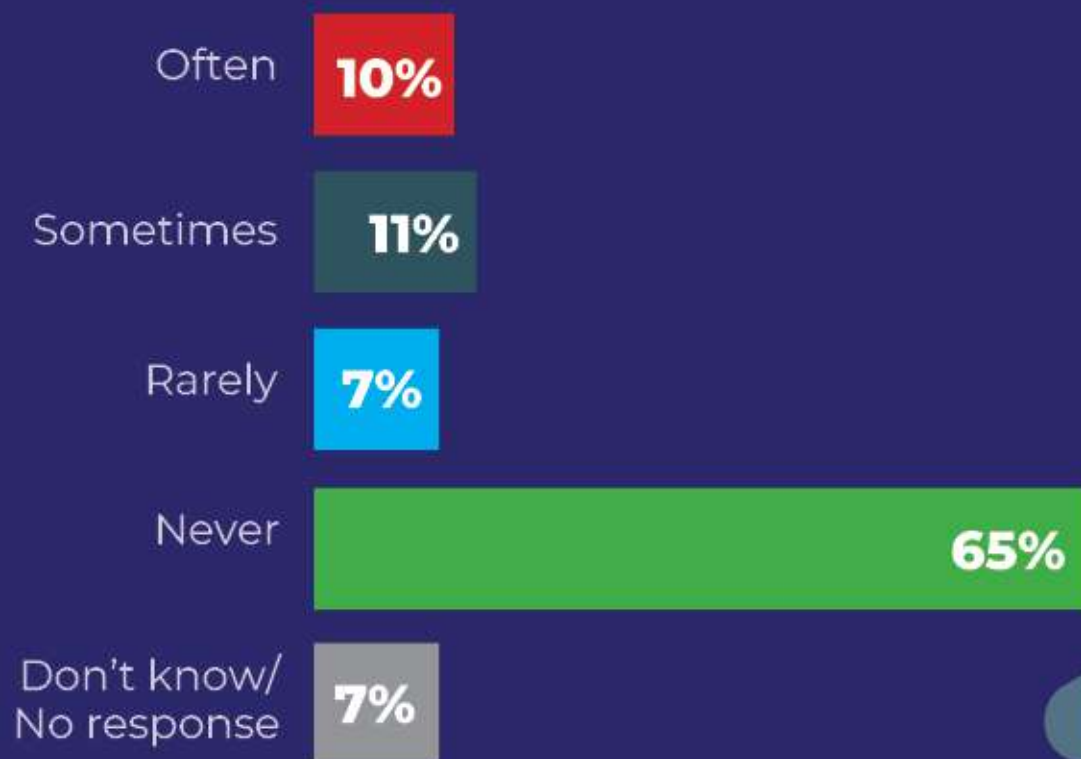


65% Pakistanis say in past one year they or people in their household have never felt unsafe with respect to crime at their home.

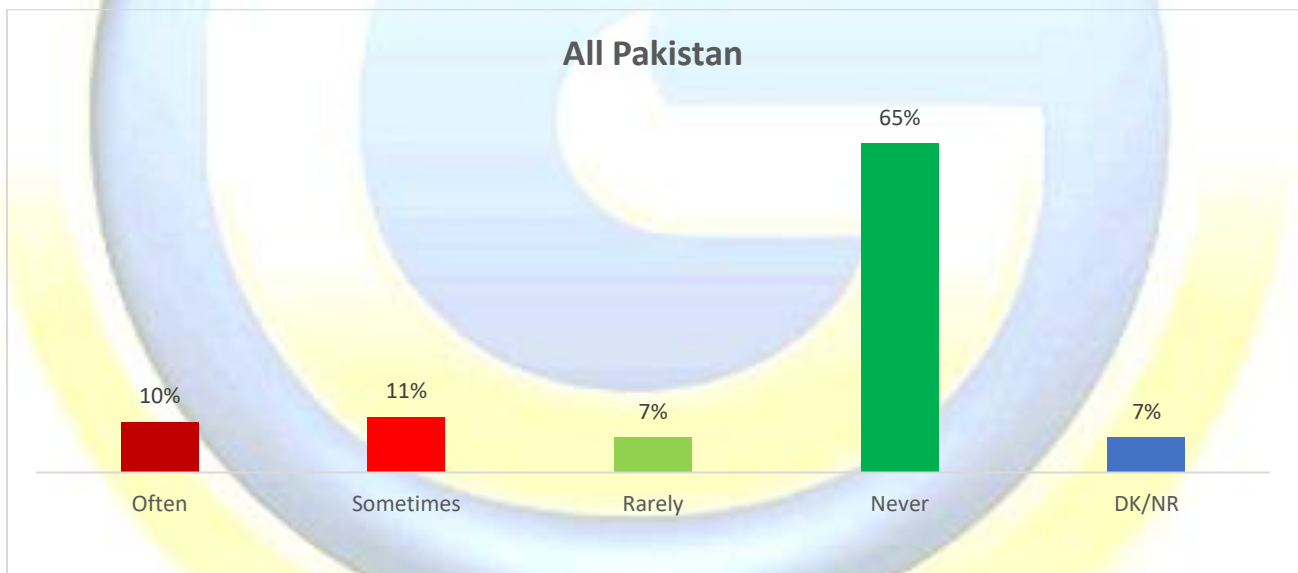
65% Pakistanis say in past one year they or people in their household have never felt unsafe with respect to crime at their home. (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 65% Pakistanis say in past one year they or people in their household have never felt unsafe with respect to crime at their home.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, ***“In the last 12 months, how often have you or your family...? - Felt unsafe from crime in your home.”*** In response to this question, 10% said ‘often’, 11% said ‘sometimes’, 7% said ‘rarely’, 65% said ‘never’ and 7% did not know or did not respond.

