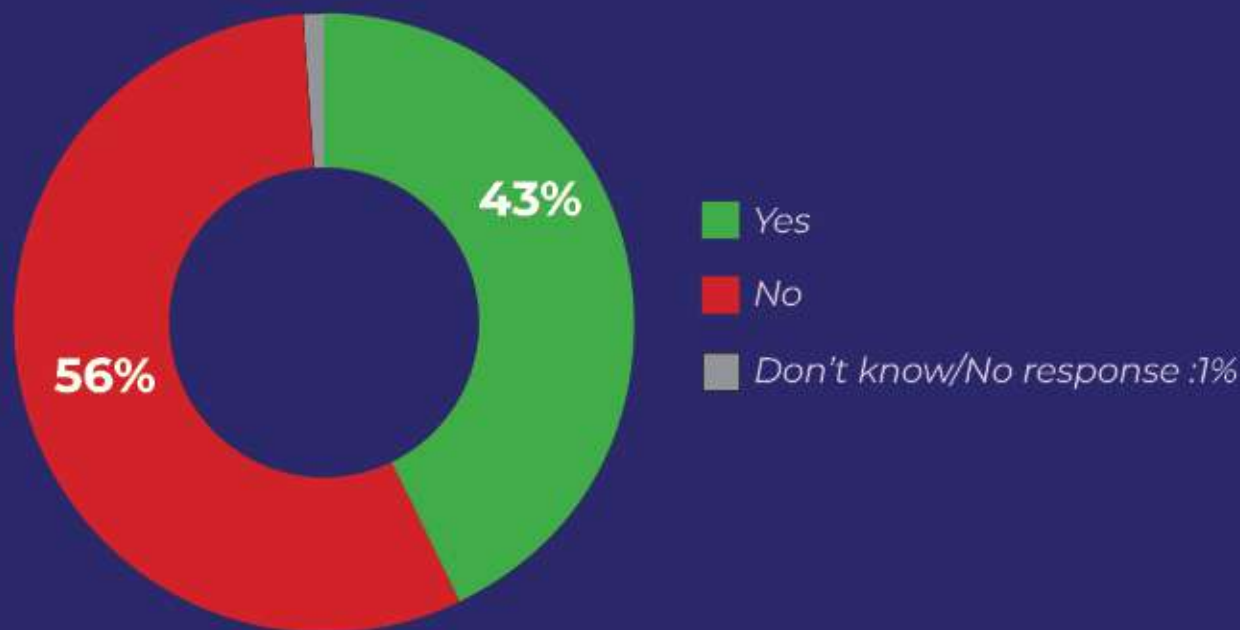


43% Pakistanis participate in Eid-Milan-un-Nabi festivities

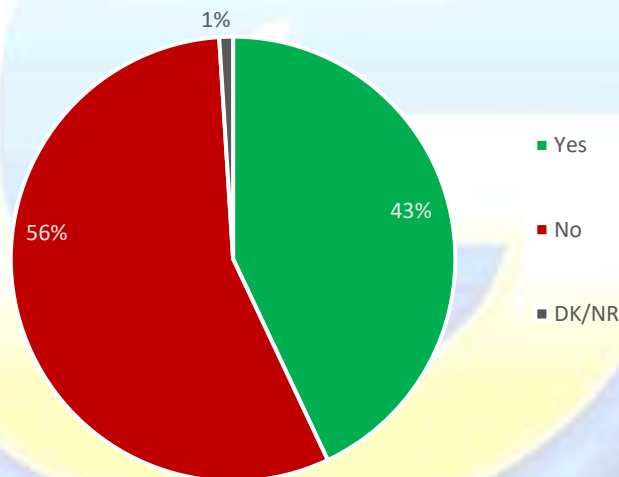
43% Pakistanis participate in Eid-Milan-un-Nabi festivities, men and urban residents tend to participate more: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 43% Pakistanis participate in Eid-Milan-un-Nabi festivities, men and urban residents tend to participate more.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Have you ever participated in any kind of festivities/events on Eid-Milan-un-Nabi or not?” In response, 43% said ‘Yes’, 56% said ‘No’, 1% responded they don’t know or gave no response.

