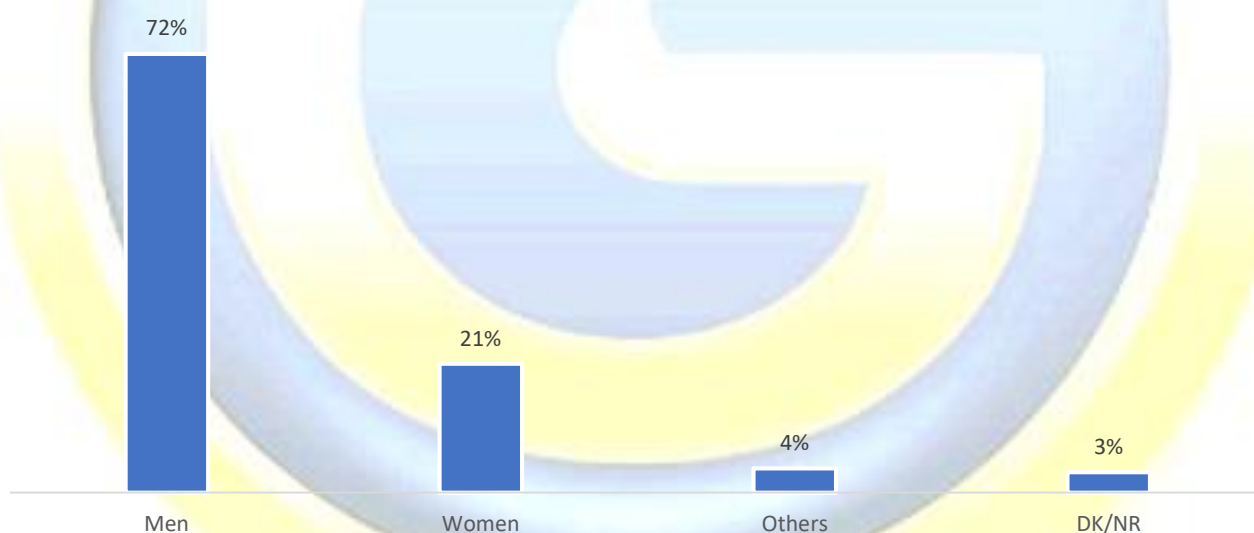
7 in 10 Pakistanis say men in their household are responsible for enrollment of children in school, while only 2 in 10 report women's involvement: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 22nd January, 2025

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 7 in 10 Pakistanis say men in their household are responsible for enrollment of children in school, while only 2 in 10 report women's involvement.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Who usually does this work in your house - Enrollment of children in school?” In response, 72% said ‘Men’, 21% said ‘Women’, 4% said ‘Others’, and 3% responded they don’t know or gave no response.

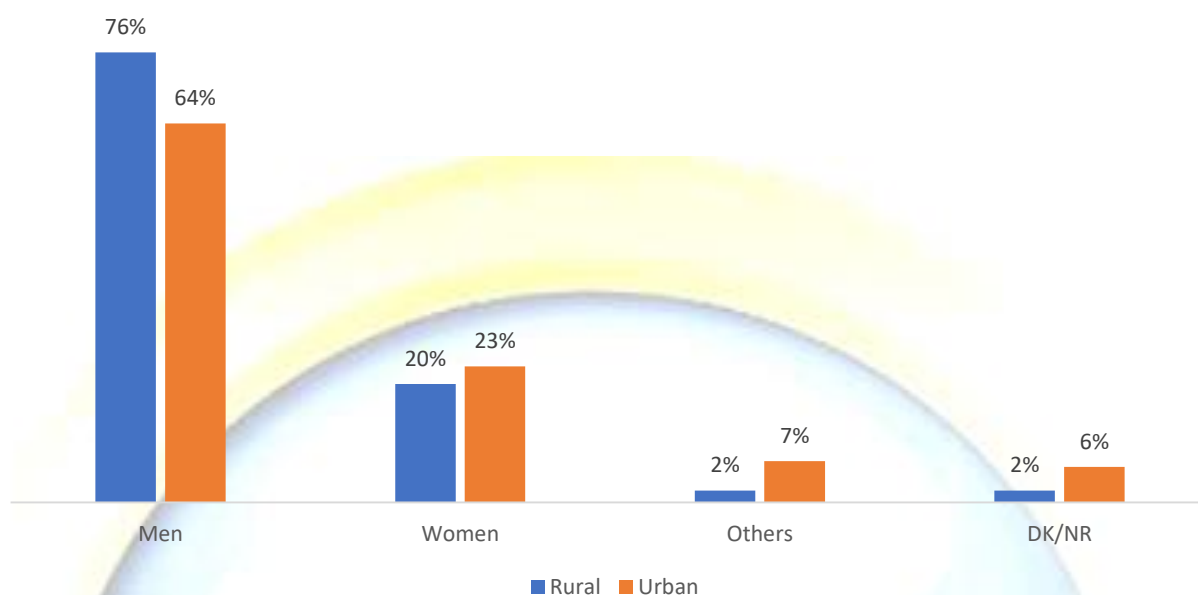
Question: Who usually does this work in your house - Enrollment of children in school?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 458 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across rurality: Rural residents (76%) are more likely to say men handle enrollment of children in school, compared to urban residents (64%). Conversely, urban residents (23%) report more women's involvement in school enrollment than rural residents (20%).
