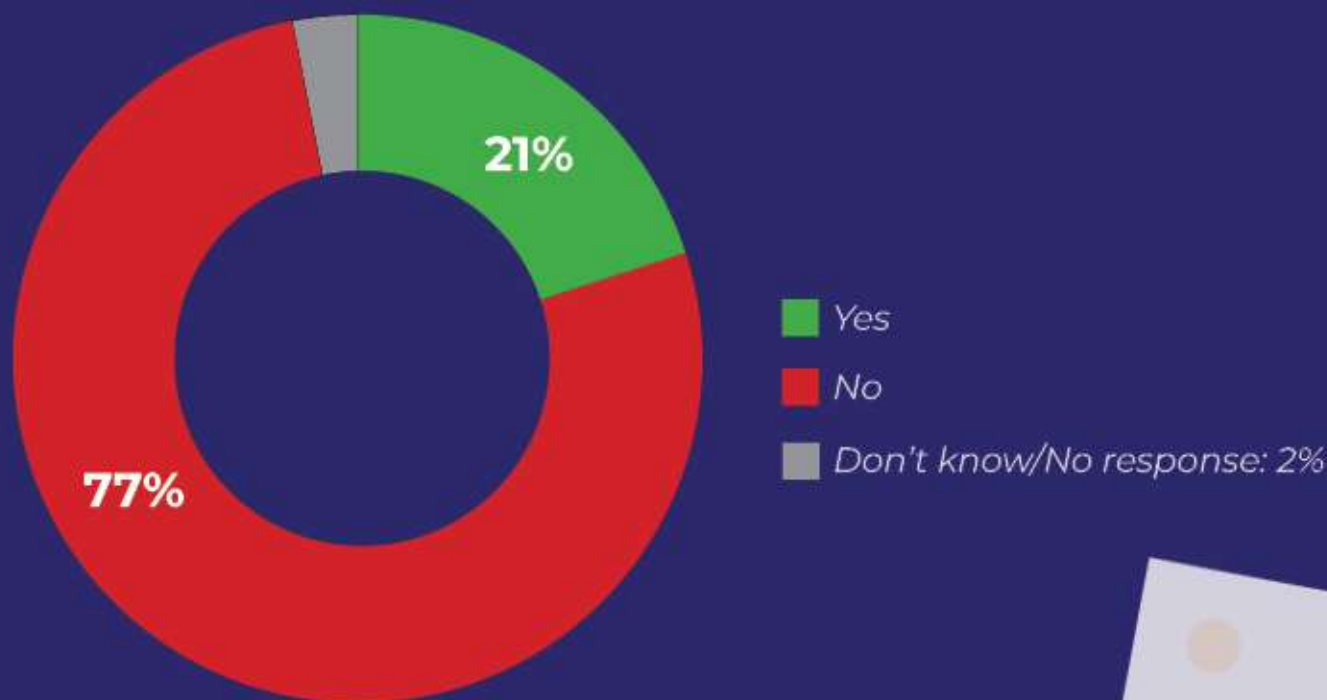


Roughly 1 in 5 Pakistanis (21%) say they have a family member or friend who got divorced in the past six months with higher proportion of women (24%) aware of such cases

