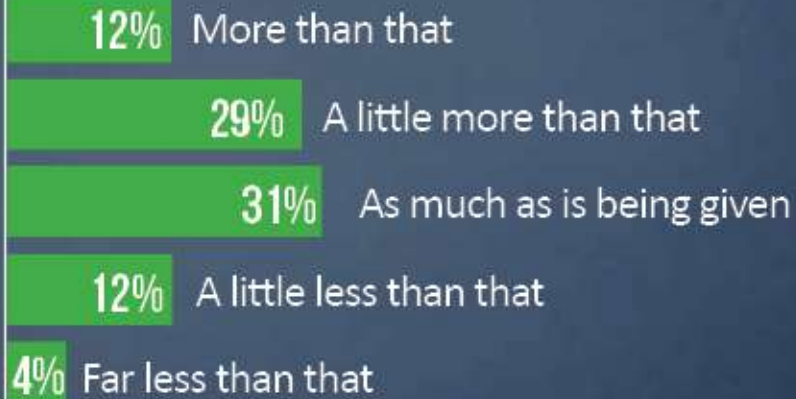

2 IN 5 PAKISTANIS (41%) BELIEVE THAT GOVERNMENT SCHOOL TEACHERS ARE UNDERPAID AND SHOULD BE PAID MORE THAN THEIR CURRENT SALARY; RURAL RESPONDENTS WERE MORE LIKELY TO HOLD THIS VIEW THAN URBAN RESPONDENTS: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

2 in 5 Pakistanis (41%) believe that government school teachers are underpaid and should be paid more than their current salary; rural respondents were more likely to hold this view than urban respondents: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

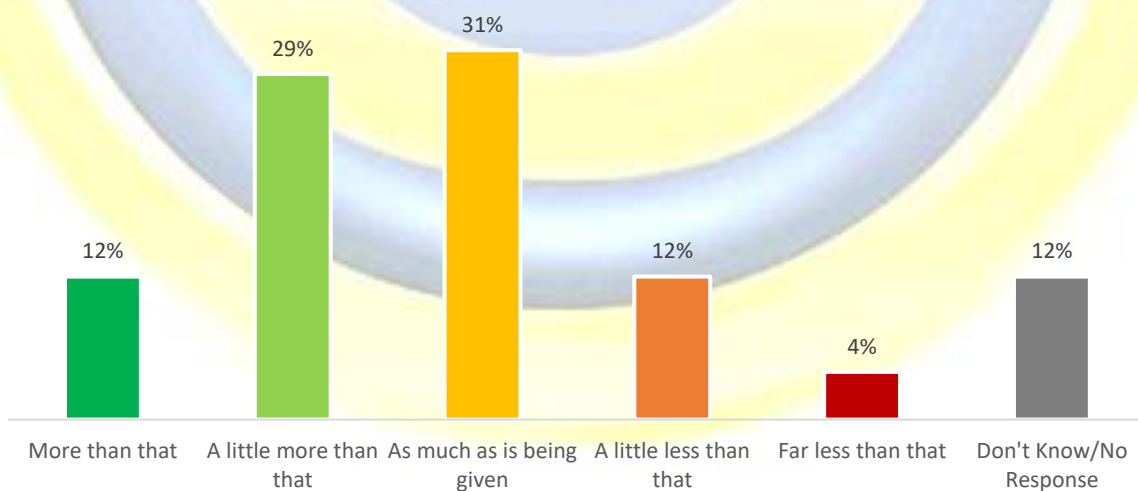

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 2 in 5 Pakistanis (41%) believe that government school teachers are underpaid and should be paid more than their current salary. Survey findings revealed that rural respondents were 5% more likely to hold this view than urban respondents.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Keeping in view the performance of the government teachers, tell whether they should be paid more than what they are being paid, should be paid less or should be paid the same as they are being paid?” In response, 12% said ‘More than that’, 29% answered ‘A little more than that’, 31% said ‘As much as is being given’, 12% responded ‘A little less than that’, 4% said ‘Far less than that’, and 12% said that they did not know or gave no response.

