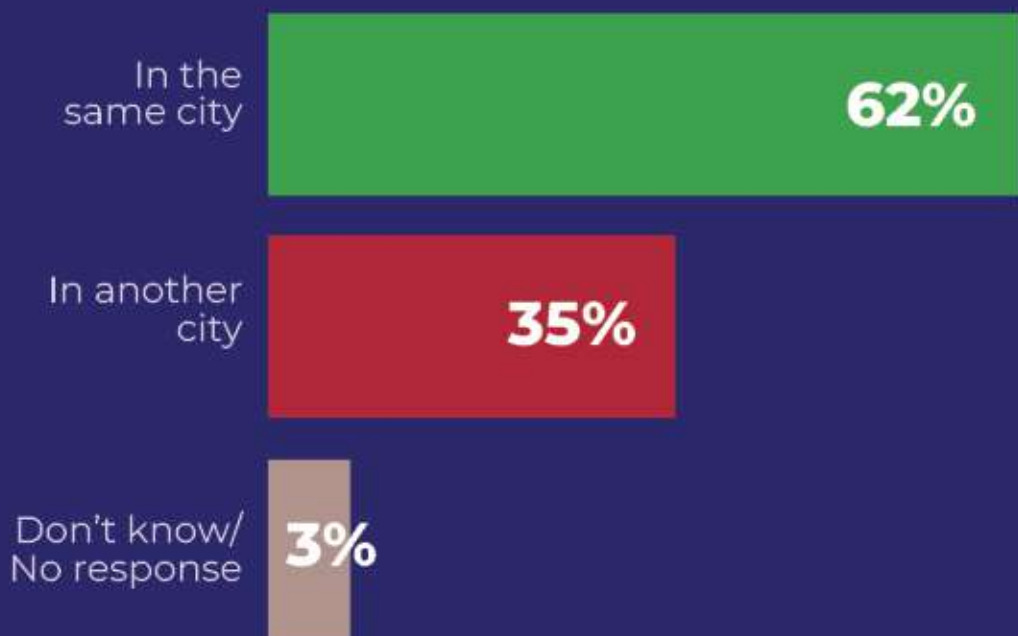


62% Pakistanis have their paternal family residing in the same city/village

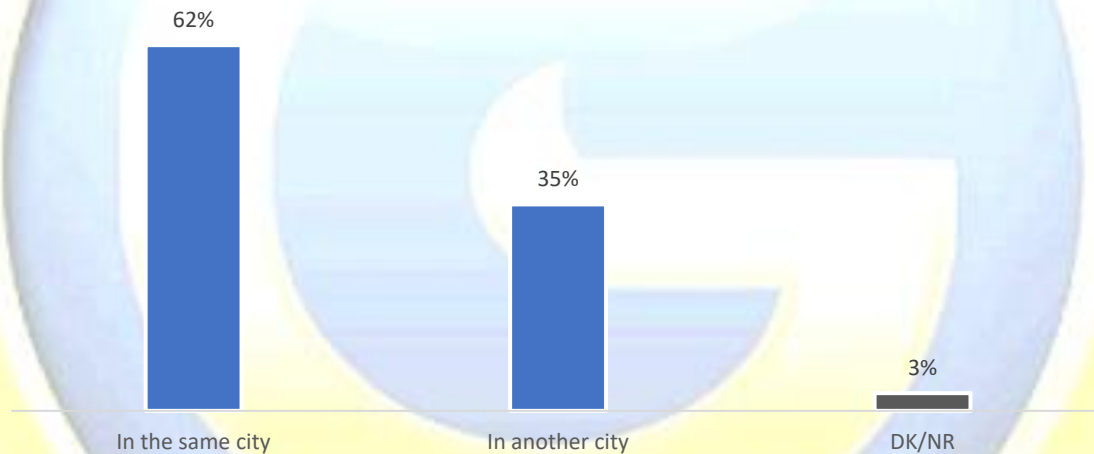
62% Pakistanis have their paternal family residing in the same city/village, with men more likely to report this (69%): Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 7th November, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 62% Pakistanis have their paternal family residing in the same city. The survey findings reveal that men demonstrate a 13% higher proportion of paternal families living in the same city/village.

A nationally representative sample of married adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Does your paternal family live in the same city/village you live in or in another city/village?” In response, 62% said ‘Yes’, 35% said ‘No’, and 3% said they don’t know or have no response.

