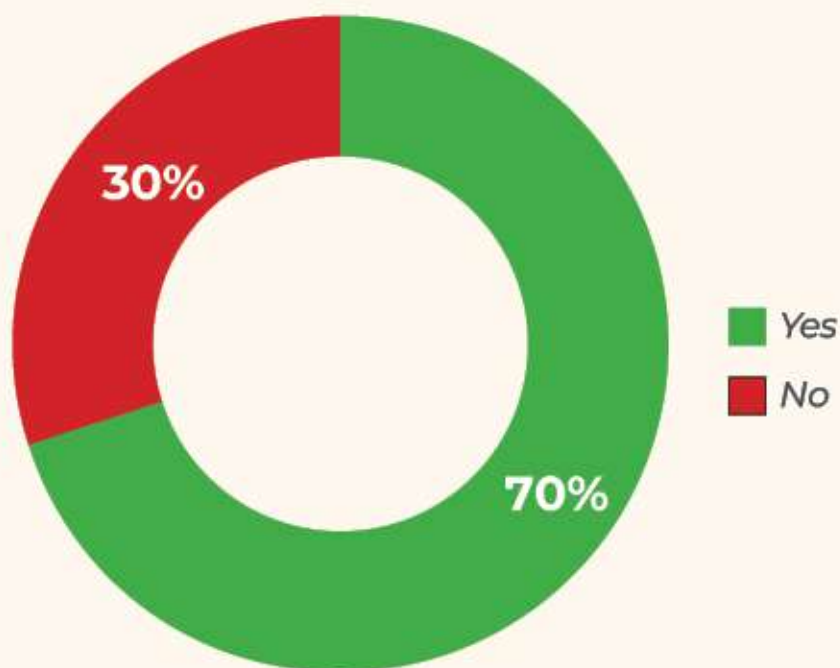


Pakistanis foresee worsening floods due to climate change — 7 in 10 agree nationwide

Pakistanis foresee worsening floods due to climate change — 7 in 10 agree nationwide (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

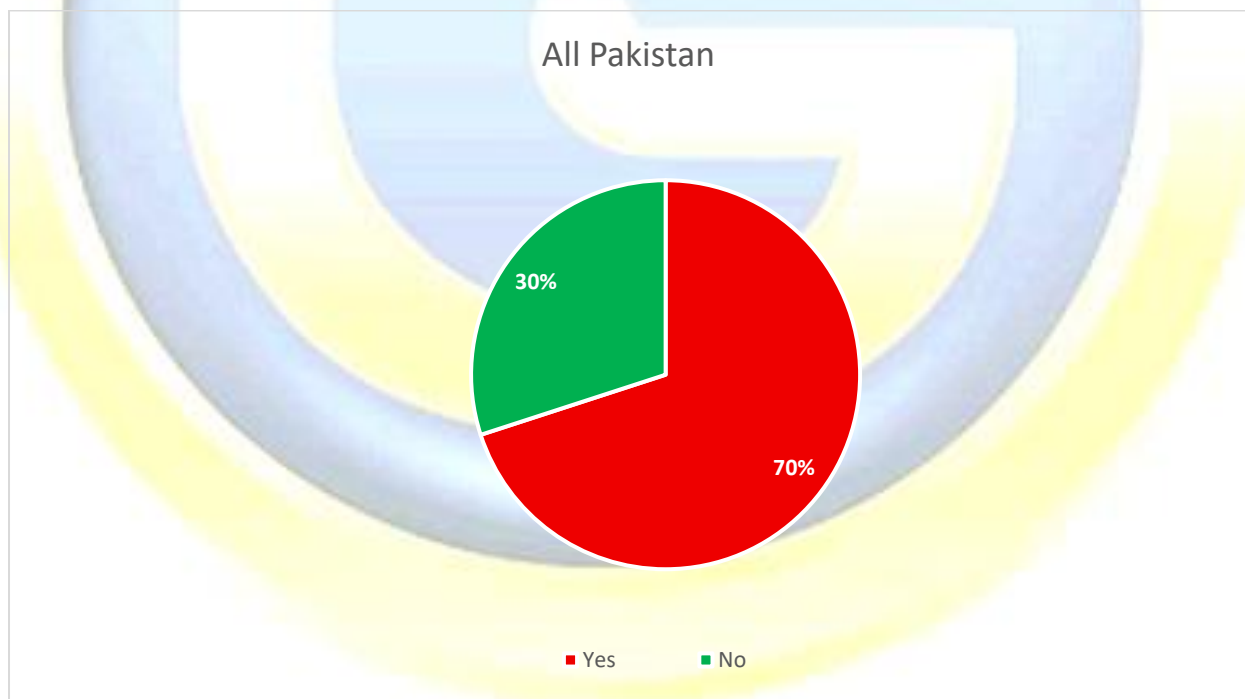

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, Pakistanis foresee worsening floods due to climate change, 7 in 10 agree nationwide.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women across the country was asked the question, ***“Because of climate change, will Pakistan face more severe floods in the future?”***. In response, a significant 70% of Pakistanis believed that climate change would cause more severe floods in the future. Conversely, 30% did not expect climate change to worsen flooding in Pakistan.

These findings indicate a widespread national awareness of the dangers posed by climate change, with the vast majority of Pakistanis expressing concern about the country’s future vulnerability to flooding. This consensus highlights a public mandate for policymakers to prioritize climate adaptation and disaster preparedness measures.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 753 men and women, in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from September 12, 2025 to September 23, 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
