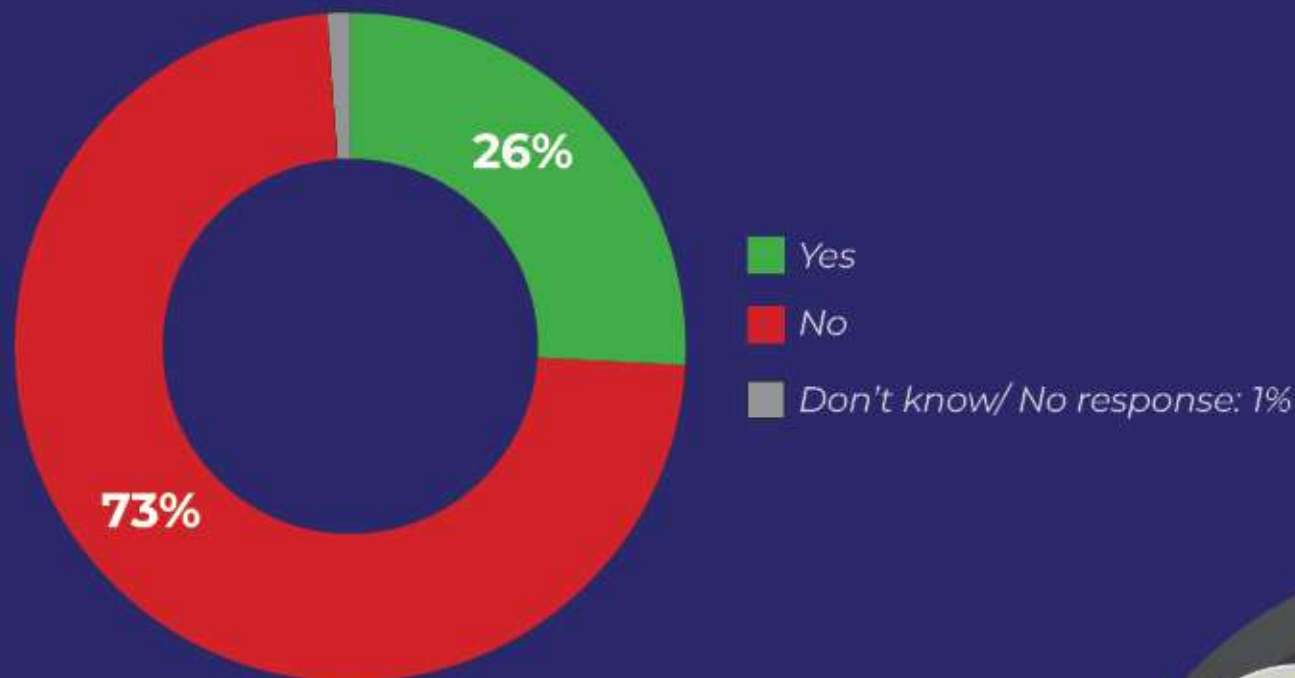


Home-Cooked Bread Dominates: 73% of Pakistanis claimed they did not purchase Roti/Naan from a tandoor the day before the Survey

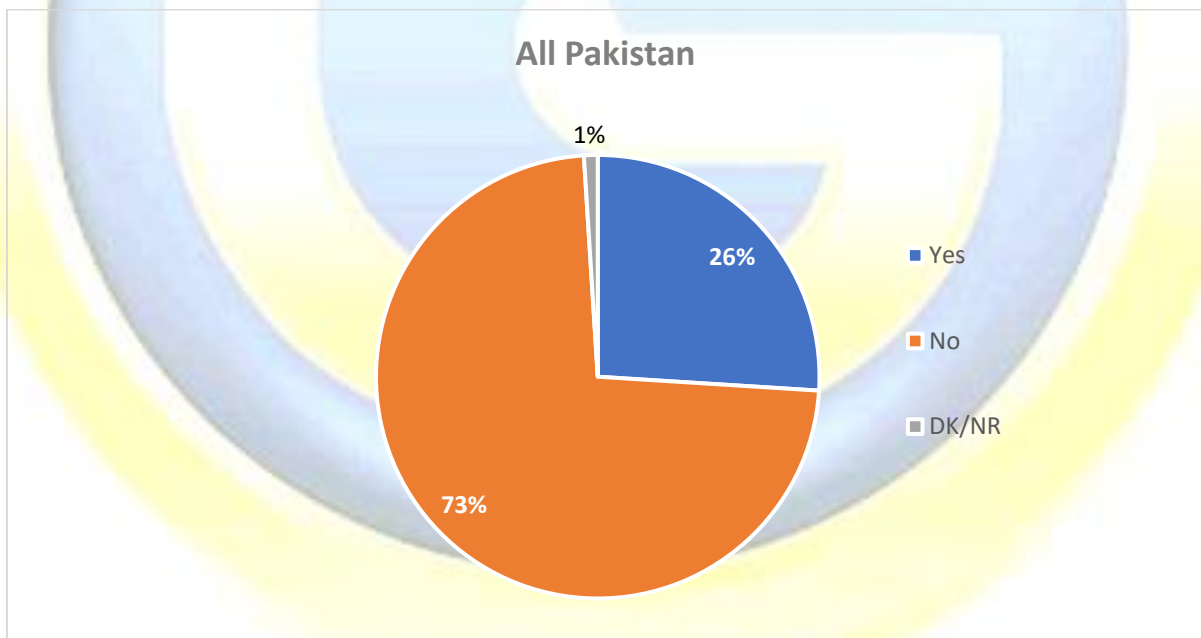
Home-Cooked Bread Dominates: 73% of Pakistanis claimed they did not purchase Roti/Naan from a tandoor the day before the Survey (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

