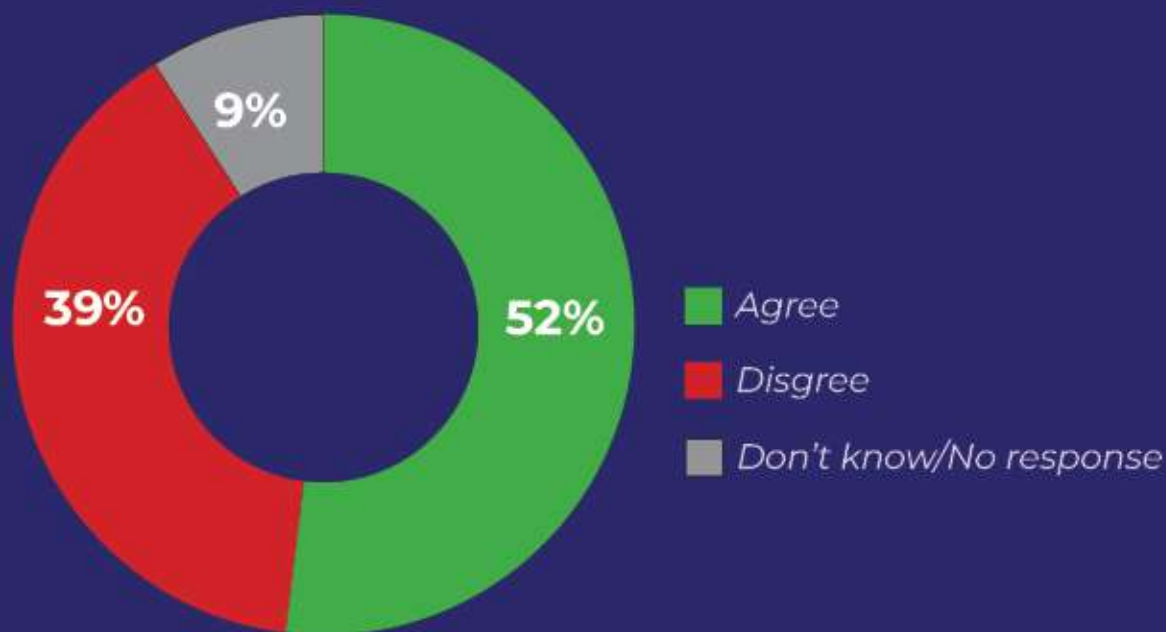
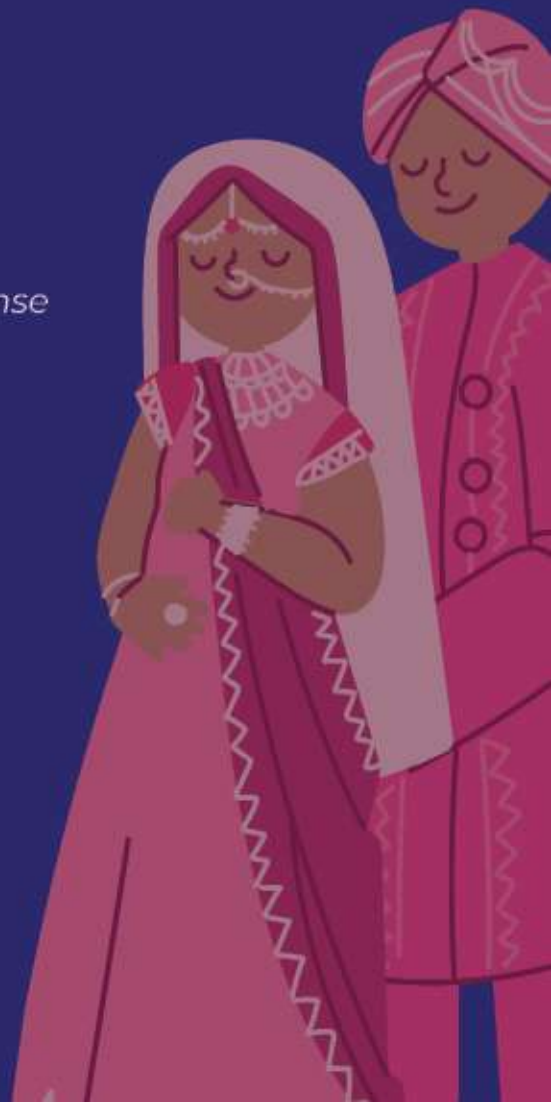


Traditional values prevail: Majority of Pakistanis (52%) oppose marriage of choice

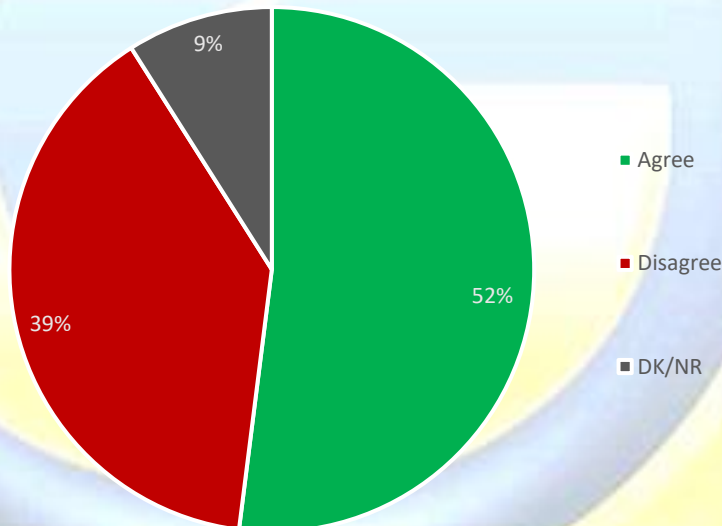
Traditional values prevail: Majority of Pakistanis (52%) oppose marriage of choice, urban residents leading in statistics (58%): Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 27th November, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, majority of Pakistanis (52%) oppose marriage of choice. Survey findings reveal that urban residents showed around 9% higher agreement to not supporting marriage of choice compared to rural residents.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please state whether you agree or disagree with the following statements? - I do not support marriage of choice.” In response, 52% agreed, 39% disagreed, and 9% responded they don’t know or gave no response.