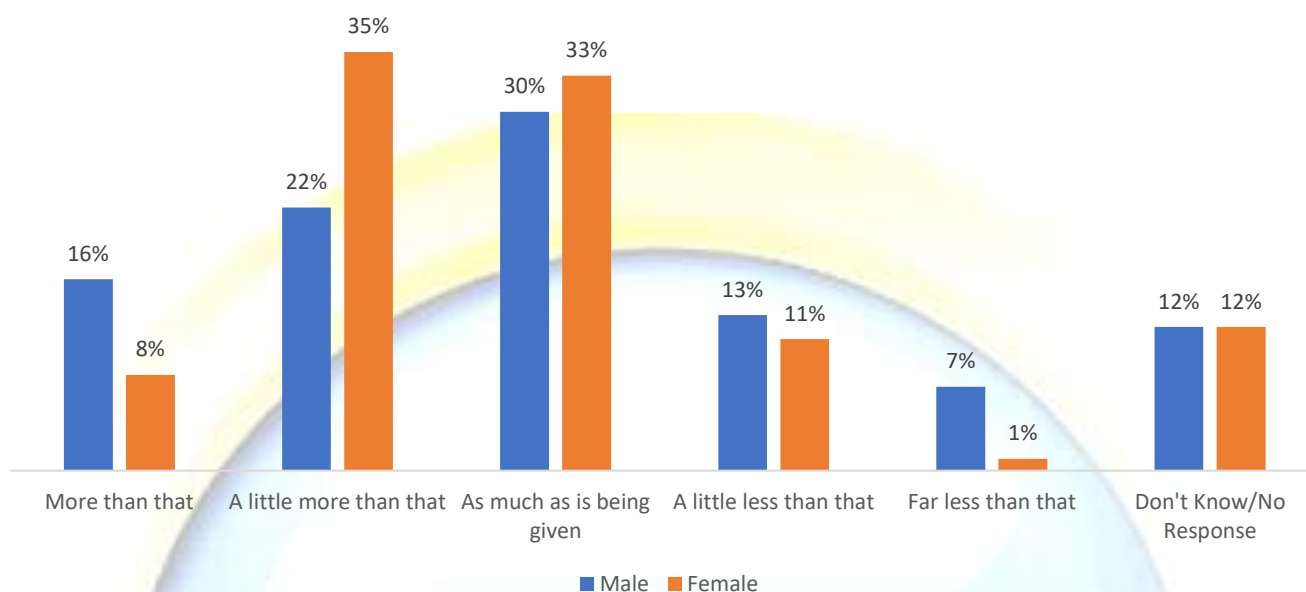

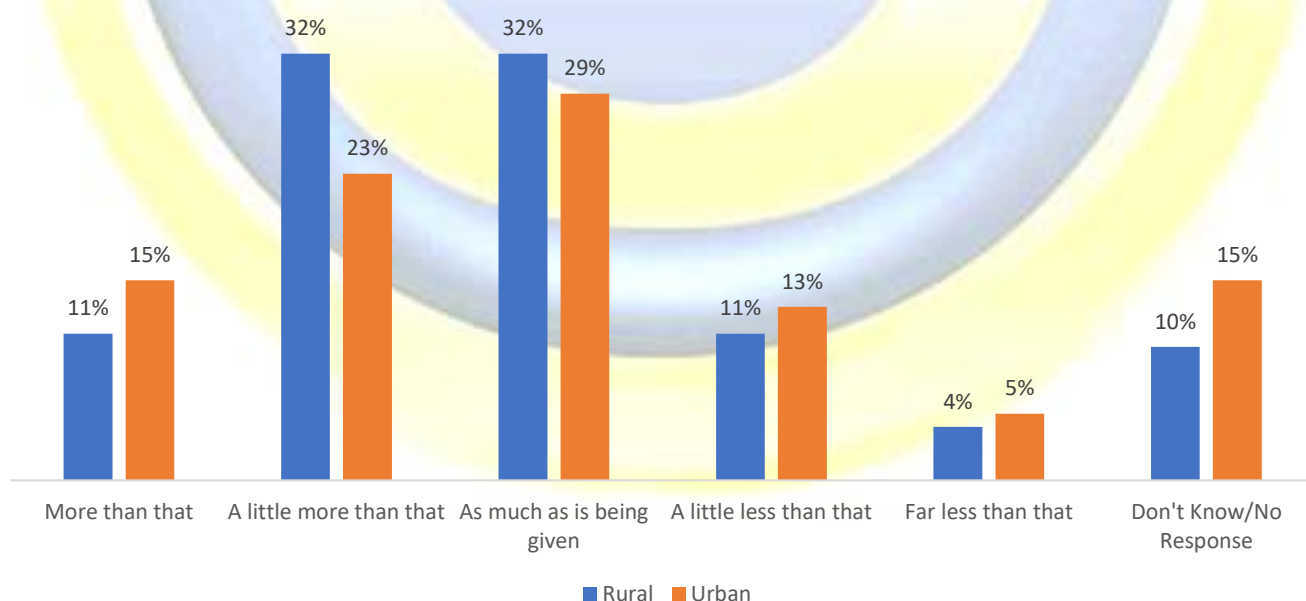
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 769 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 28th June - 10th July 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Pakistani women were more likely (43%) to believe that Pakistani government teachers should be paid more than their current salary, as compared to men (38%).

Across rurality: Rural residents of Pakistan were more likely (43%) to support increasing the salaries of Pakistani government teachers, as compared to urban residents (38%).
