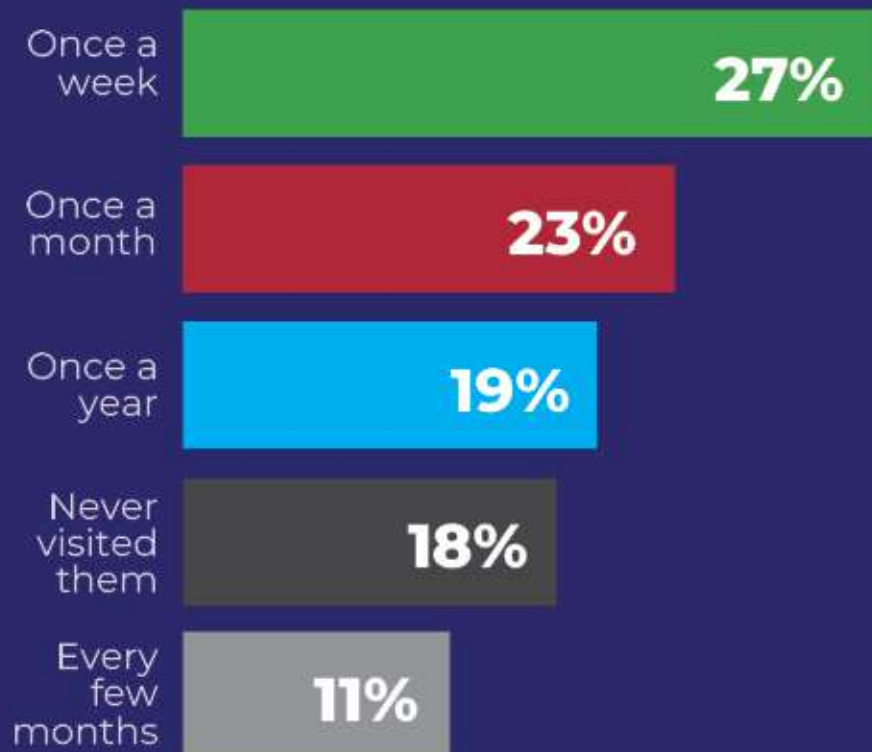


Nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (27%) visit their maternal family weekly, while 18% never do so

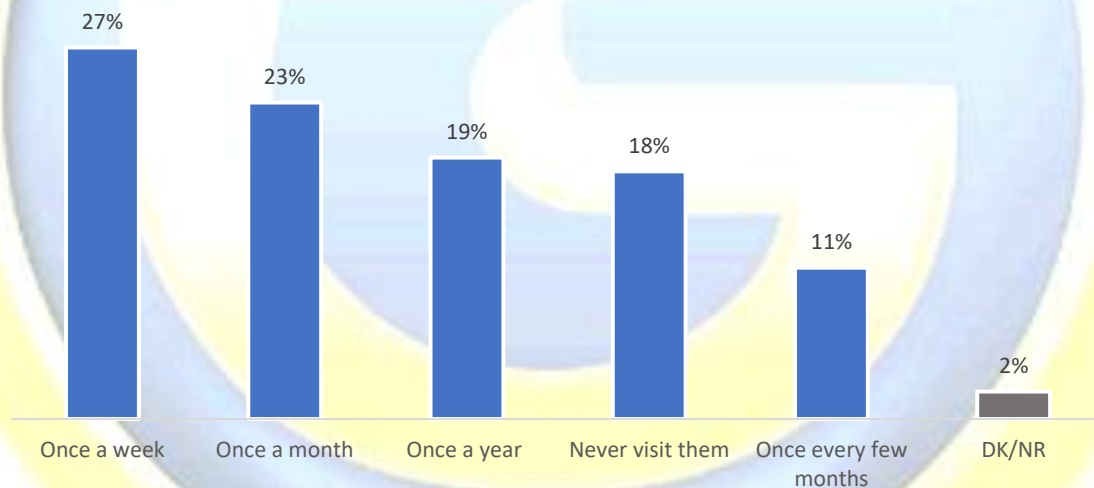
Nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (27%) visit their maternal family weekly, while 18% never do so, with men showing a higher tendency for frequent visits than women: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (27%) visit their maternal family weekly, while 18% never do so. Survey findings reveal that men are 8% more likely than women to visit their maternal families weekly.

A nationally representative sample of married adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell me how often you visit your maternal family?” In response, 27% said ‘Once a week’, 23% said ‘Once a month’, 19% responded ‘Once a year’, 18% answered ‘Never visit them’, 11% said ‘Once every few months’, and 2% said they don’t know or gave no response.

