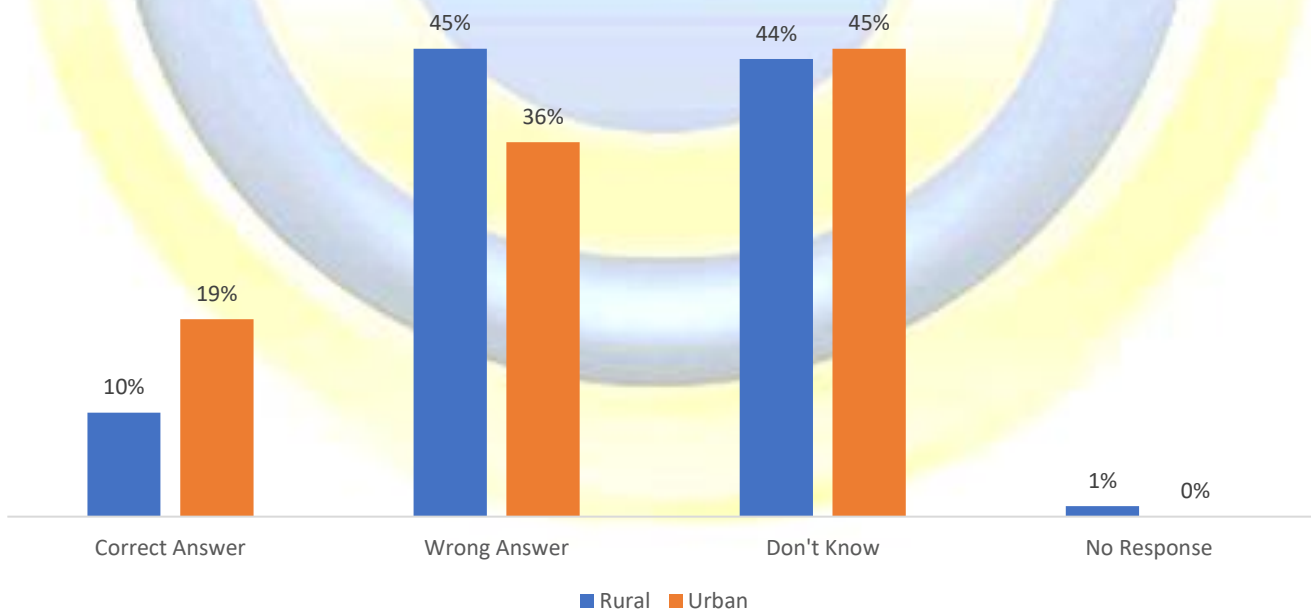
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 769 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 28th June - 10th July 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Pakistani men were much more likely (23%) to know who the present Chief Justice of Pakistan is, compared to Pakistani women (4%).

Across rurality: Urban residents in Pakistan were nearly twice more likely to know who the current Chief Justice of Pakistan is (19%), compared to rural residents (10%).