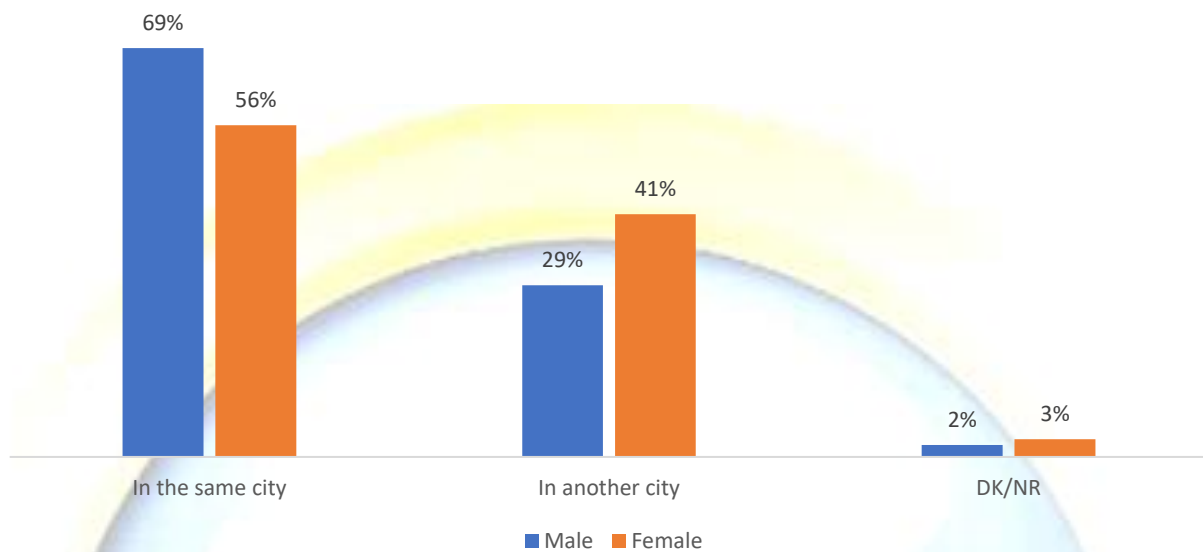
Question: Does your paternal family live in the same city/village you live in or in another city/village?

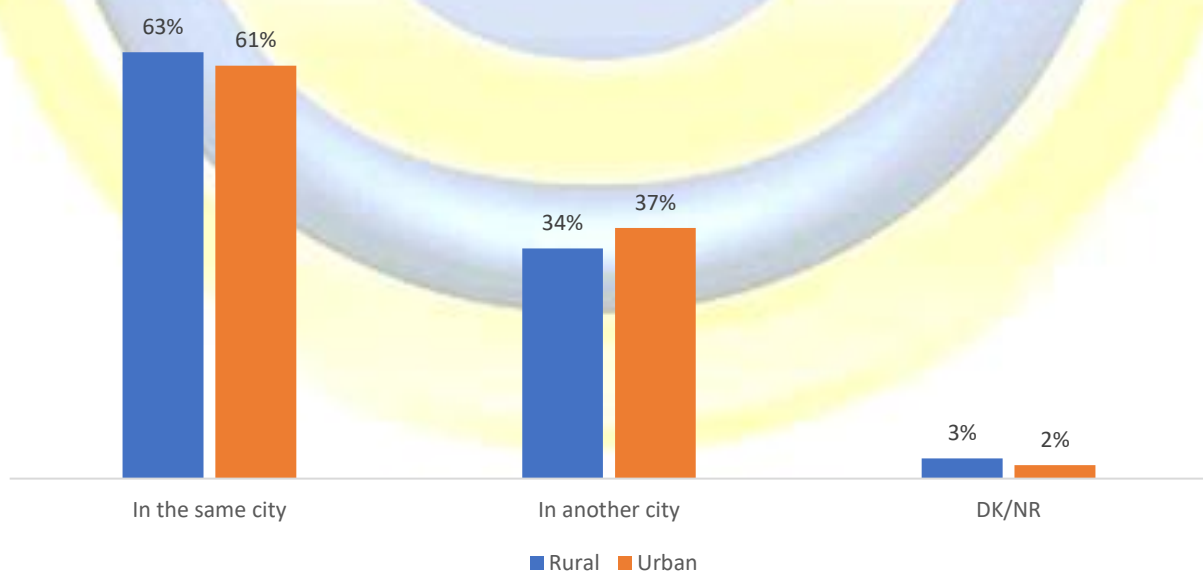
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1089 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 12th September - 11th October 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Men reported a higher proportion of 13% for having their paternal family living in the same city/village, while women showed a 12% higher proportion in terms of their paternal family residing in another city/village compared to men.

Across rurality: Rural residents showed a higher percentage of having their paternal family living in the same city/village by 2% compared to urban residents, while urban residents had a higher ratio of paternal families living in another city/village by 3%.