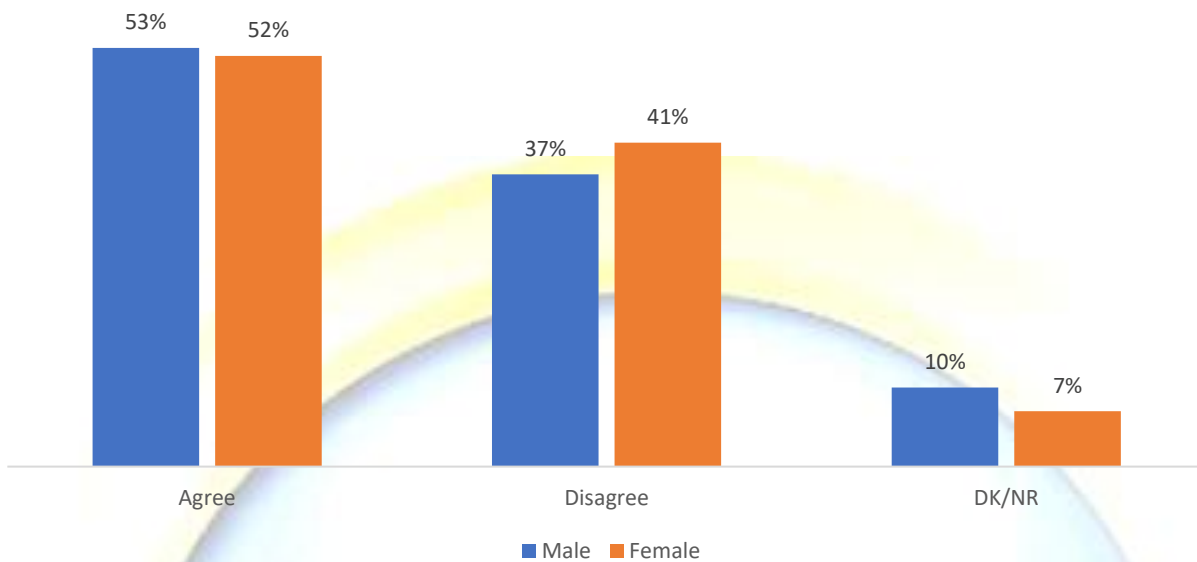
Question: Please state whether you agree or disagree with the following statements? - I do not support marriage of choice

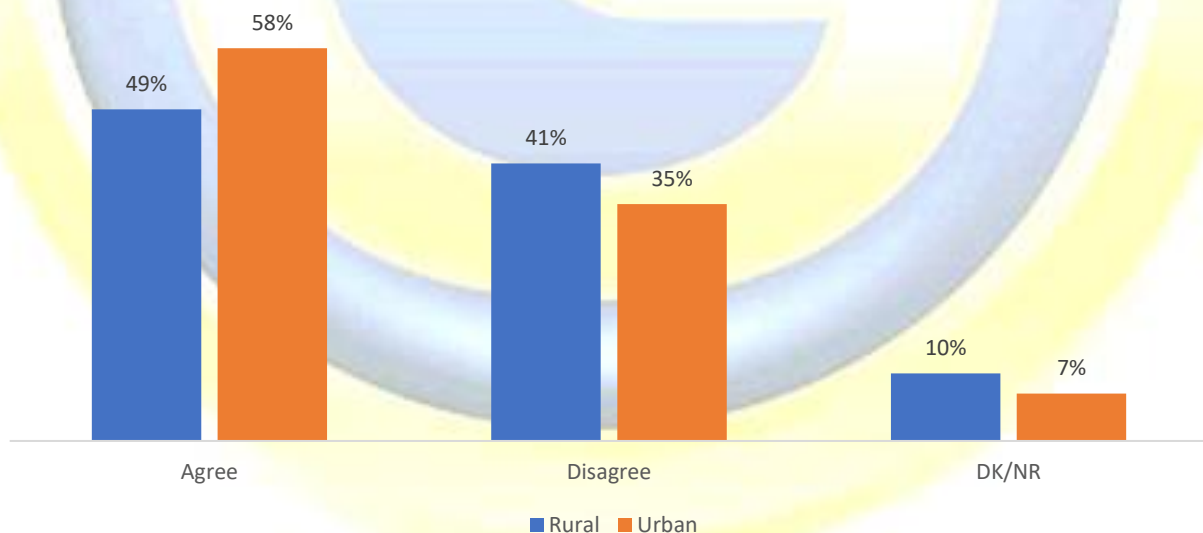
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1089 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 12th September – 11th October 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Men and women had almost similar views on not supporting marriage by choice, with 1% more men agreeing than women.

Across rurality: A higher percentage of residents from urban areas (58%) agreed with the statement compared to those from rural areas (49%).
