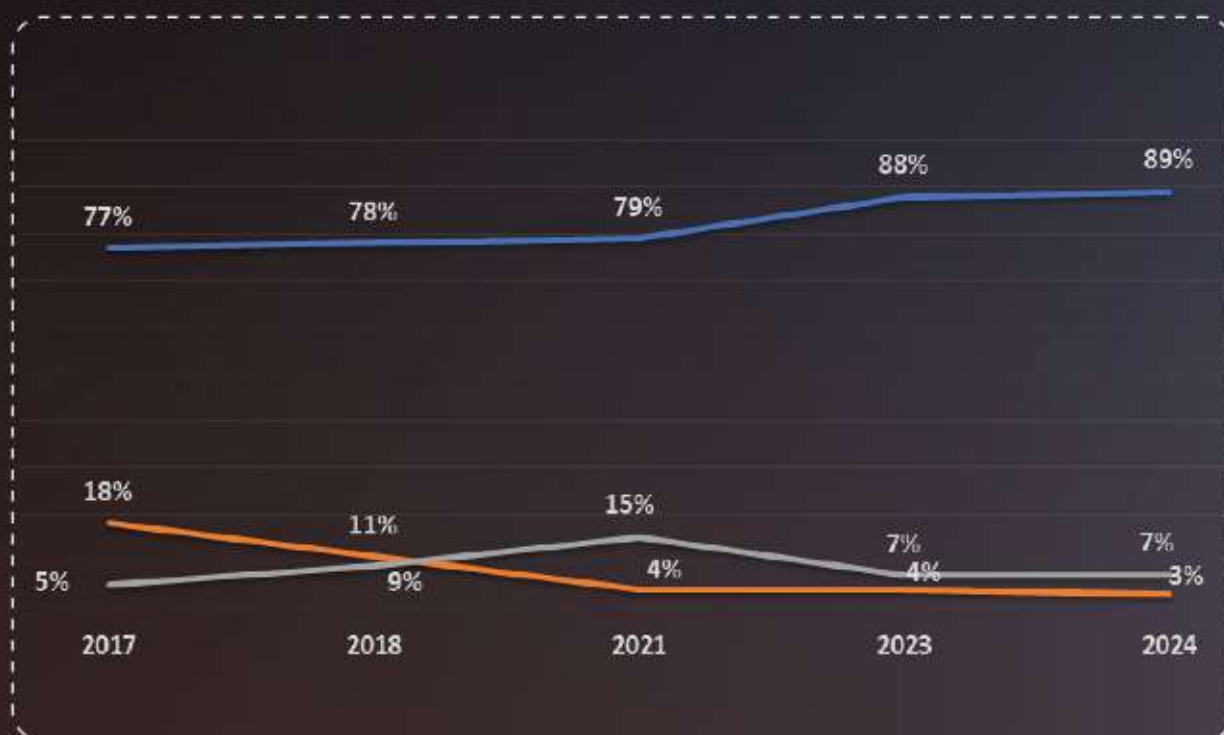


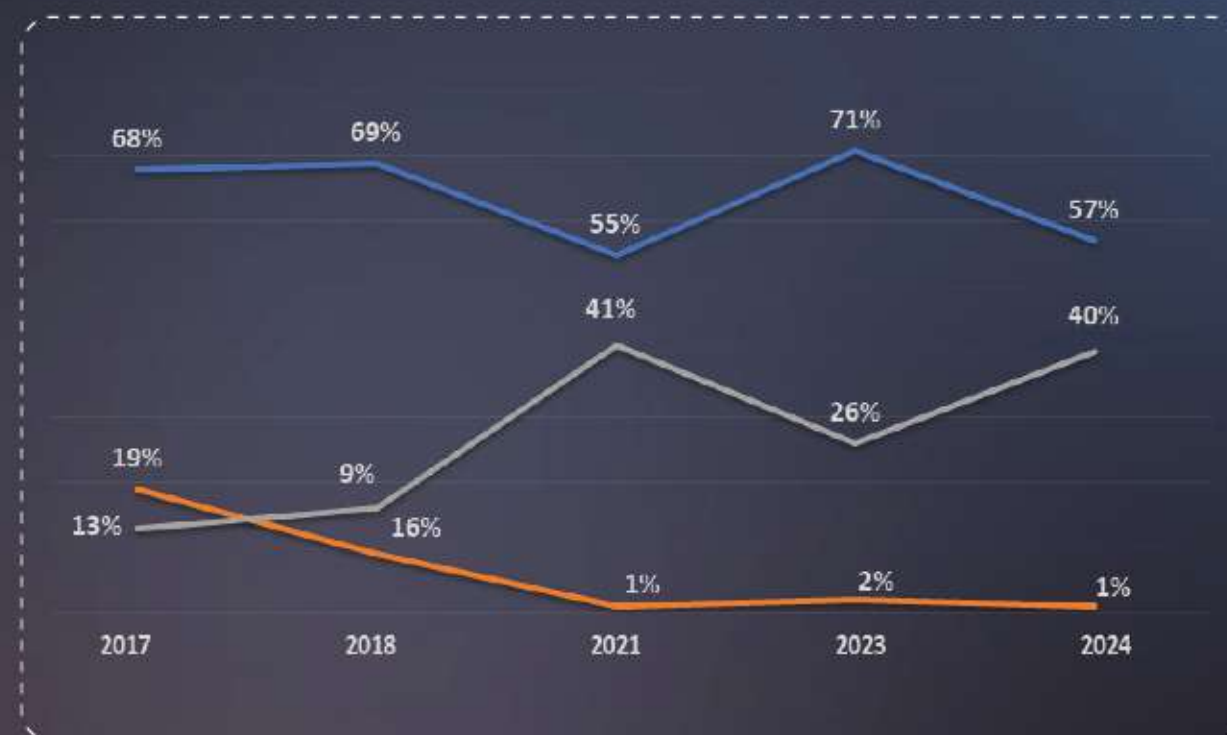

Gallup & Gilani Pakistan conducted a survey from 2017 to 2024, focusing on how Pakistanis celebrated Eid. Most Pakistanis, both urban and rural, celebrated Eid in their city of residence. Nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell me, where did you celebrate Eid this year?”