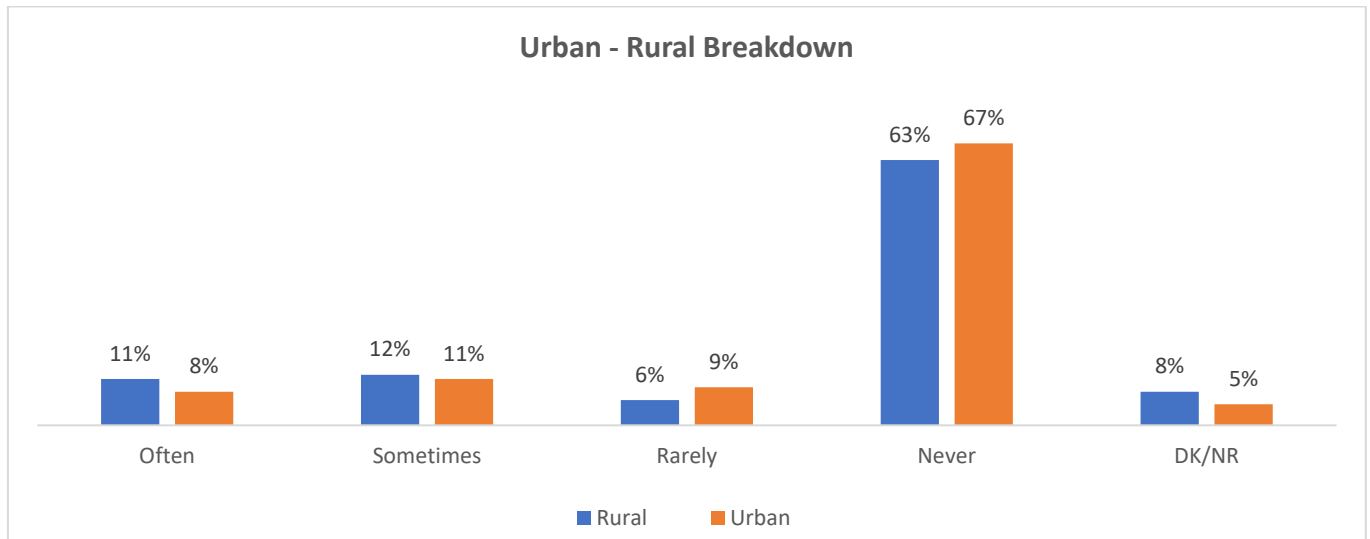
Question: In the last 12 months, how often have your or your family...? - Felt unsafe from crime in your home.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1042 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 7th January – 12th January 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Urban-Rural Breakdown: Survey findings reveal that urban residents feel more secure with respect to crimes at their homes. 67% of urban residents reported never feeling unsafe from crimes such as theft or robbery in the past 12 months. In comparison, 63% of rural residents shared similar sentiments.
