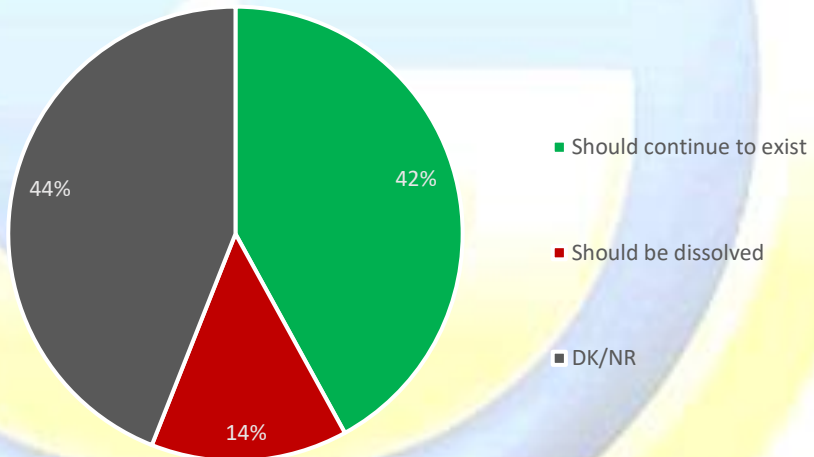
Pakistan's Divided Stance on the UN: While a significant portion of Pakistanis (42%) expressed support for the UN to continue to run and operate, a nearly equal proportion (44%) remained uncertain: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, while a significant portion of Pakistanis (42%) expressed support for the UN to continue to run and operate, a nearly equal proportion (44%) remained uncertain.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Do you think the United Nations should continue to exist, or should it be dissolved?” In response, 42% said ‘Should continue to exist’, 14% said ‘Should be dissolved’, 44% responded they don’t know or gave no response.

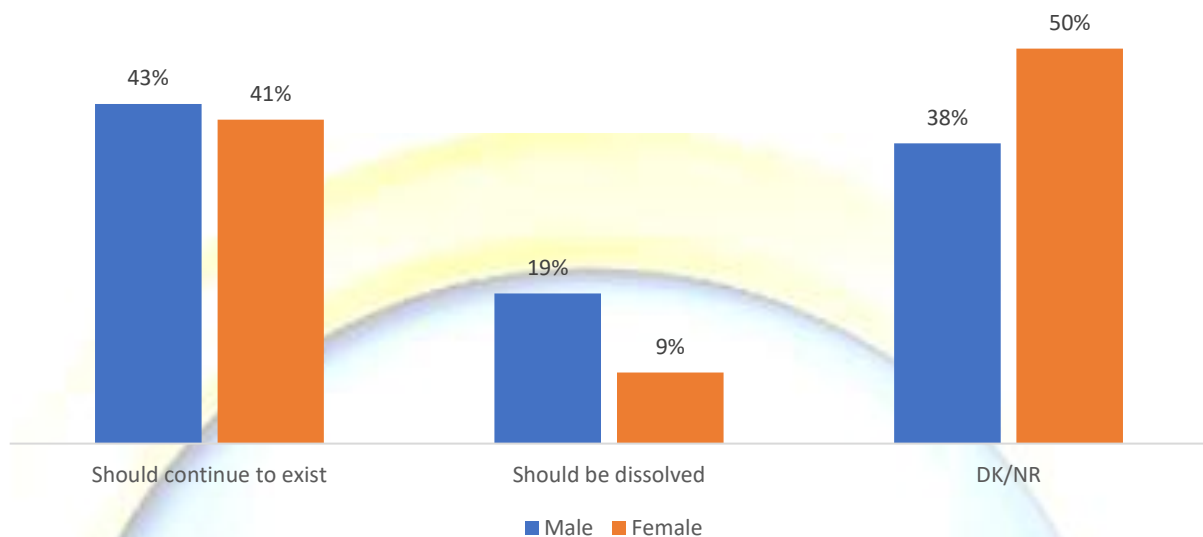
Question: Do you think the United Nations should continue to exist, or should it be dissolved?

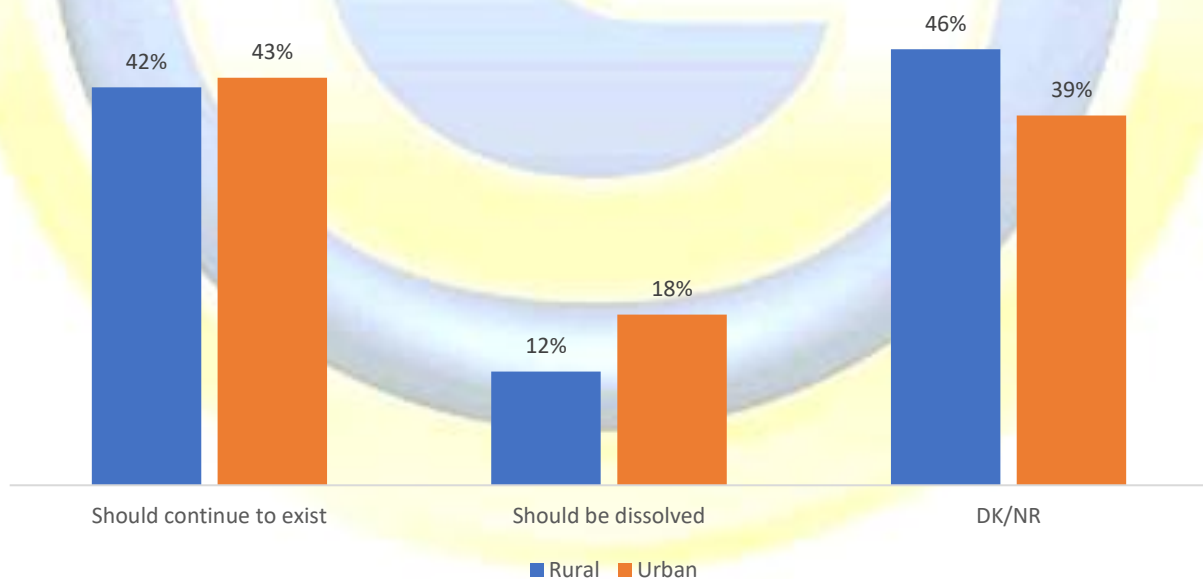
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1024 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 23rd October– 17th November 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: More males (43%) than females (41%) believe the UN should continue to exist. In contrast, females (50%) were twice more likely than males (38%) to be undecided on the matter.

Across rurality: Support for the UN to continue to exist is consistent across rural and urban areas, although a slightly higher percentage of rural respondents (46%) expressed uncertainty compared to their urban counterparts (39%).
