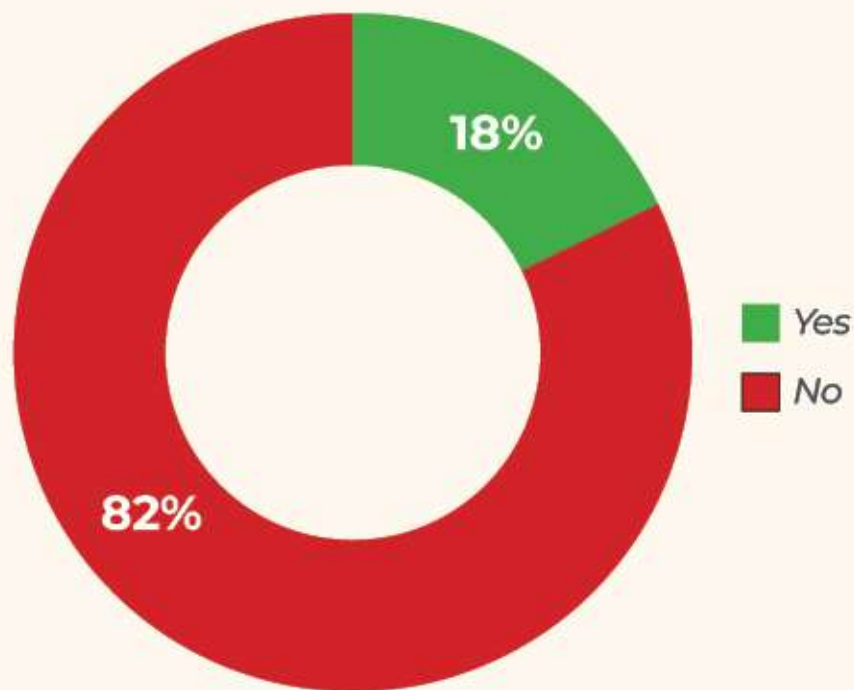


Among rain-affected Pakistanis, only 18% report receiving flood relief aid, while a significant 82% say they did not.

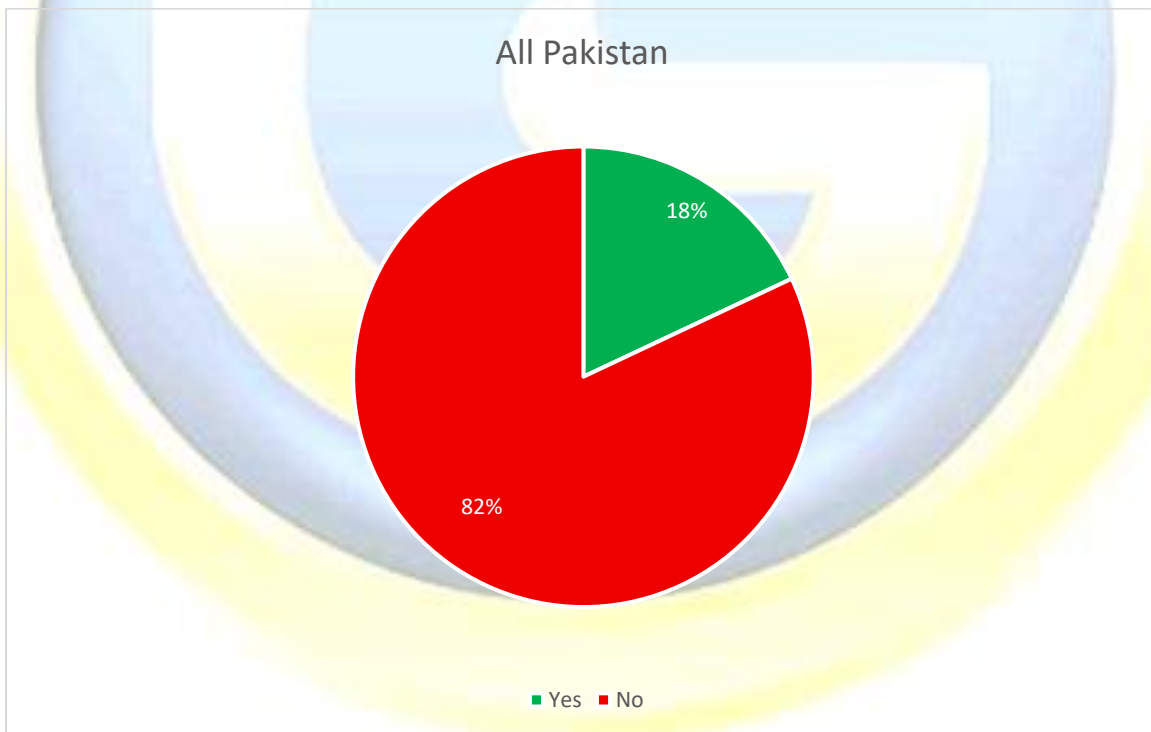

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, among rain-affected Pakistanis, only 18% report receiving flood relief aid, while a significant 82% say they did not.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women across the country who were affected by the recent rain was asked the question, ***“Did you or anyone you know receive any financial aid from flood relief funds?”***. In response, 18% Pakistanis who reported being “very much” affected by recent rains said “Yes” they or someone they know received financial aid from flood relief funds, while a substantial 82% reported not receiving such aid.

These finding highlights that within the hardest-hit segment of Pakistanis; a significant majority have not seen direct or indirect benefit from official flood relief funds.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 225 men and women, who were affected by the recent rains, in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from September 12, 2025 to September 23, 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
