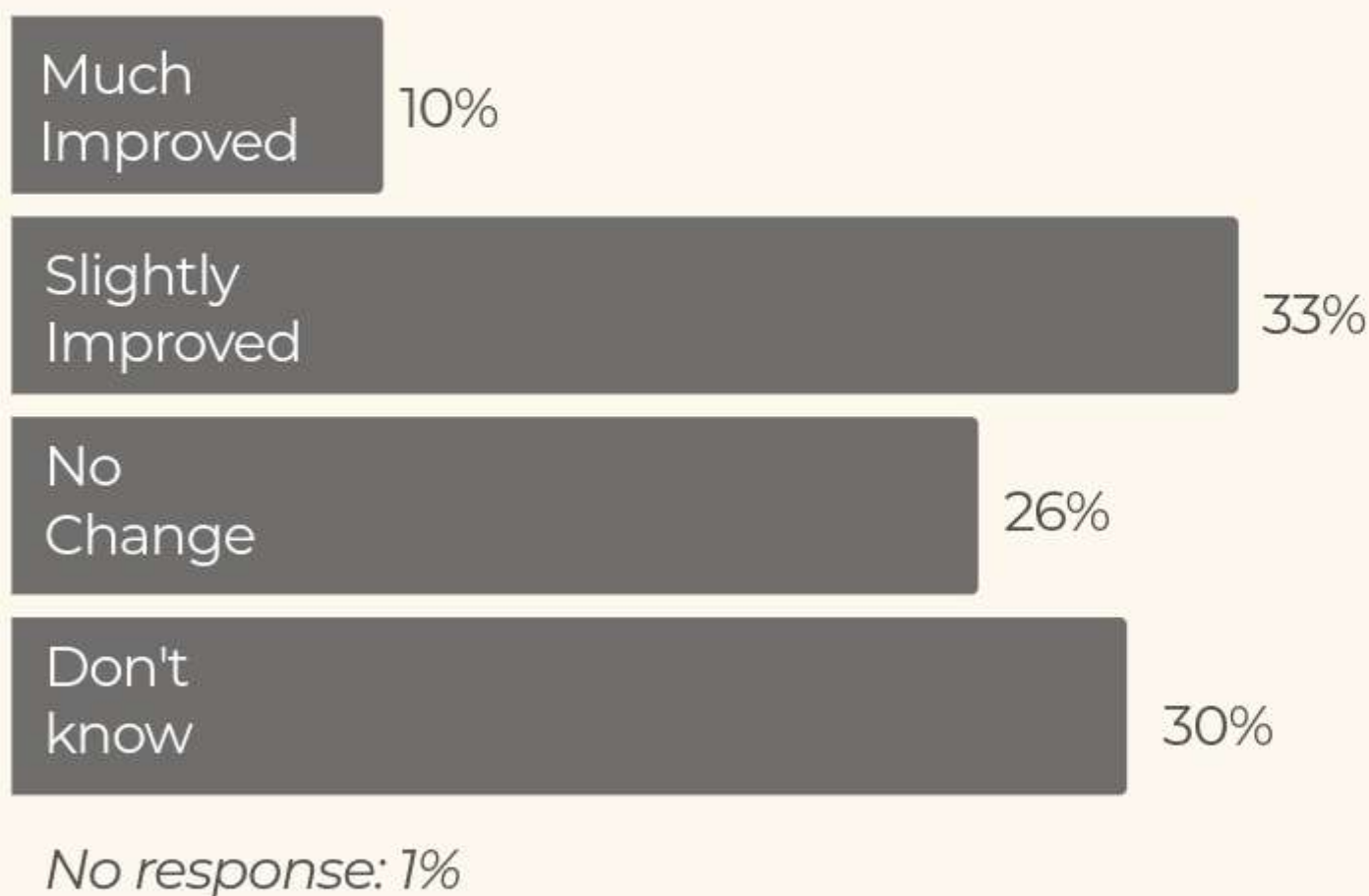

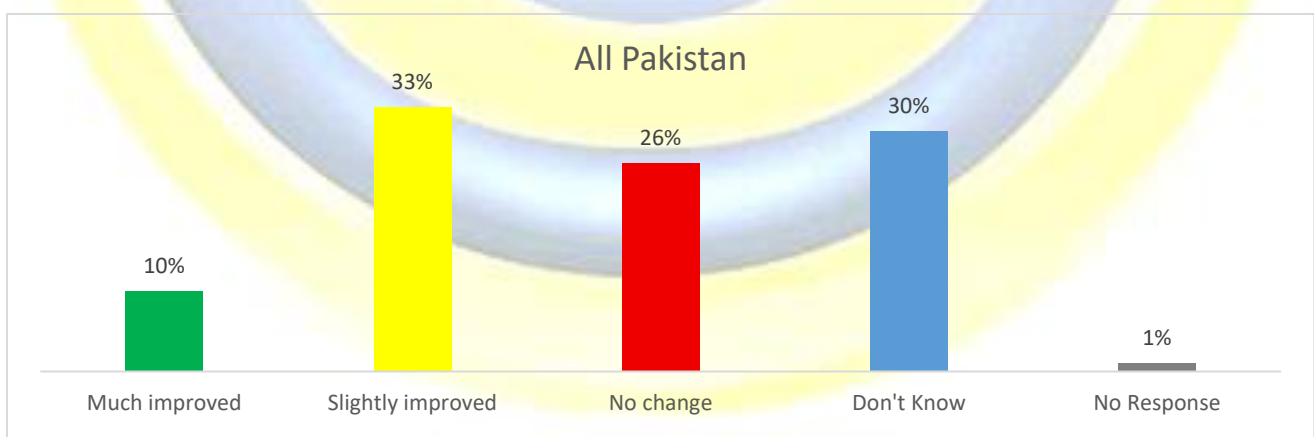
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a sizeable proportion of Pakistanis believe that food and security conditions have improved following the ceasefire in Gaza. Overall, 43% of respondents perceive some level of improvement, while 26% believe that conditions have remained unchanged.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question: **“After the ceasefire in Gaza, how much improvement has there been in food and security?”** In response, 10% said conditions had “much improved,” while 33% said they had “slightly improved.” Meanwhile, 26% felt there was “no change” in conditions. The remaining respondents either did not express an opinion or did not respond (31%).

These findings suggest cautious public optimism regarding post-ceasefire conditions in Gaza, though the sizeable proportion perceiving no change indicates lingering concerns about the durability and on-ground impact of the ceasefire, particularly in relation to food availability and security.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The survey was carried out among a sample of 1567 men and women in urban and rural areas of all Pakistan, conducted from 15th January 2026 to 3rd February 2026. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
