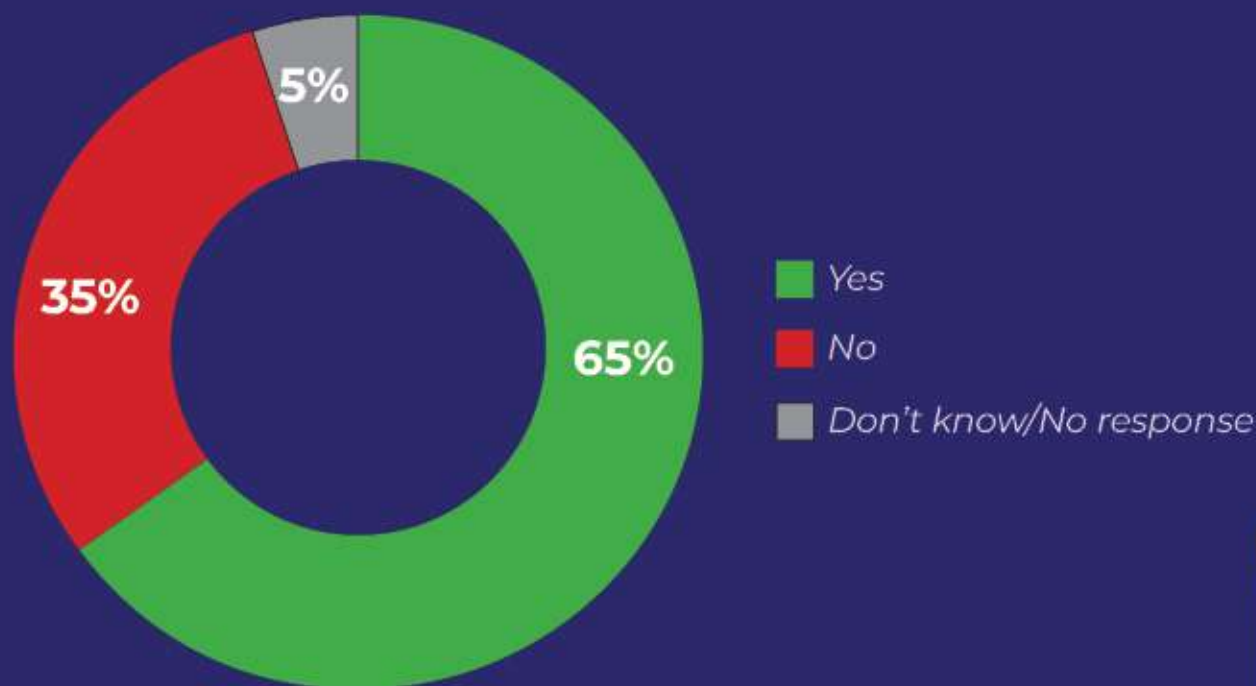


Nearly two-thirds (65%) Pakistanis performed prayer at the mosque last Friday

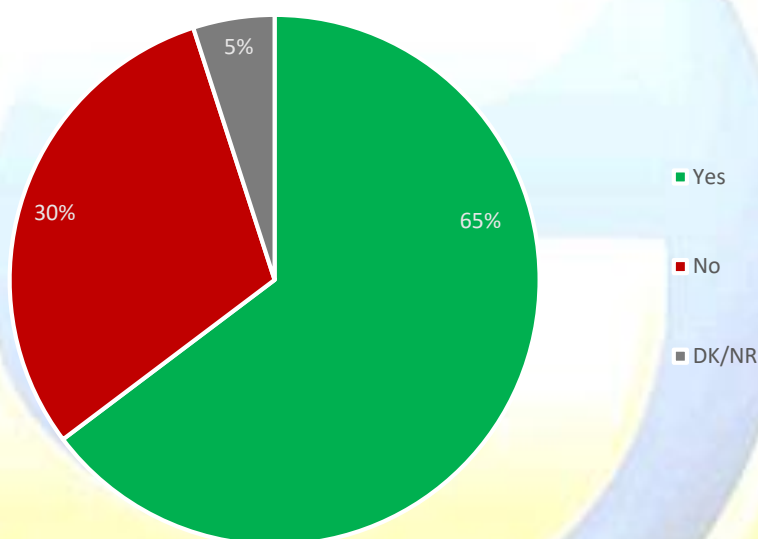
Nearly two-thirds (65%) Pakistanis performed prayer at the mosque last Friday, with 85% men reporting this: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 20th January, 2025

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, less than two-thirds (65%) Pakistanis prayed at the mosque the previous Friday, with 85% men reporting this.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “*Did you get a chance to go to the mosque for prayer last Friday or not?*” In response, 65% said ‘Yes’, 30% said ‘No’, and 5% responded they don’t know or gave no response.

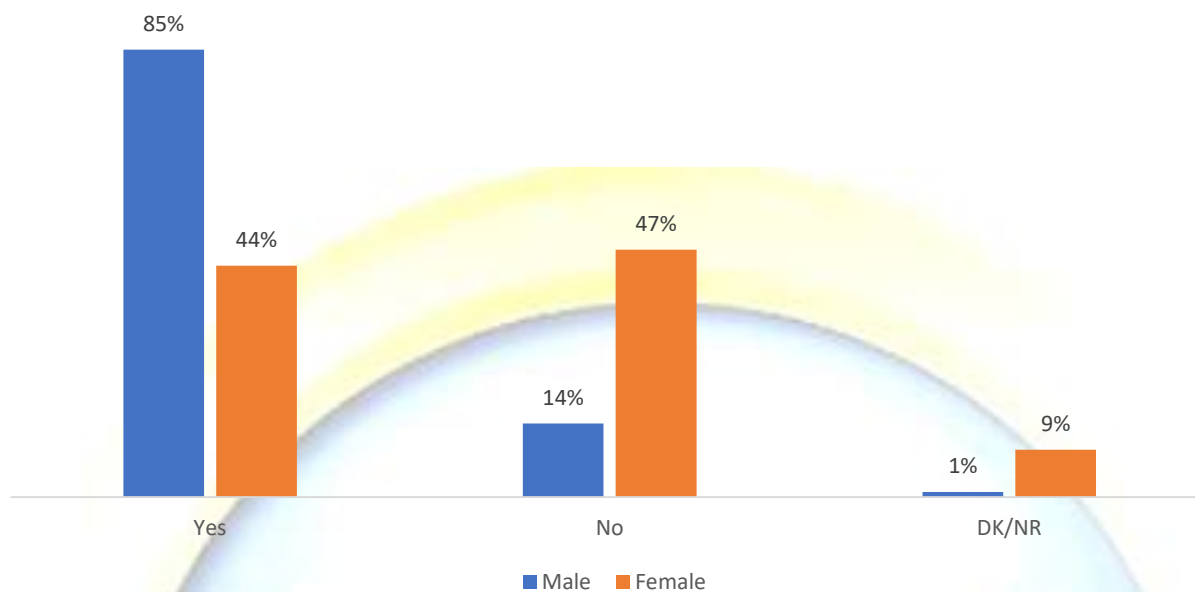
Question: Did you get a chance to go to the mosque for prayer last Friday or not?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 458 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across gender: 85% men reported visiting the mosque last Friday, while 14% did not.
