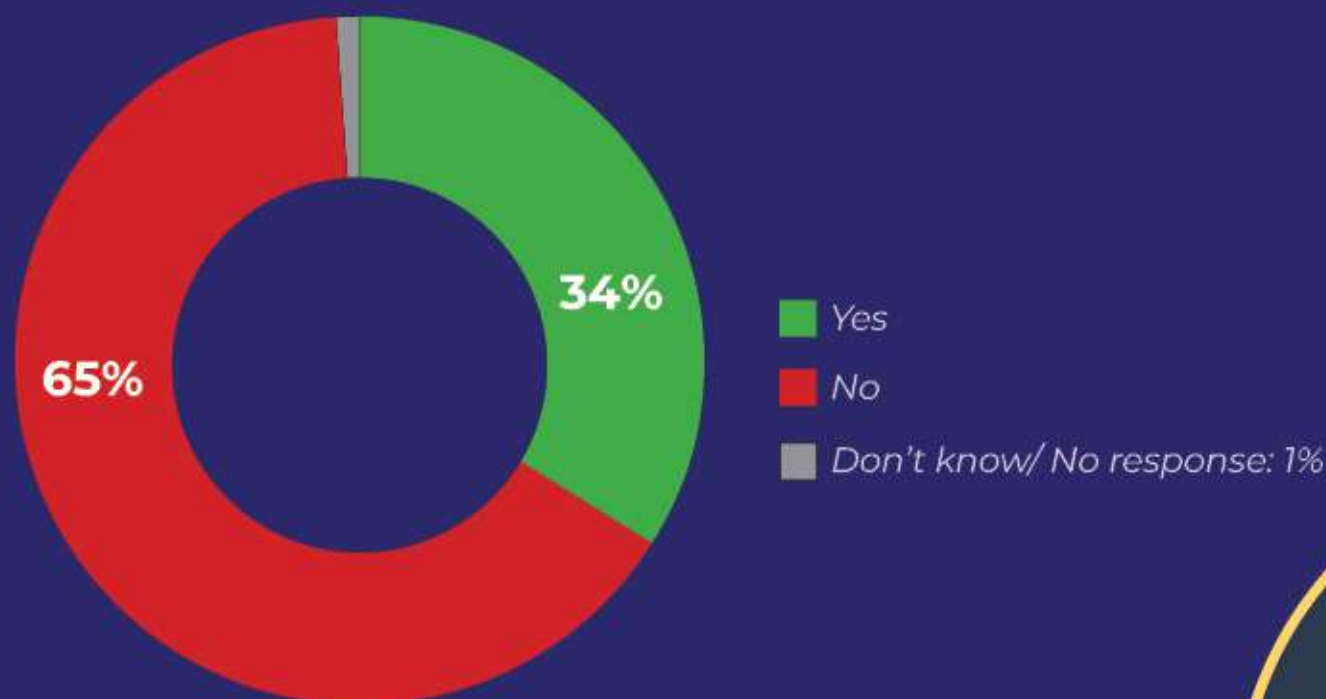


Over a third (34%) of Pakistanis said that they or one of their household members went hungry during the past week due to a lack of food

Question: During the past week, was there ever a day when you or someone in your household did not have enough food and had to go hungry? By family members I mean all the individuals who live together and eat from one stove?