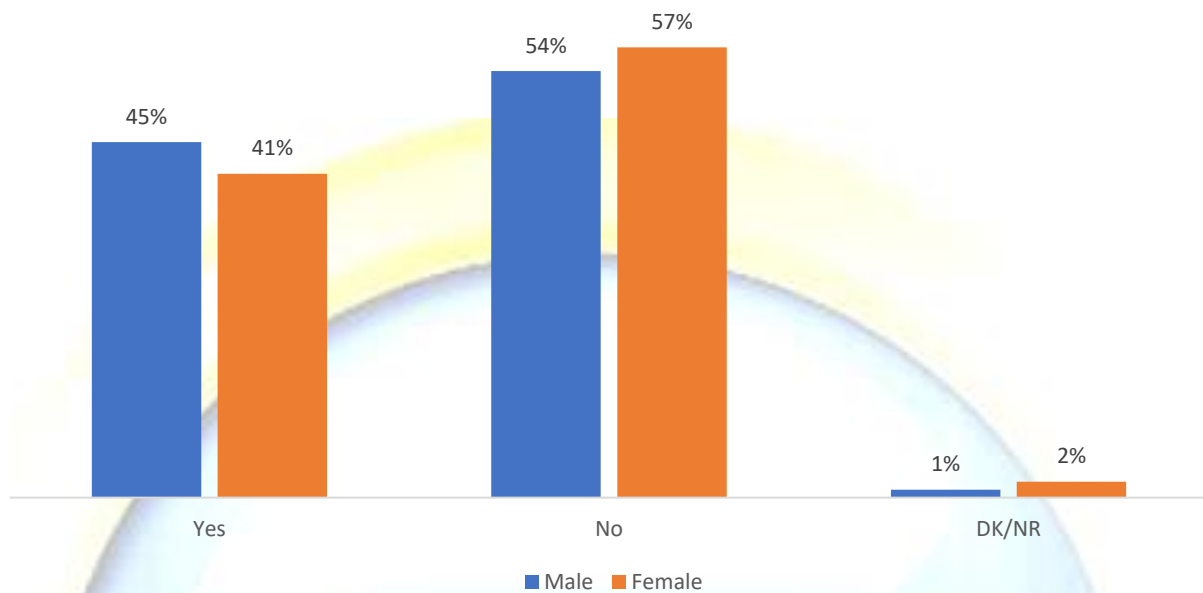
Question: Have you ever participated in any kind of festivities/events on Eid-Milan-un-Nabi or not?

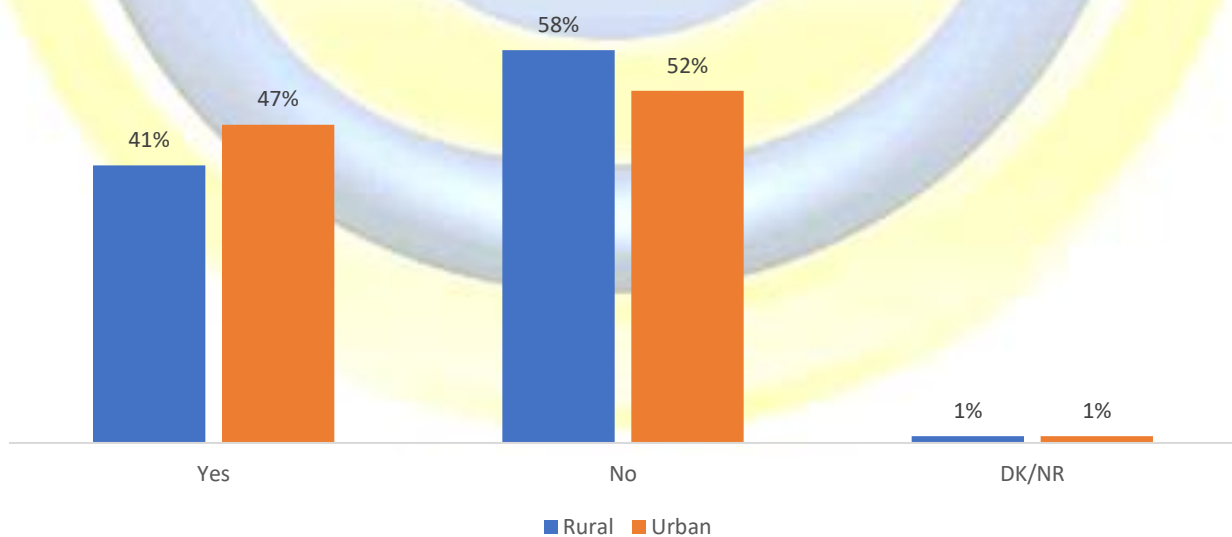
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1024 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 23rd October– 17th November 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: Men more likely to engage in Eid-Milan-un-Nabi festivities 45% of men reported participating, compared to 41% of women.

Across rurality: There is a 6% difference in festive participation, with 47% of urban residents involved compared to 41% of rural residents.
