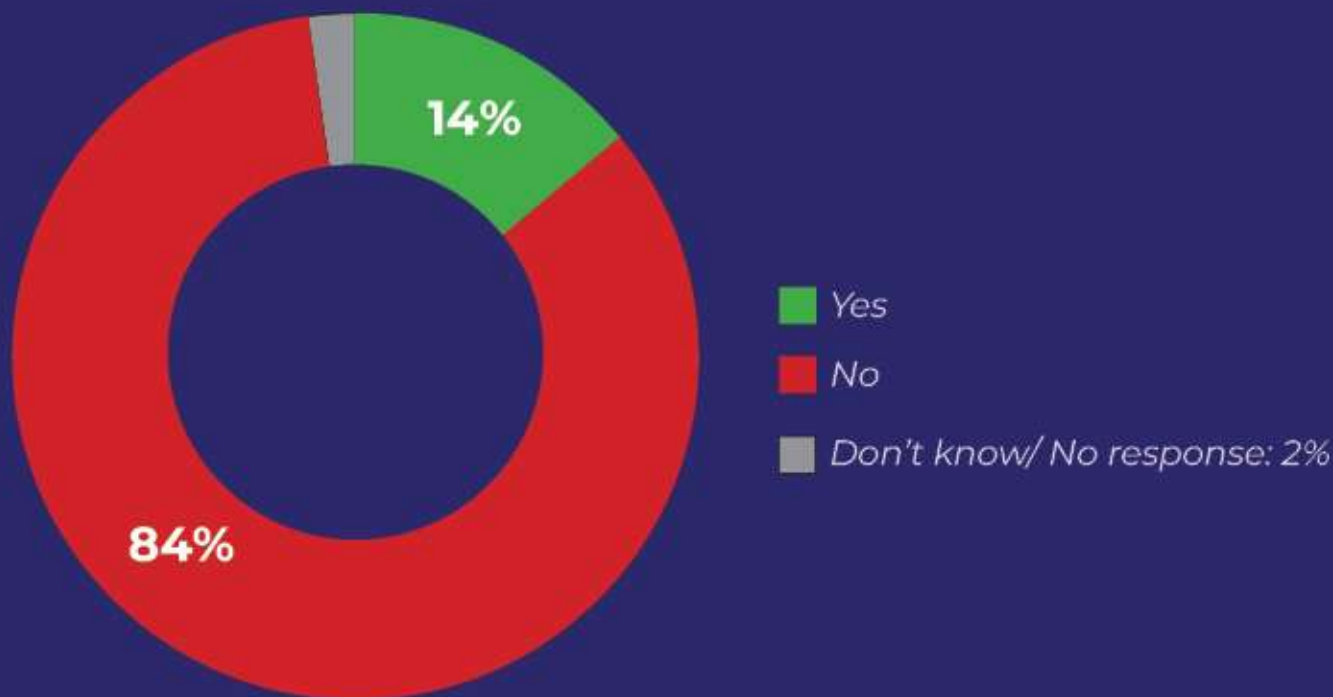


14% of Pakistanis said that they or a household members suffered from diarrhea, dysentery or loose stools in the past month

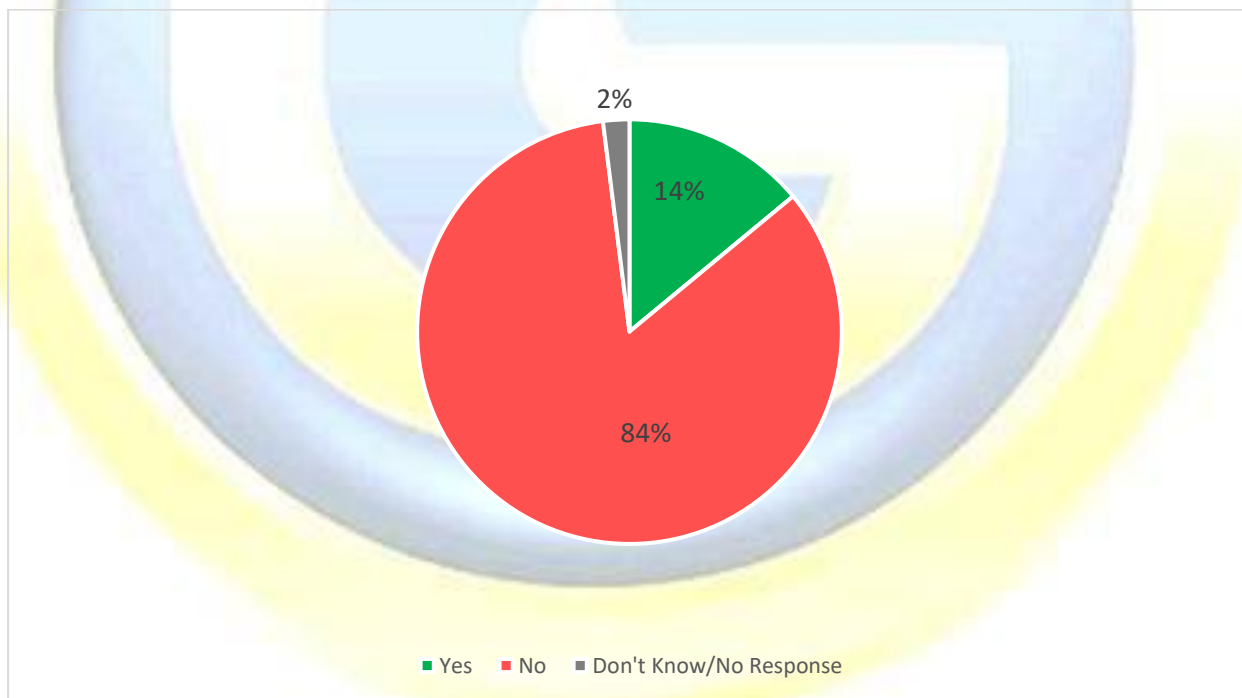
14% of Pakistanis said that they or a household members suffered from diarrhea, dysentery or loose stools in the past month: Gallup and Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 14% of Pakistanis said that they or a household members suffered from diarrhea, dysentery or loose stools in the past month.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, *“In the past month, have you or any member of your household experienced any of the following ailments/illnesses? By household members, I mean all individuals who live together and share a kitchen. [Diarrhea, dysentery or loose stools]”* In response, 14% said ‘Yes’, 84% said ‘No’, and 2% did not know or did not respond.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1042 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
