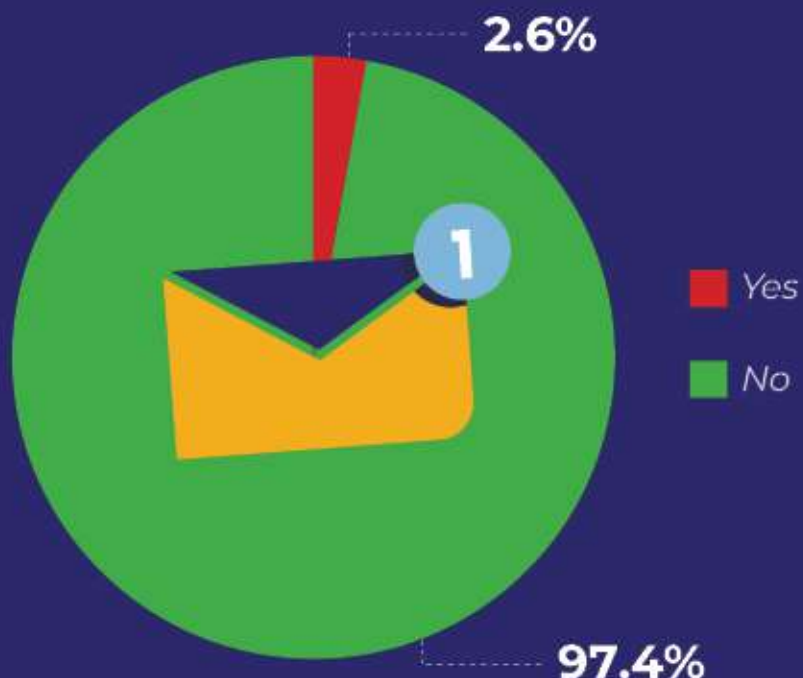


Only 2.6% Pakistanis had experienced their email being hacked, much lower than the global average (12.9%)



Question: Have you experienced any of the following? – Email hacked.





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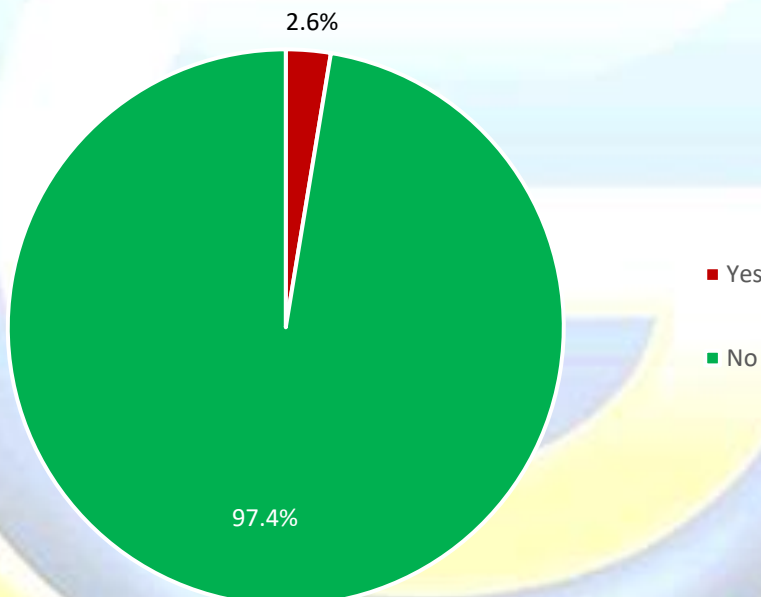
Only 2.6% Pakistanis had experienced their email being hacked, much lower than the global average (12.9%): Gallup Pakistan & WIN World Survey 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, only 2.6% Pakistanis had experienced their email being hacked, much lower than the global average (12.9%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Have your experienced any of the following? – Email hacked.” In response, 2.6% said ‘Yes’ while 97.4% said ‘No’.

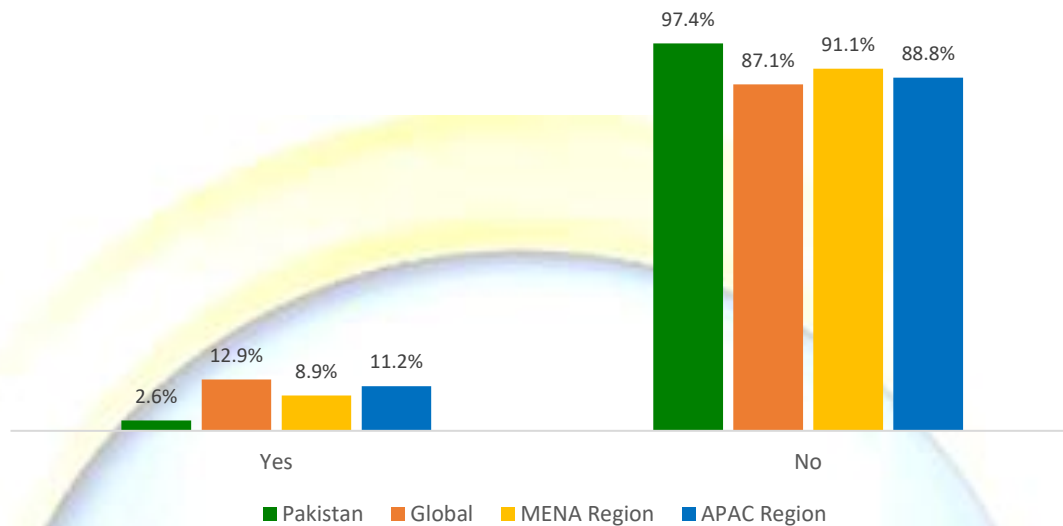
Question: Have your experienced any of the following? – Email hacked.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 3rd – 17th January 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Global comparison: The global average rate for individuals who had had their emails hacked was the highest (12.9%), followed by the APAC region's rate (11.2%), then the MENA region (8.9%), and lastly, Pakistanis reported the lowest level (2.6%).
