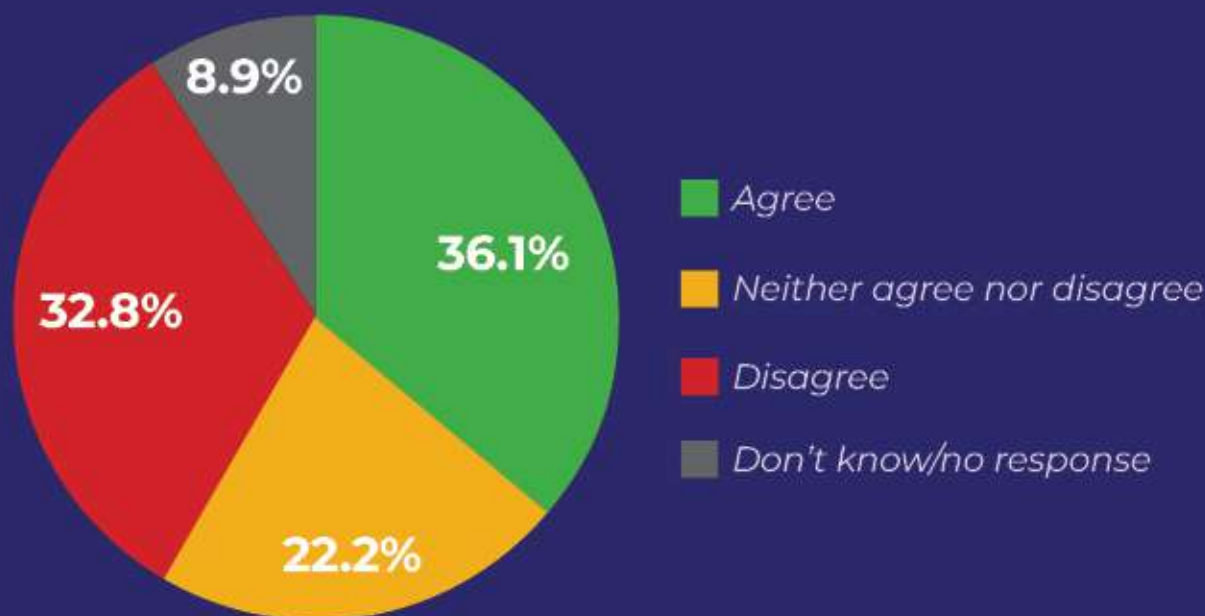


**More than 1 in 3 Pakistanis (36.1%)

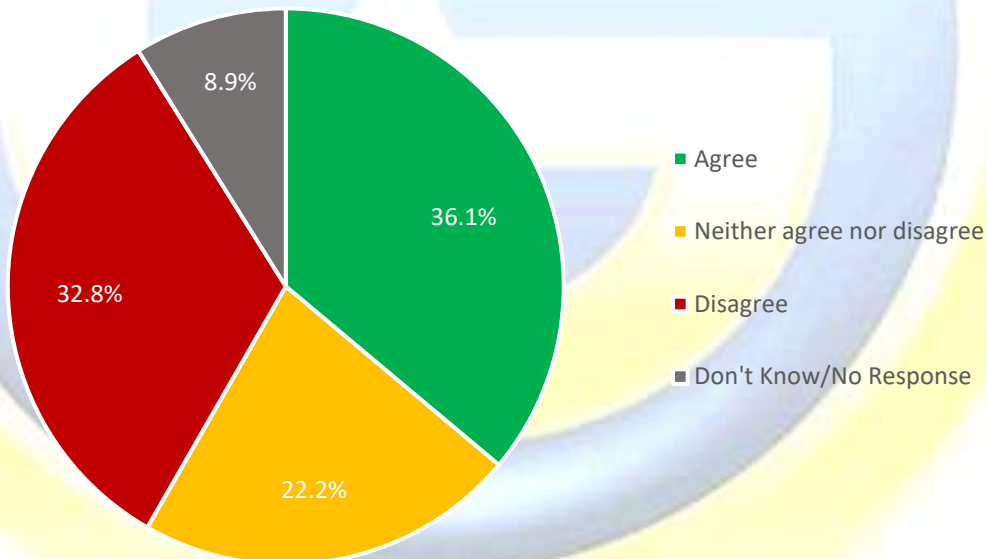
More than 1 in 3 Pakistanis (36.1%) reported concern about sharing their health information digitally, slightly higher than the global average (34.4%): Gallup Pakistan & WIN World Survey 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, more than 1 in 3 Pakistanis (36.1%) reported concern about sharing their health information digitally, slightly higher than the global average (34.4%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please indicate how much you agree or disagree with the following statement: “I am concerned about sharing my health information (digitally)”.” In response, 36.1% agreed, 22.2% neither agreed nor disagreed, 32.8% disagreed, and 8.9% either said that they did not know or had no response.