Comparative Picture: In 2024, 68% of respondents celebrated Eid in the city where they live: 89%; urban residents, 57%; rural residents. Additionally, 4% celebrated Eid in another city: 1%; urban residents, 3%; rural residents. Furthermore, 47% of respondents celebrated Eid in their hometown: 7%; urban residents, 40%; rural residents.

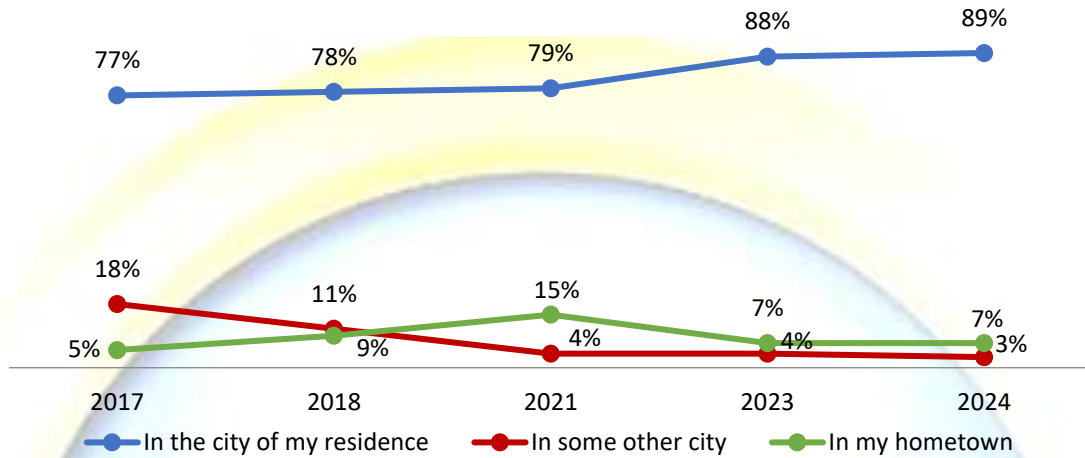
Trend Analysis: In 2017, 71% of Pakistanis celebrated Eid in their city of residence. By 2024, the proportion of urban residents celebrating Eid in their city increased by 12%, while rural residents experienced a decline of 14%. The proportion of respondents celebrating Eid in 'another city' dropped significantly, with urban residents down by 15% and rural residents by 18%. Conversely, there was a notable surge of 27% in rural residents celebrating in their hometown, while the proportion of urban residents remained relatively stable.

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision-making in Pakistan.



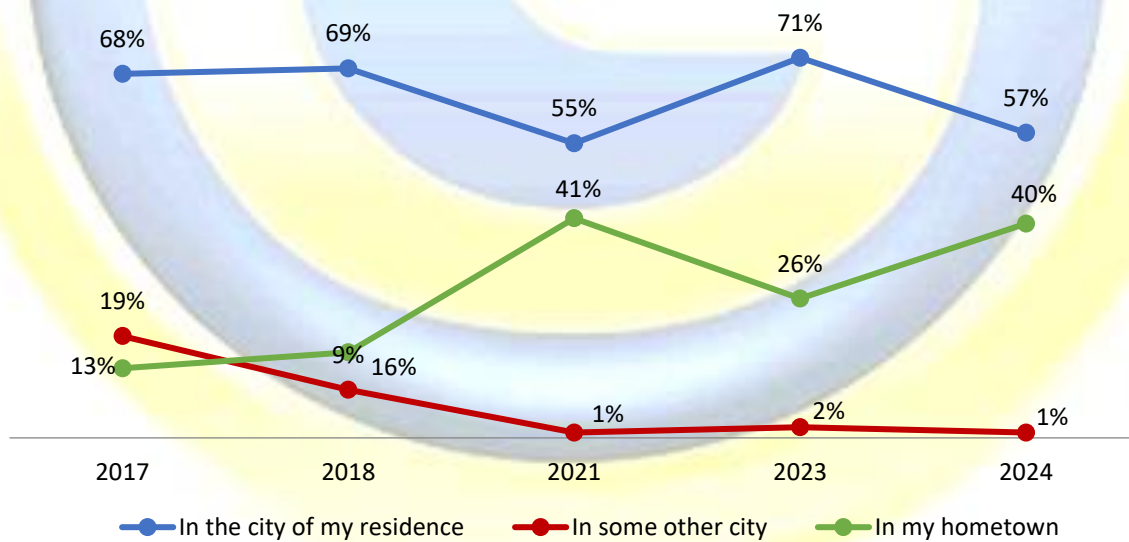

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 769 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country,



conducted from 28th June - 10th July 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Aim and Rationale for Gallup Pakistan History Project

Bilal I Gilani, who is Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan, and the Director of Gallup Pakistan History Project explains the aim of the Project as follows: "Gallup Pakistan has been polling in Pakistan since 1979 (over 40 years).
