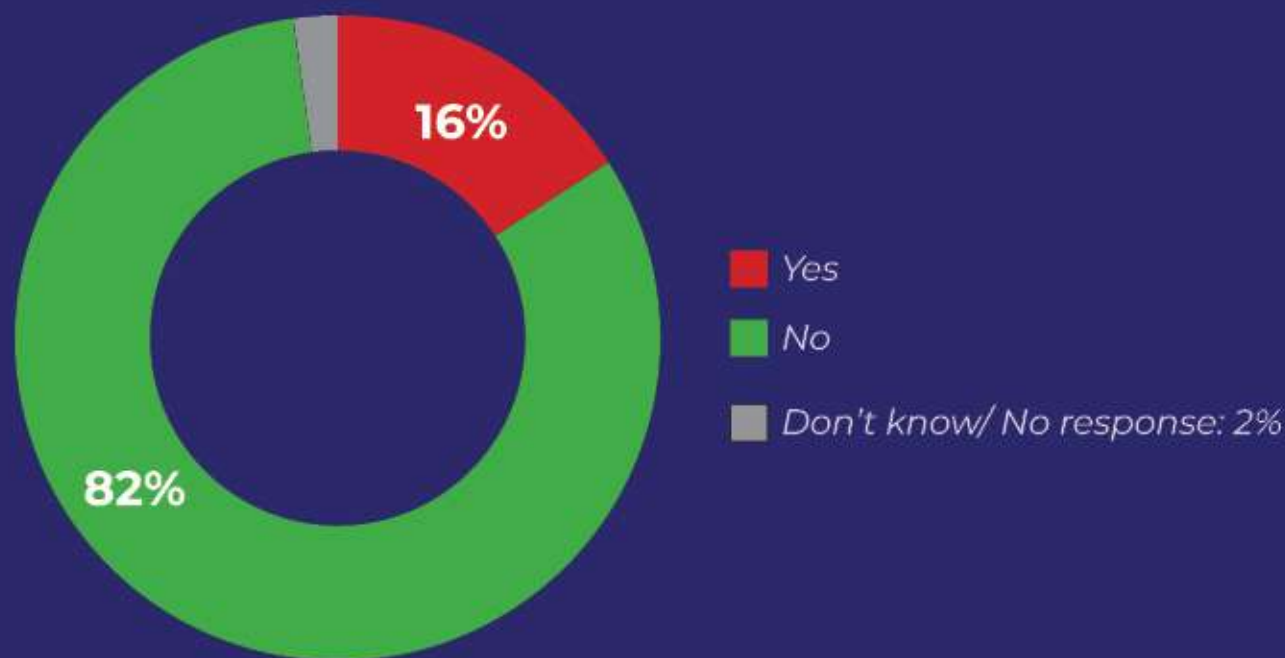


16% of Pakistanis reported skin infections within the past month, with a higher prevalence among respondents aged 50+

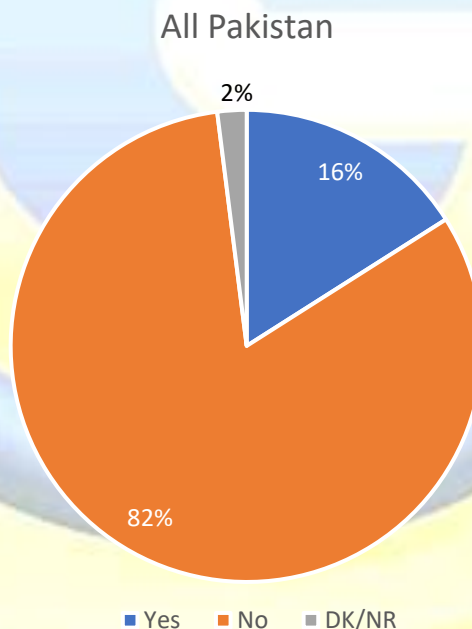
16% of Pakistanis reported skin infections within the past month, with a higher prevalence among respondents aged 50+ (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 16% of Pakistanis reported skin infections within the past month, with a higher prevalence among respondents aged 50 +.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, ***“In the past month, have you or any member of your household experienced any of the following ailments/illnesses? By household members, I mean all individuals who live together and share a kitchen? - Skin infection”***. In response, 16% said ‘Yes’, 82% said ‘No’, and 2% didn’t know or didn’t respond.

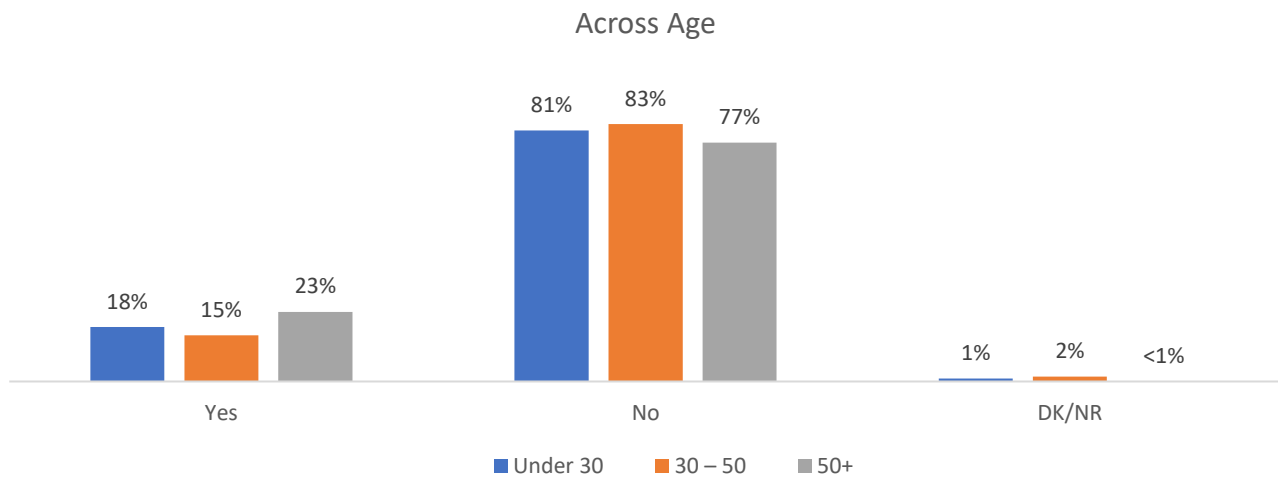

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1042 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)

Across Age: Respondents aged above 50 were more likely to report skin infections, with 23%, followed by those under 30 with 18%. While respondents aged 30 to 50 were least likely to report skin infections, with only 15%.