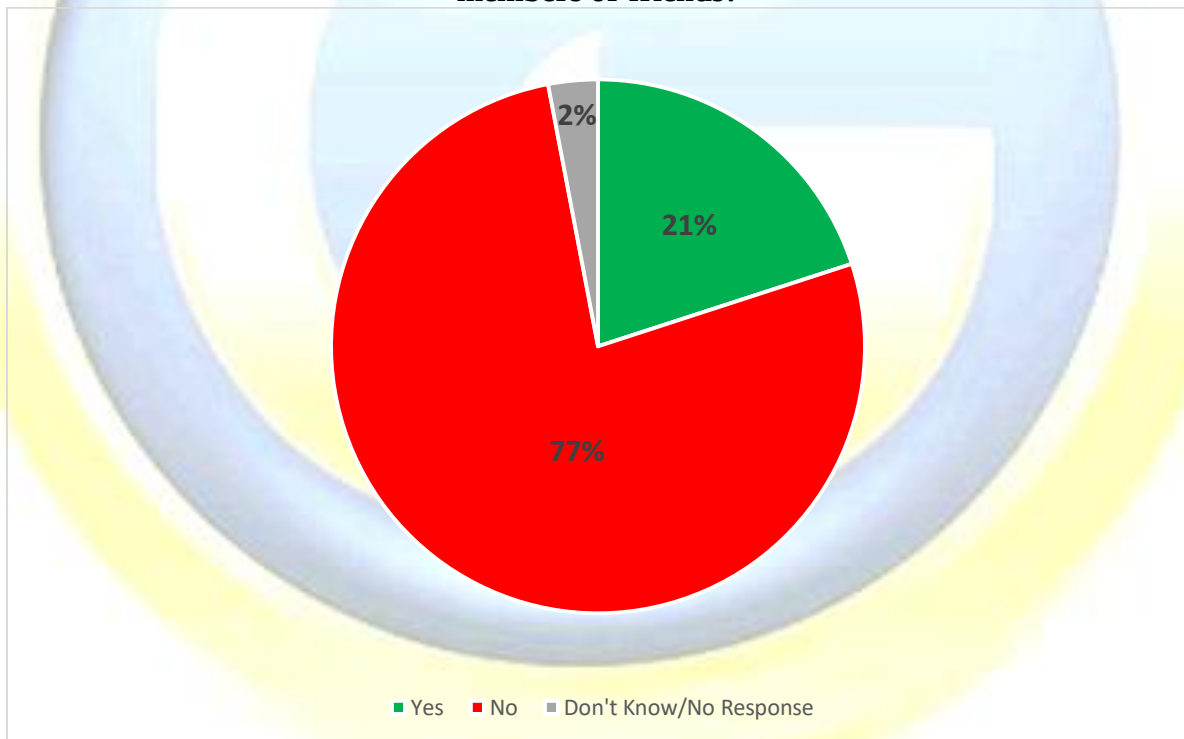

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, roughly 1 in 5 Pakistanis (21%) say they have a family member or friend who got divorced in the past six months, with a higher proportion of women (24%) aware of such cases.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “*In the past six months, have you heard about a divorce involving any of your family members or friends?*” In response, 21% said ‘Yes’, 77% said ‘No’, 2% said they don’t know or gave no response.

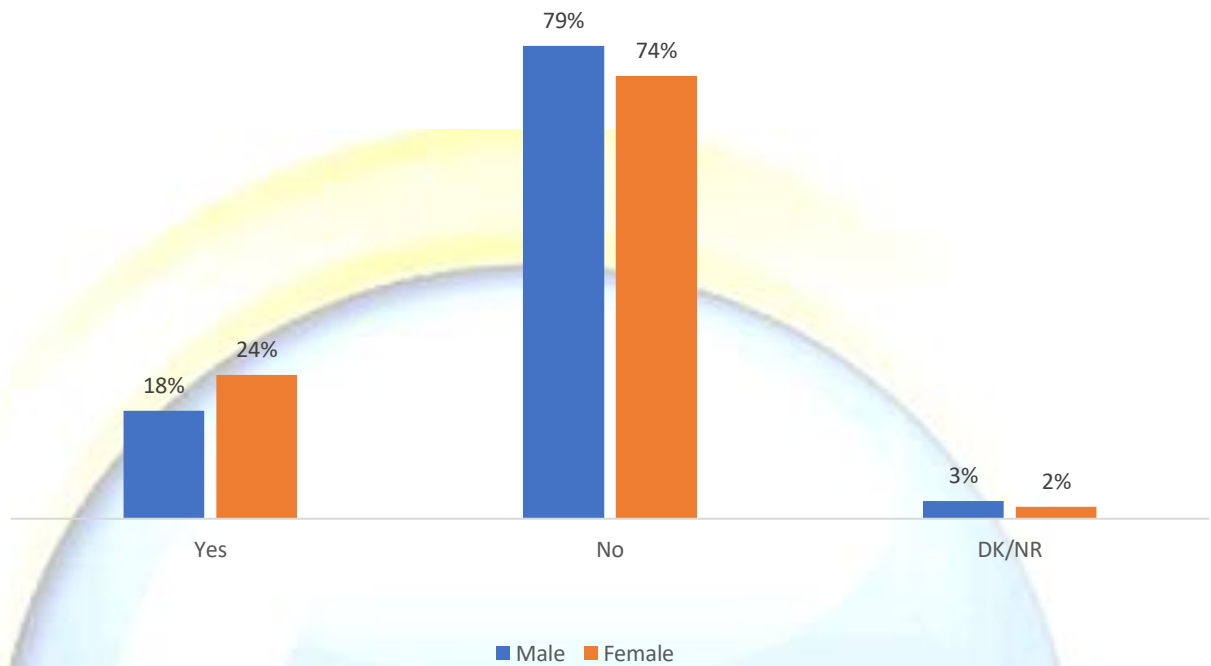
Question: In the past six months, have you heard about a divorce involving any of your family members or friends?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 788 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)

Across gender: Slightly more women (24%) than men (18%) reported having a family member or friend who has gone through a divorce.
