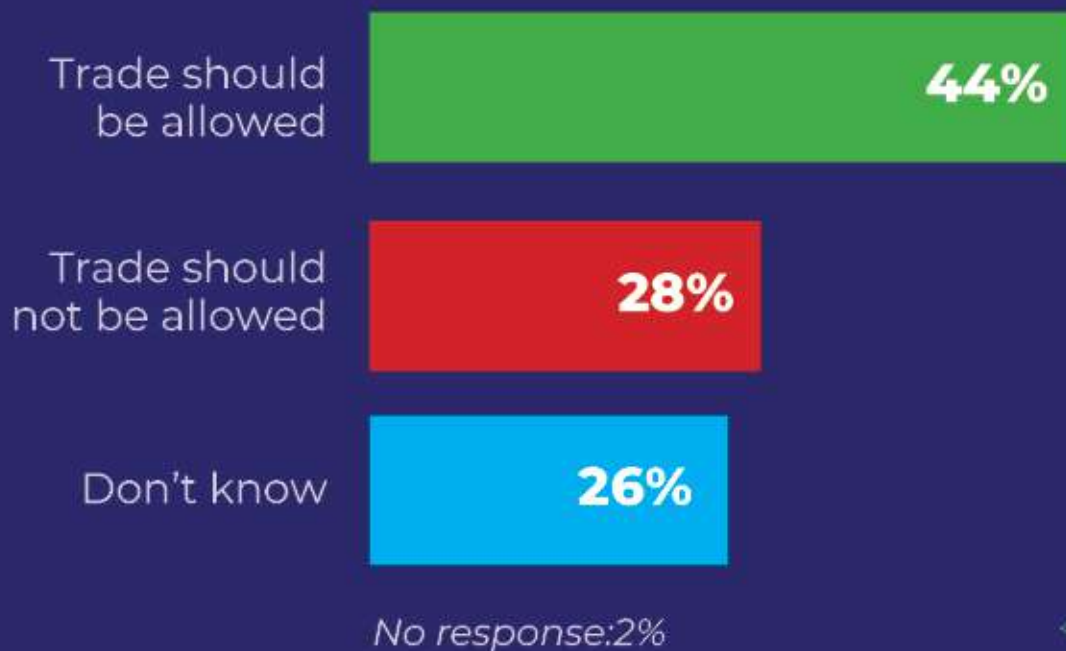


Over 4 in 10 (44%) Pakistanis believe that trade relations with India should be allowed

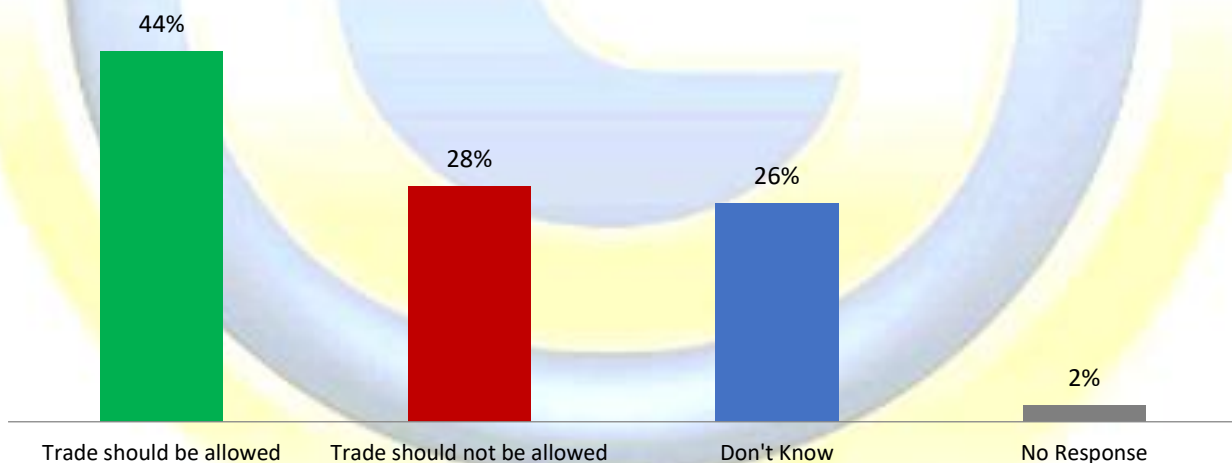
Over 4 in 10 (44%) Pakistanis believe that trade relations with India should be allowed. (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan)

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, over 4 in 10 (44%) Pakistanis believe that trade relations with India should be allowed.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, ***“Some people believe that trade with India should be allowed, while others oppose this idea. What is your opinion on this matter?”***. In response, 44% said ‘trade should be allowed’, 28% said ‘trade should not be allowed’, and 26% said that they didn’t know, while 2% didn’t respond.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 788 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12nd January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