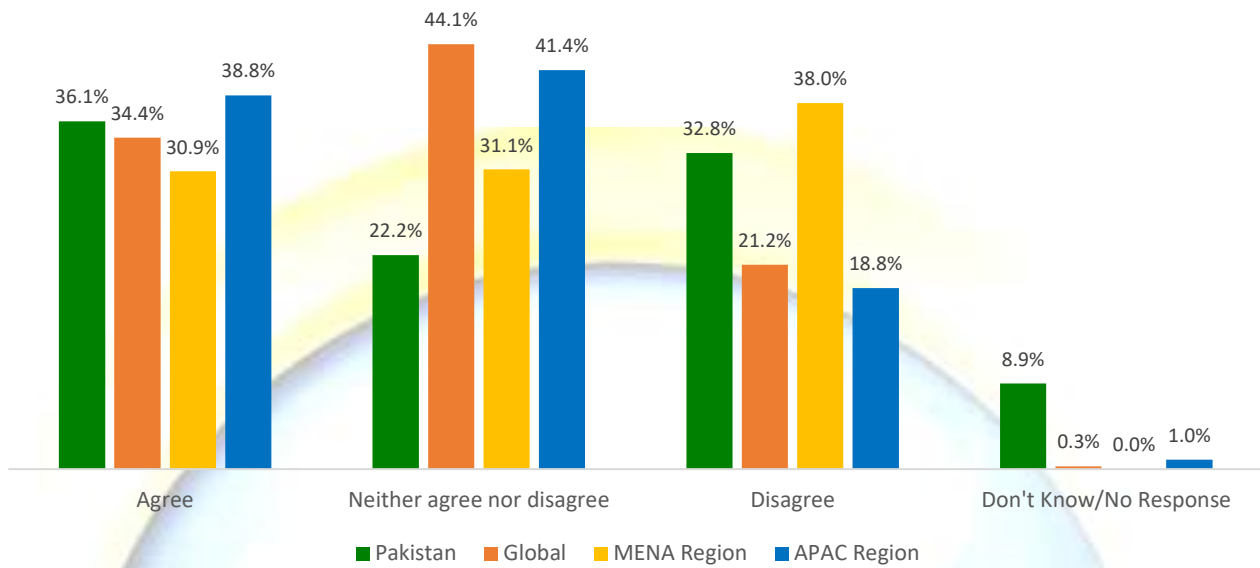

*The responses for this question were recorded on a 10-point scale, with 1 meaning ‘Do not agree at all’ and 10 meaning ‘Completely agree’. For this press release, the option ‘Agree’ clubs the 8-10 point scale, ‘Neither agree nor disagree’ includes responses from 4-7 on the scale, and ‘Disagree’ contains responses from 1-3.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 3rd – 17th January 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Global comparison: Pakistanis reported a level of concern for sharing their health information digitally that was slightly higher (36.1%) than the global average rate (34.4%). The APAC region's rate of concern fared the highest in this comparison (38.8%), and the MENA region's rate of concern was the lowest (30.9%).
