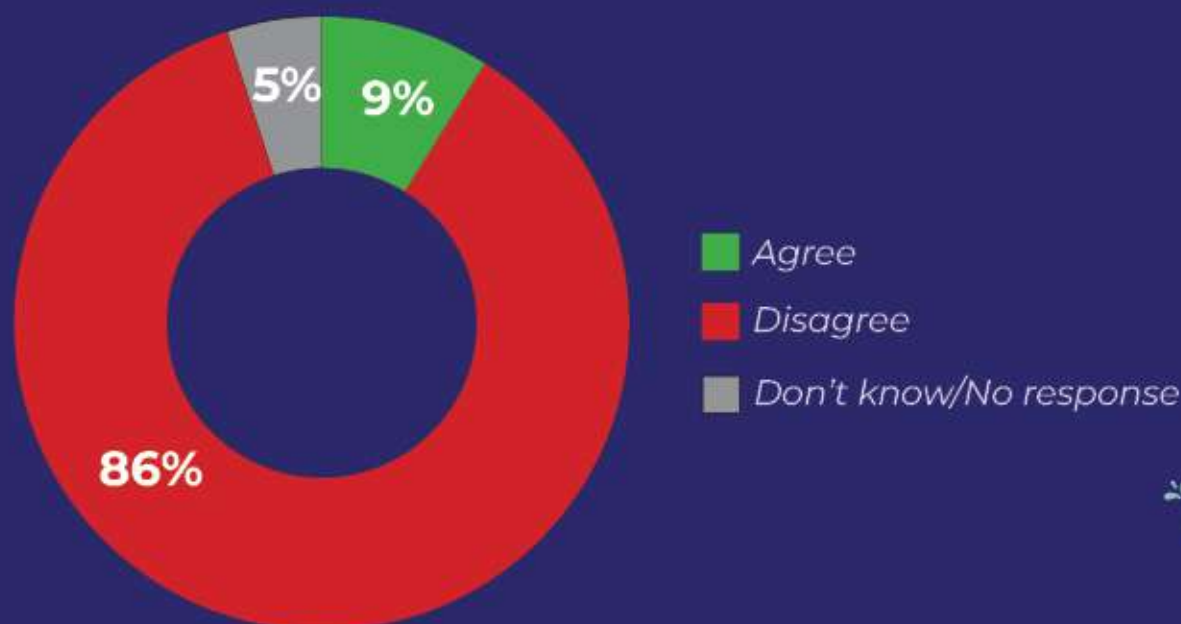

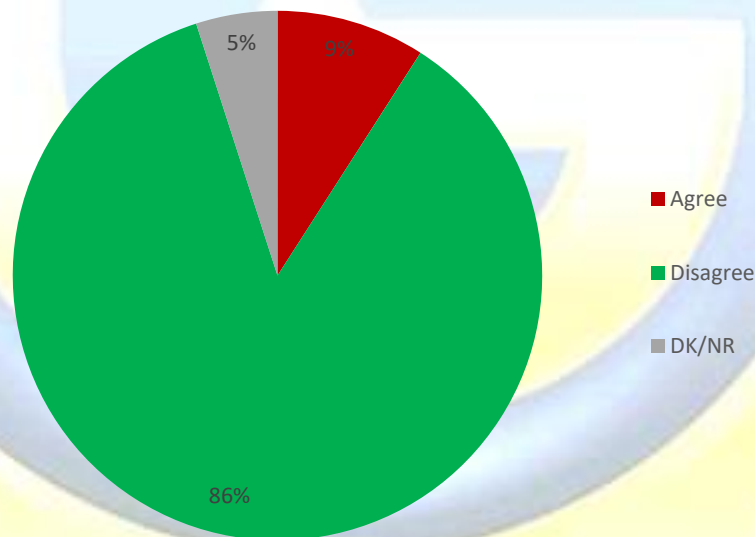

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 9% Pakistanis (close to 10 million in number) feel there is no problem in reusing a syringe/injection among household members, with a higher prevalence among those with less than 12 years of education (10%) and rural residents (10%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell us whether you agree or disagree with the following statements? - There is no problem in reusing a syringe/injection among household members?” In response, 9% said ‘Agree’, 86% said ‘Disagree’, and 5 % said they don’t know or gave no response.

