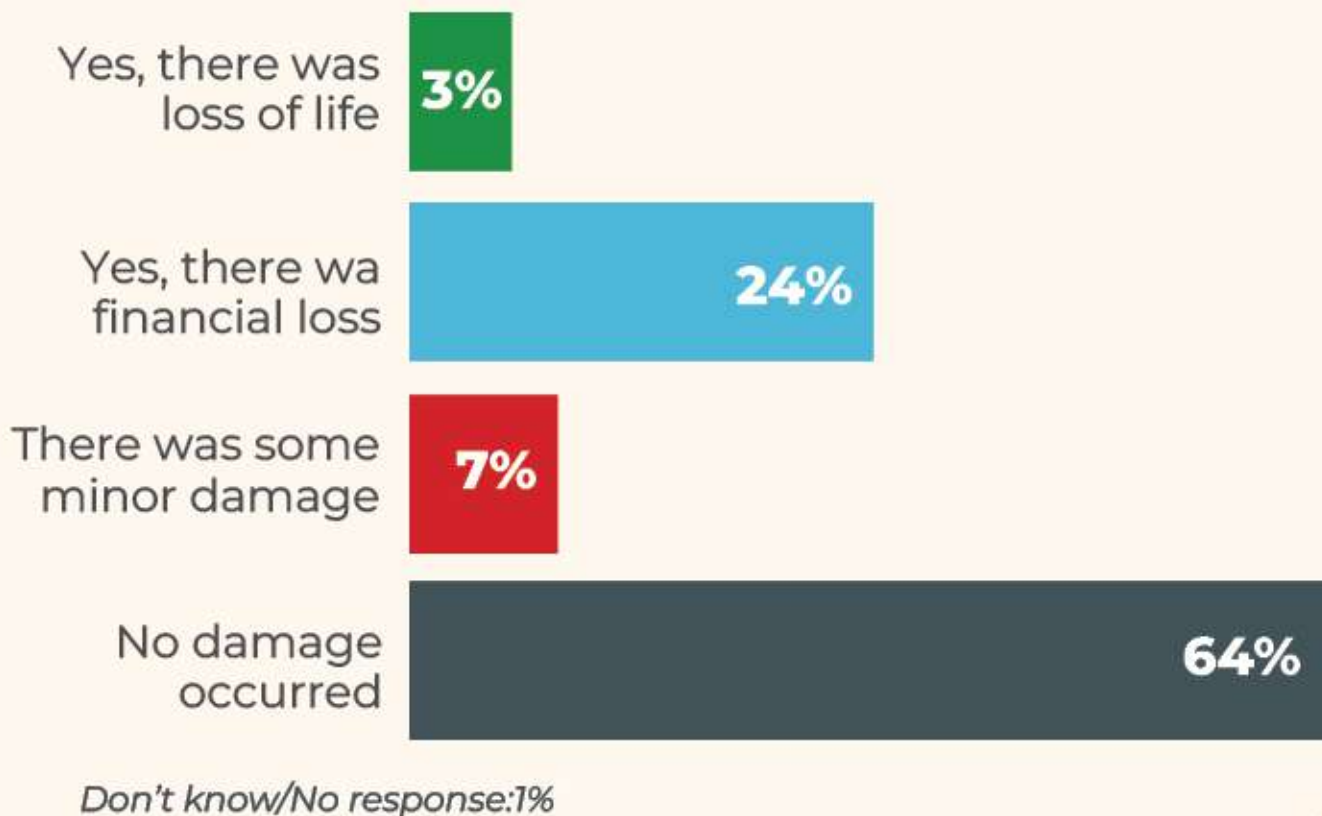


Nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (24%) report financial losses due to recent rains or cloudbursts, while a majority (64%) report no damage in their locality.

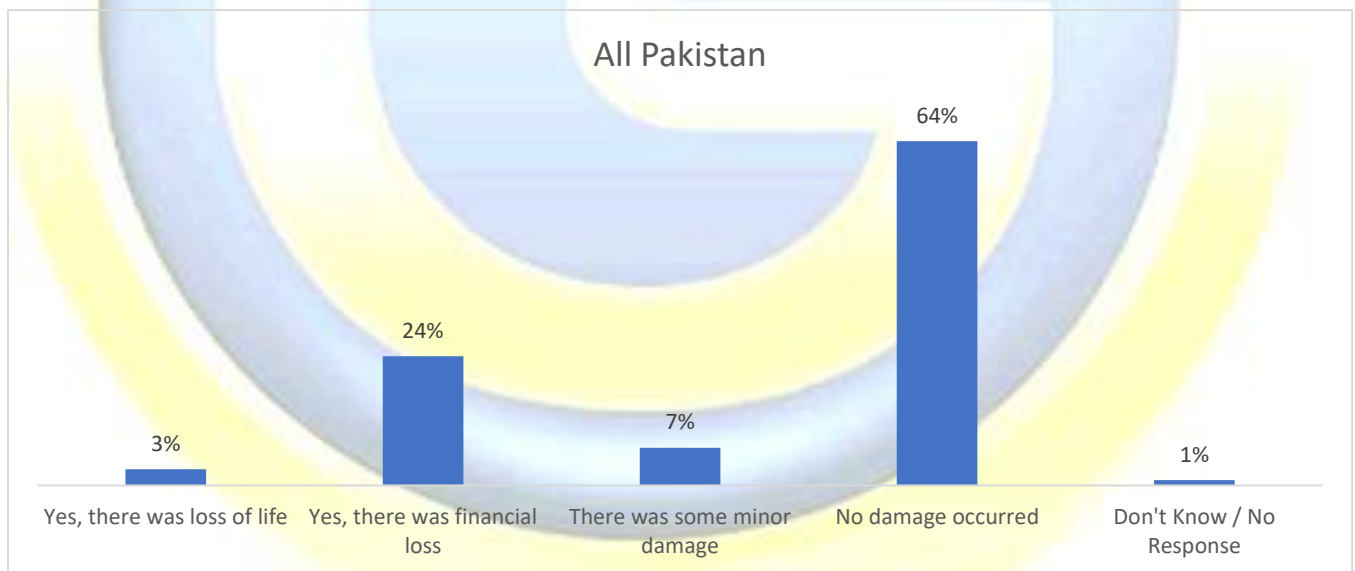

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, nearly 1 in 4 Pakistanis (24%) report financial losses due to recent rains or cloudbursts, while a majority (64%) report no damage in their locality.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women across the country was asked the question, **“Has there been any damage in your area due to recent rains or cloudbursts?”**. In response, 3% said ‘yes, there was loss of life’, 24% said ‘yes, there was financial loss’, 7% said “there was some minor damage”, 64% said “no damage occurred”, while 1% didn’t know or didn’t respond.

The findings indicate that while a majority of the population remains unaffected, a significant minority (nearly one in four households) has been impacted, mainly through financial damages. This underscores the urgent need for mitigation measures, improved drainage and flood infrastructure, and targeted support for affected communities.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 323 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from August 20, 2025 to August 21, 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