(Islamabad), 26th May 2025

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 73% of Pakistanis claimed they did not purchase Roti/Naan from a tandoor the day before the Survey.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, ***“Please tell me, did you or anyone in your household buy roti/naan from a tandoor yesterday?”***. In response to this question, 26% said ‘yes’, 73% said ‘no’, while 1% didn’t know or didn’t respond.

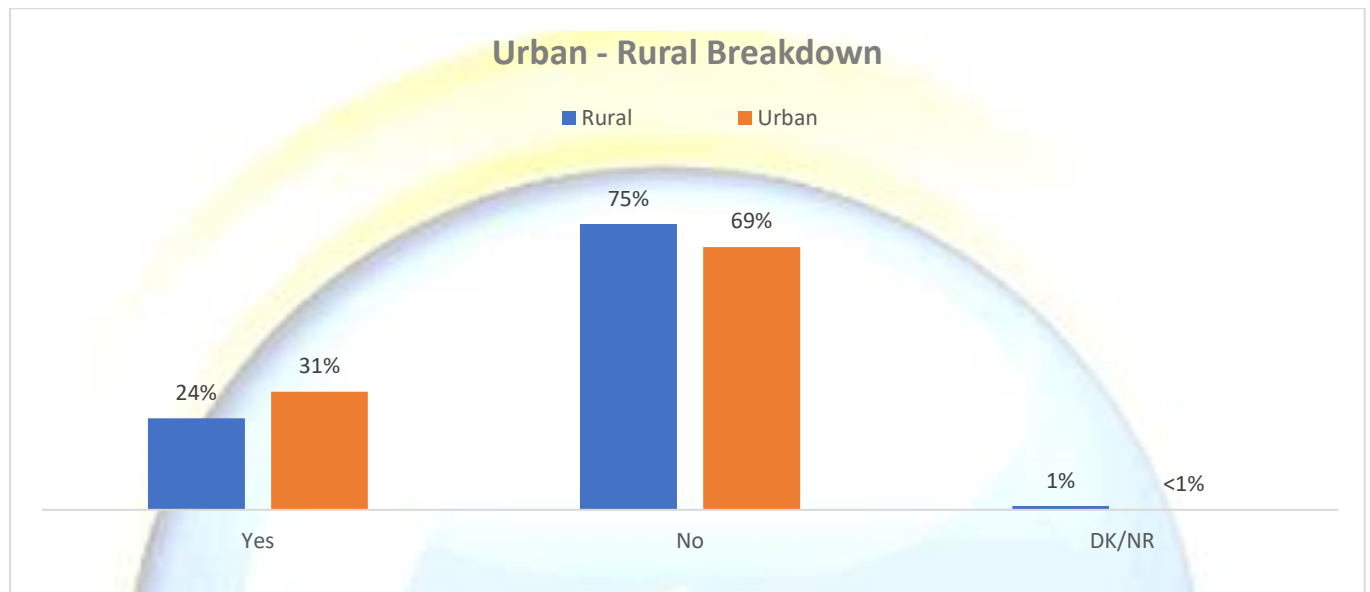
Question: Please tell me, did you or anyone in your household buy roti/naan from a tandoor yesterday?

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1038 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 11th April 2025 – 18th April 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Urban - Rural Breakdown: 31% of respondents from urban areas reported that they or someone from their household purchased roti/naan from a tandoor yesterday (the day before the survey was conducted), indicating a higher prevalence of tandoor-based roti or naan consumption among urban residents than the rural residents (24%).