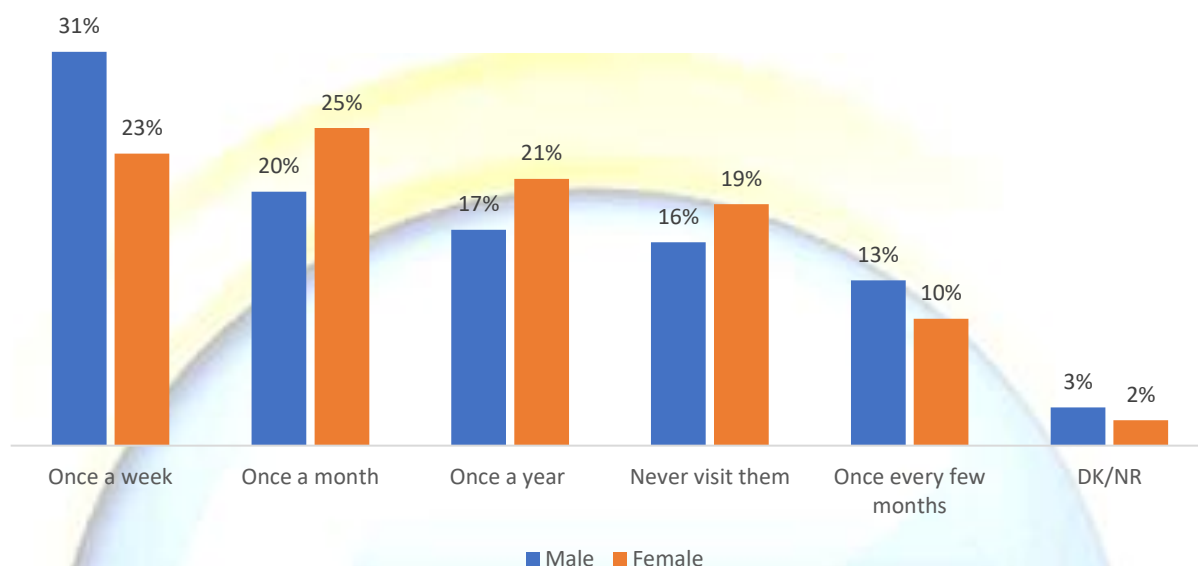
Question: Please tell me how often you visit your maternal family?

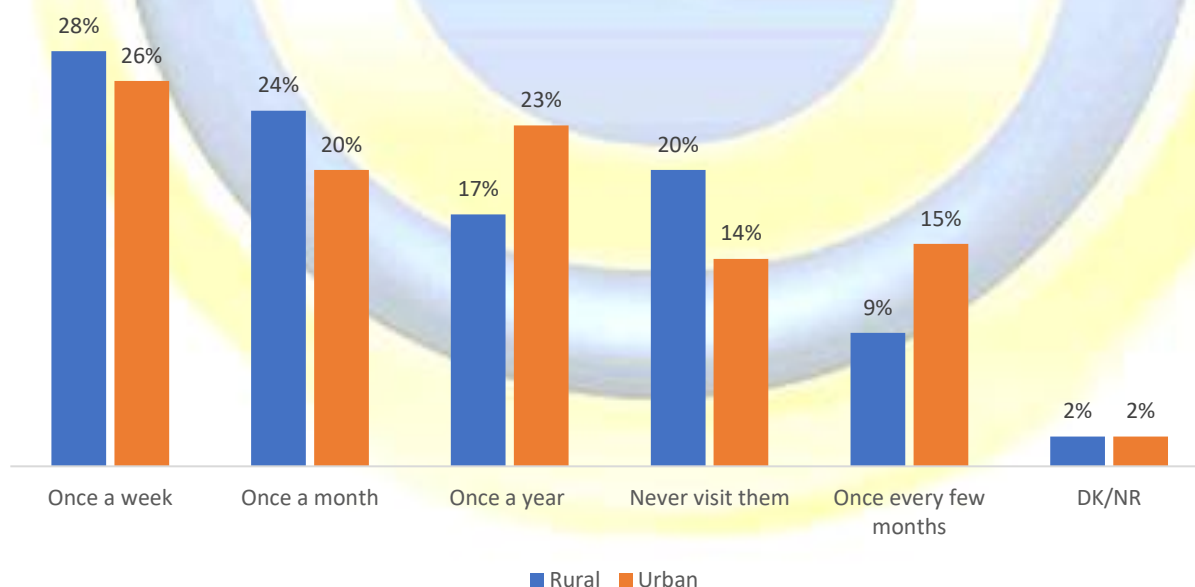
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1089 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 12th September - 11th October 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Men are more likely than women to visit their maternal families once a week, with 31% of men doing so compared to 23% of women. Conversely, women have higher rates of infrequent visits, with 19% never visiting, compared to 16% of men.

Across rurality Rural residents visit maternal families 2% more often than urban residents on a weekly basis, while urban residents are 6% less likely than rural residents to never visit.
