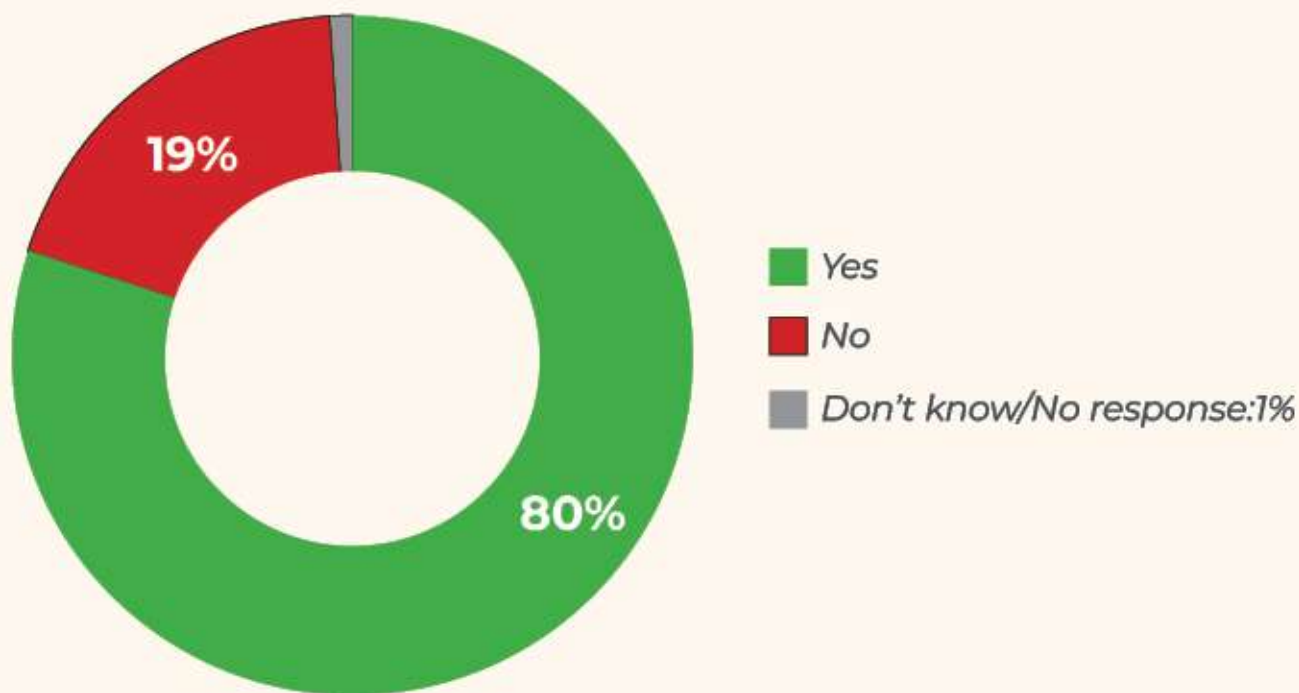


4 in 5 (80%) Pakistanis Support Special Training for Madrassa Teachers.

4 in 5 (80%) Pakistanis Support Special Training for Madrassa Teachers. (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

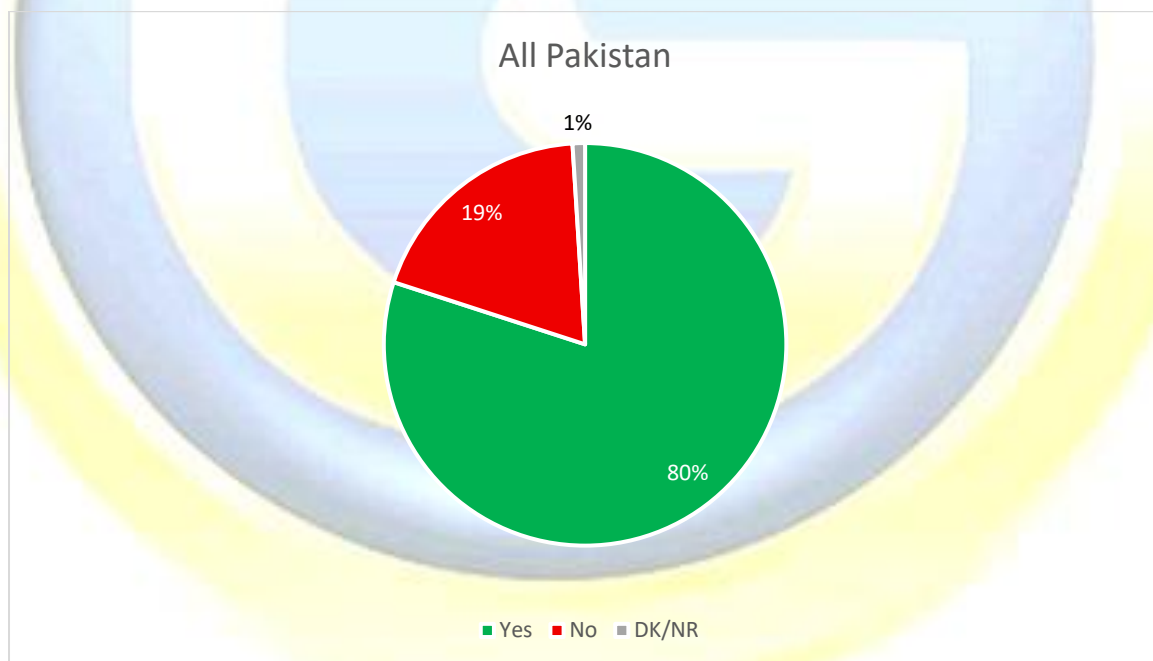

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, 4 in 5 (80%) Pakistanis support special training for madrassa teachers.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women across the country was asked the question, ***“Do you think madrassa teachers should receive special training in child upbringing?”***. In response, a significant majority of Pakistanis (80%) responded ‘Yes’, believing that madrassa teachers should receive special training in child upbringing, while 19% of respondents answered ‘No, and 1% were unsure or did not respond.

This widespread support suggests growing public awareness regarding the importance of qualified teaching standards in religious education, potentially paving the way for future policy initiatives to improve child development and protection in madrassas.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1060 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from August 02, 2025 to August 21, 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