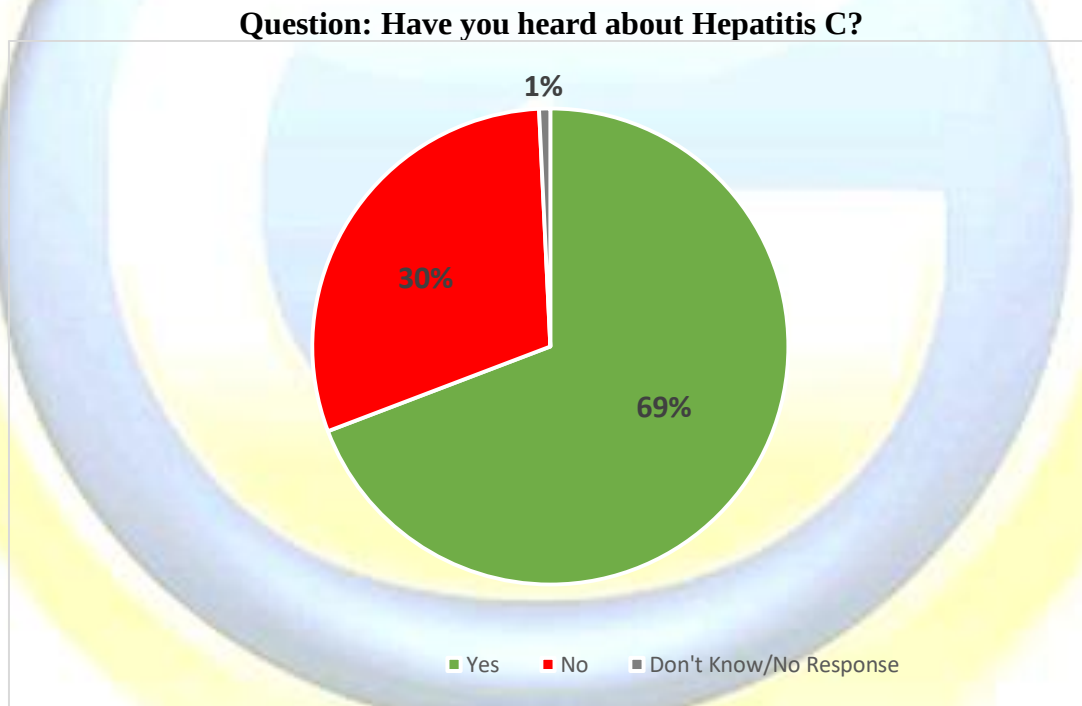

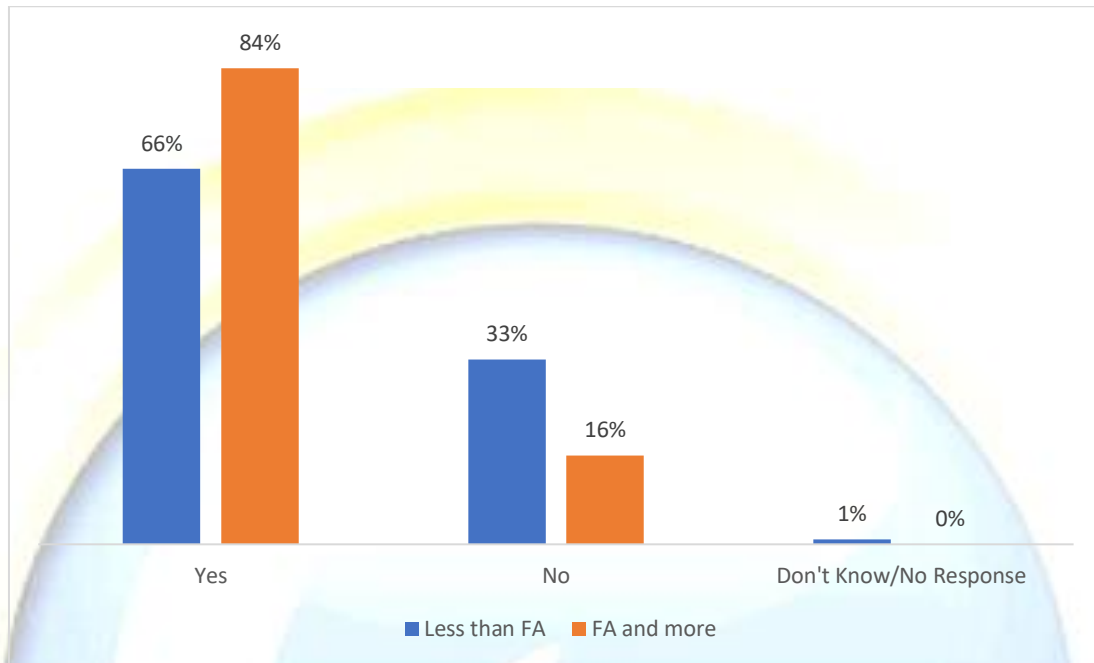
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Have you heard about Hepatitis C?” In response, 69% said ‘Yes,’ 30% said ‘No,’ and 1% either did not know or did not respond.

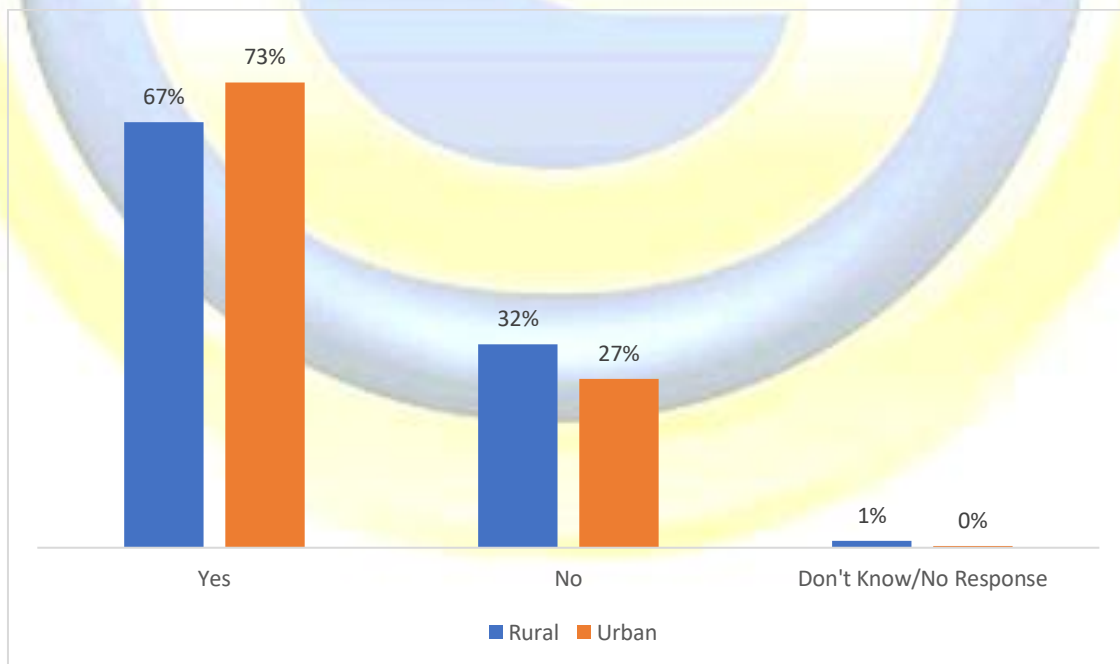
The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1042 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Across education level: Respondents who had completed FA (or equivalent) were 18% more likely to have heard of Hepatitis C. 84% of such respondents responded 'Yes' to the survey question compared to 66% of respondents who had not completed FA (or equivalent).

Urban Rural Divide: Residents of urban areas were 6% more likely to have heard of Hepatitis C. 73% of urban residents responded 'Yes' to the survey question compared to 67% of rural residents.
