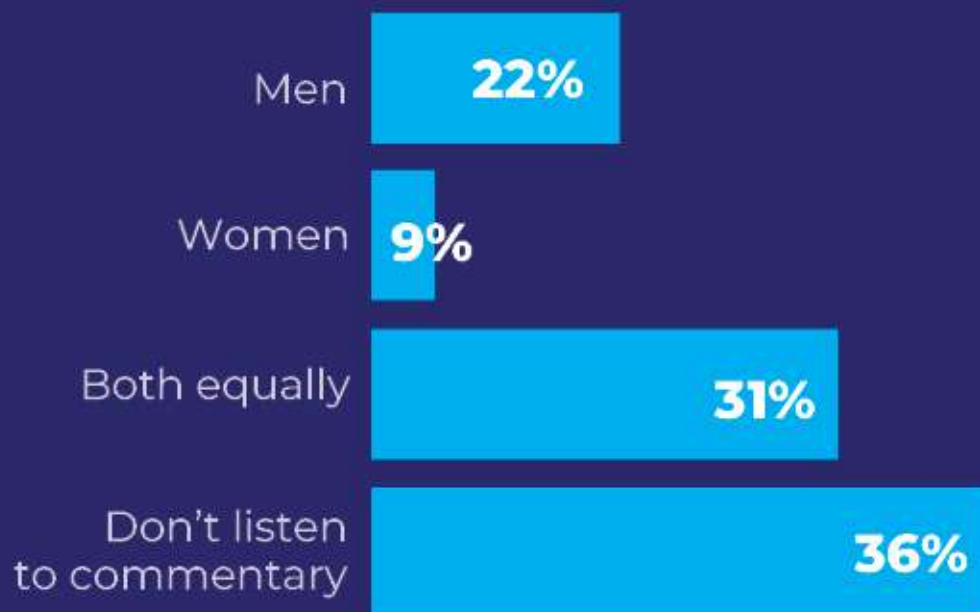

**Over one-third of Pakistanis (36%) do not listen to cricket commentary; 31% say men and women are equally good commentators, while 22% prefer men and 9% prefer women commentators – Gallup & Gilani Survey**

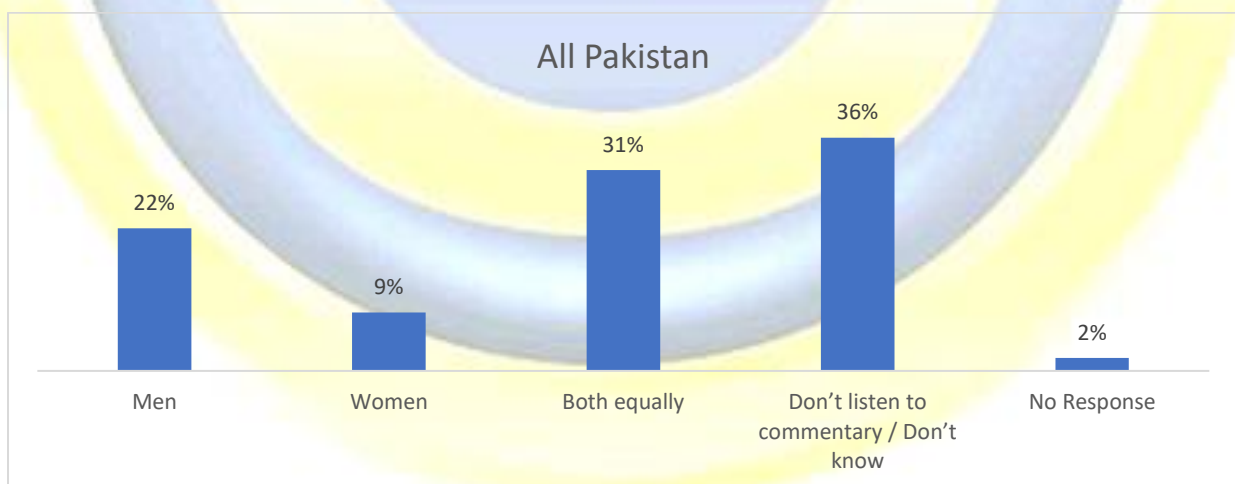

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, over one-third (36%) of Pakistanis do not listen to cricket commentary, 31% say both men and women are equally good commentators, while 22% prefer men and 9% prefer women as commentators.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, *“These days, both men and women do cricket commentary. In your opinion, who provides better commentary?”*. In response to this question, 22% said ‘men’, 9% said ‘women’, 31% said ‘both equally’, 36% said they don’t listen to commentary, while 2% did not respond.

These findings suggest that while a considerable segment of the population remains disengaged from cricket commentary, there is a strong recognition of equality between male and female commentators among those who do have an opinion.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 779 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from March 07, 2025 to March 22, 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2-3$  percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
