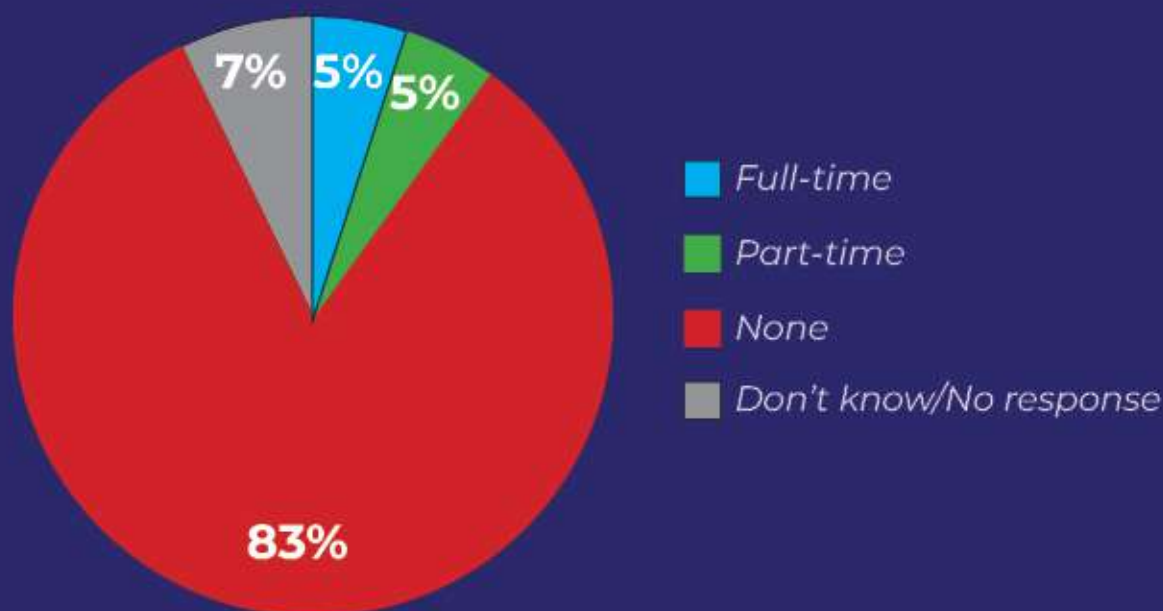


Only 10% of Pakistanis hire either part-time or full-time house help; urban residents more likely to do so

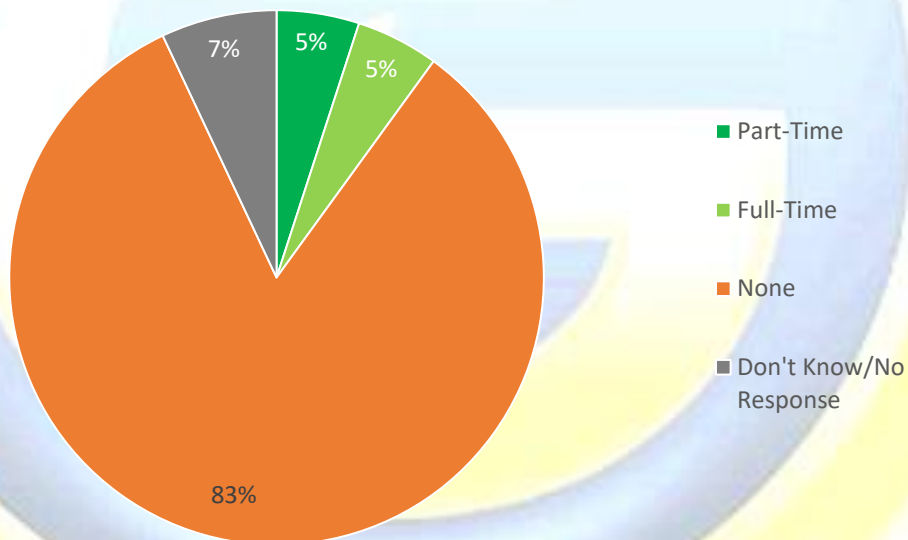
Only 10% of Pakistanis hire either part-time or full-time house help; urban residents more likely to do so: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 11th October, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, only 10% of Pakistanis hire either part-time or full-time house help; urban residents were more likely to do so.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Do you have a part-time (for a few hours) or full-time (for the whole day) employee for household work?” In response, 5% said ‘Full-time’, 5% said ‘Part-time’, 83% said ‘None’, and 7% said that they did not know or gave no response.

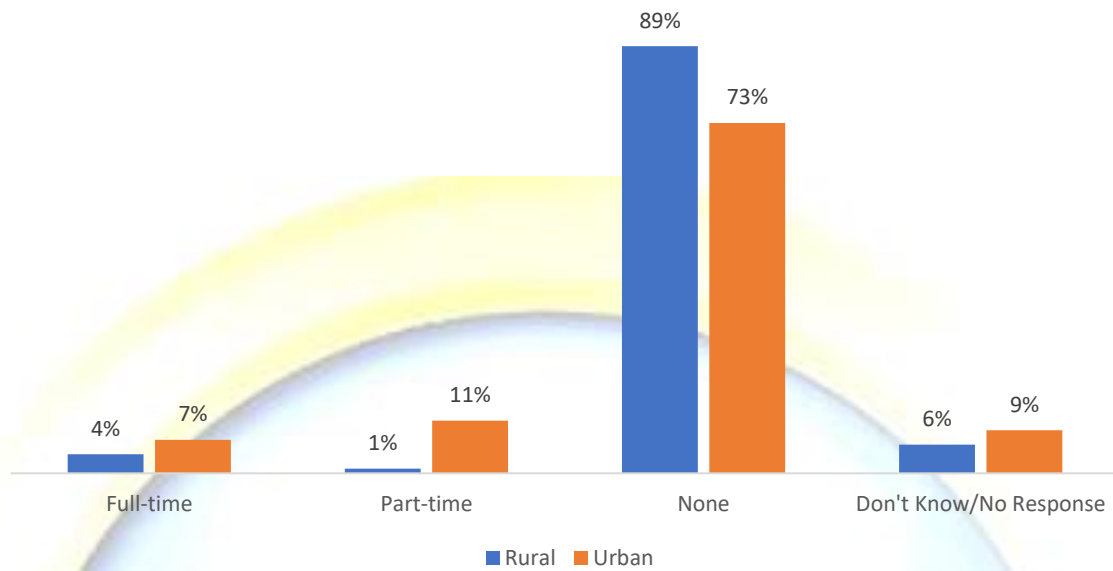
Question: Do you have a part-time (for a few hours) or full-time (for the whole day) employee for household work?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 821 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 6th August - 9th September 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across rurality: Urban residents were more likely to have hired house help (18%), as compared to rural residents (5%).