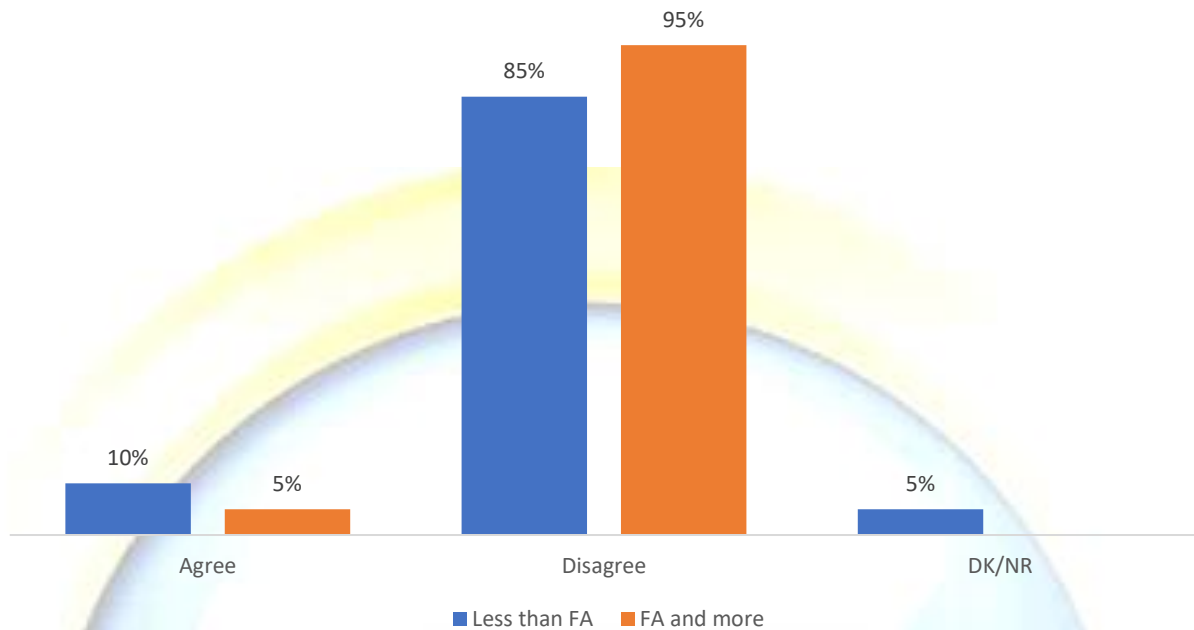
Question: Please tell us whether you agree or disagree with the following statements? - There is no problem in reusing a syringe/injection among household members

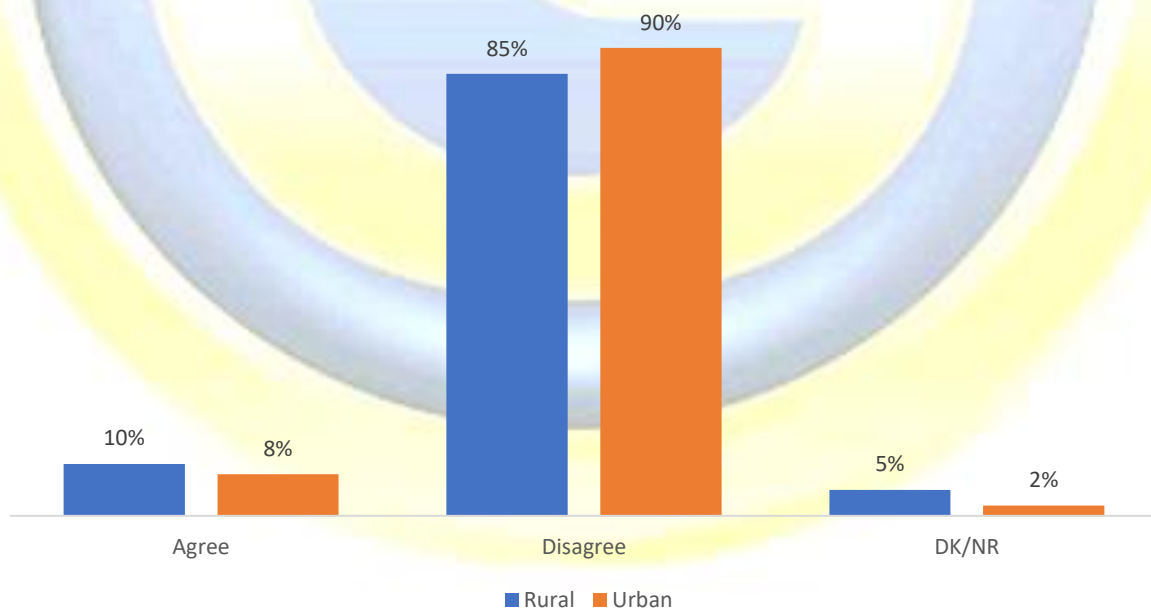
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 3048 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 30th November- 10th December 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across education: Even among individuals with more than 12 years of education, 5% believe reusing syringes poses no problem. In contrast, those with less than 12 years of education hold this belief at twice the rate (10%)
