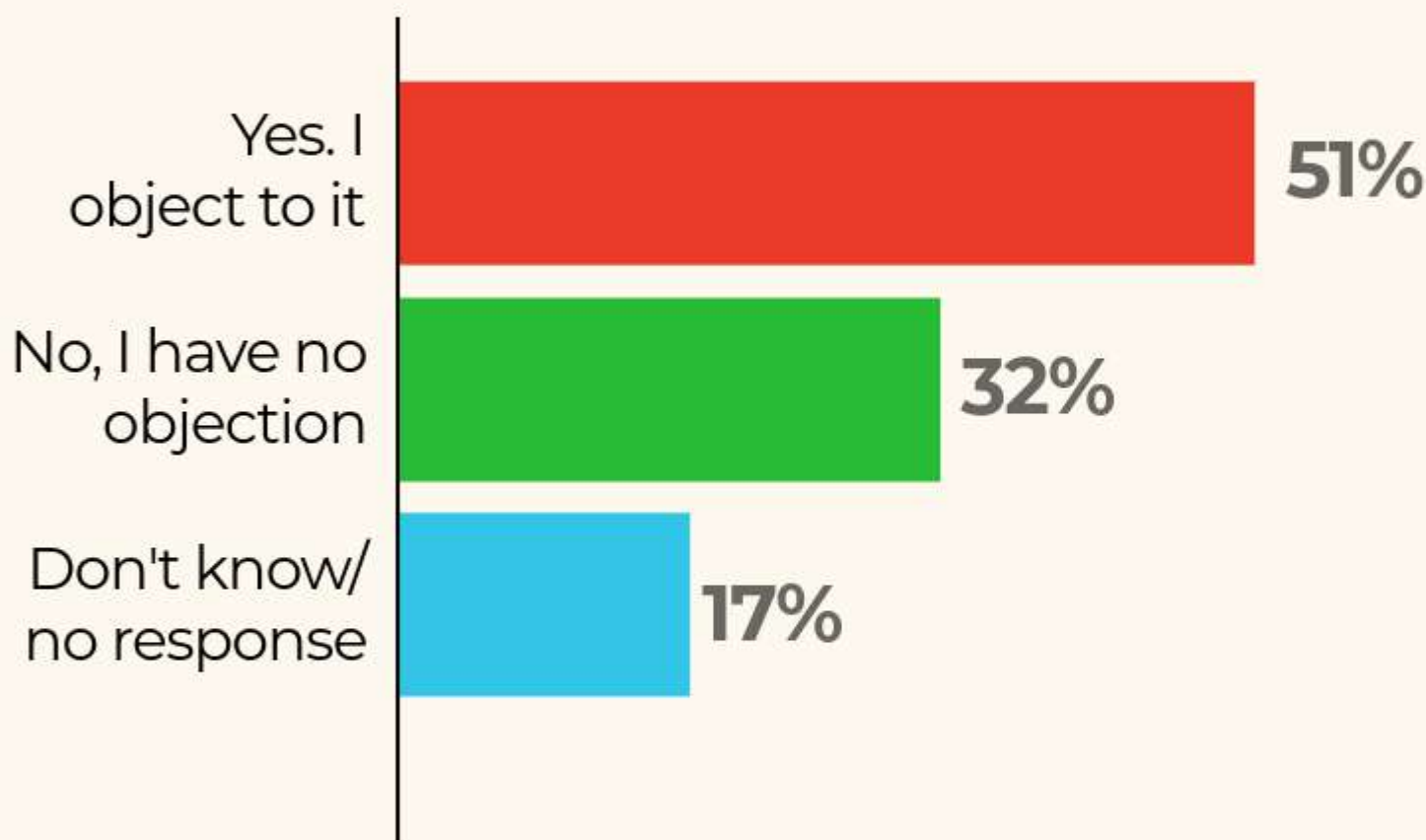

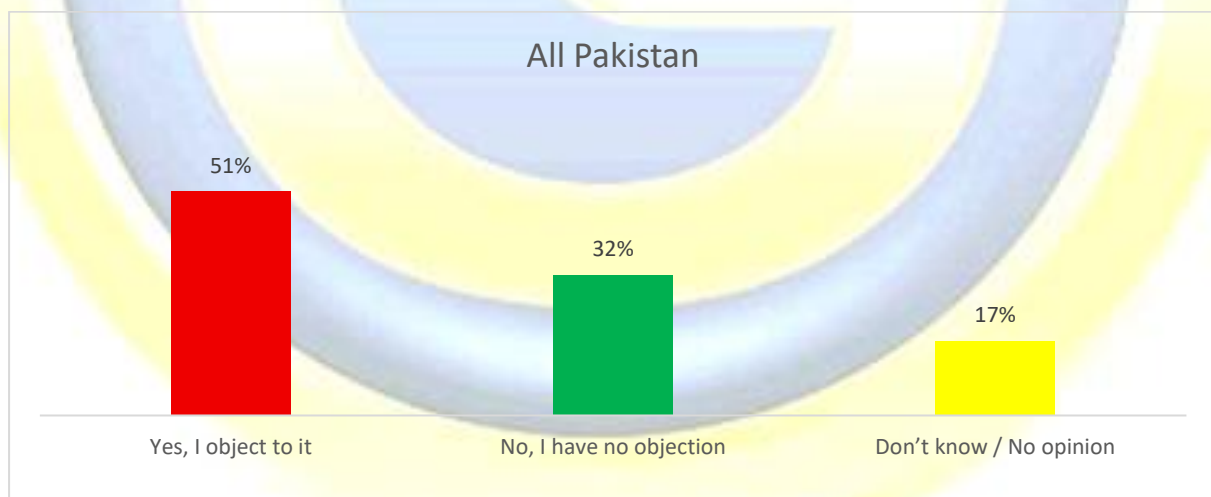
A Majority of Pakistanis (51%) aware of the Pakistan Afghanistan border dispute Object to the Afghan Taliban Establishing Close Relations with India – One-Third Have No Objection. (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

(Islamabad), 27th November 2025

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 51% of Pakistanis aware of the Pakistan Afghanistan border dispute say they object to the recent visit of the Taliban's Foreign Minister to India and to the Afghan Taliban establishing closer ties with the Indian government. Meanwhile, 32% say they have no objection, and 16% express no opinion.

A nationally representative sample of Pakistanis aware of the recent Pakistan Afghanistan border dispute was asked the following question: ***"Recently, the Taliban's Foreign Minister visited India and met with the Indian Foreign Minister and other leaders. Some people are upset that the Afghan Taliban are establishing close relations with India, while others have no objection. In your opinion, do you object to this or not?"*** In response, 51% said 'yes, I object,' 32% said 'no, I have no objection,' and 17% said 'don't know / no opinion.'

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 556 respondents, across urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 30th October 2025 to 14th November 2025. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
