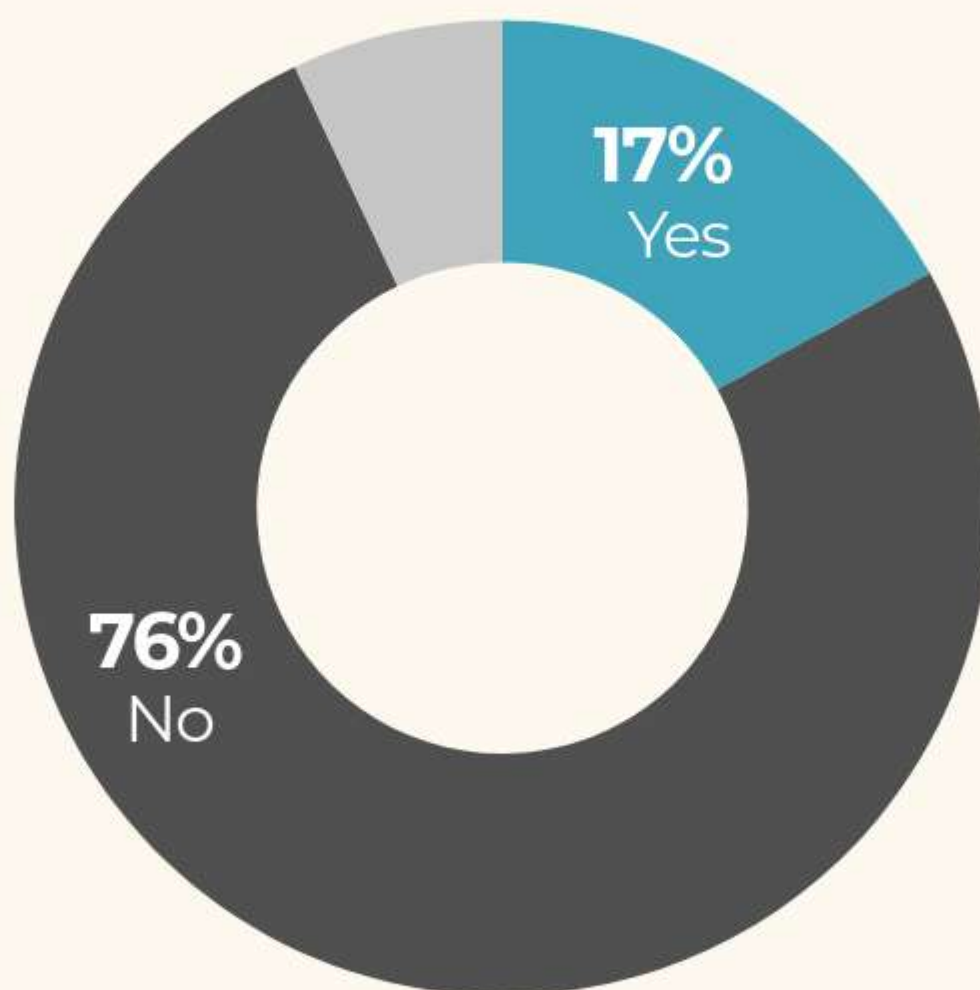

Only 17% Pakistanis Watched the Under-19 Cricket Final Between Pakistan and India, While a Large Majority (76%) Did Not. (Gallup & Gilani Survey)

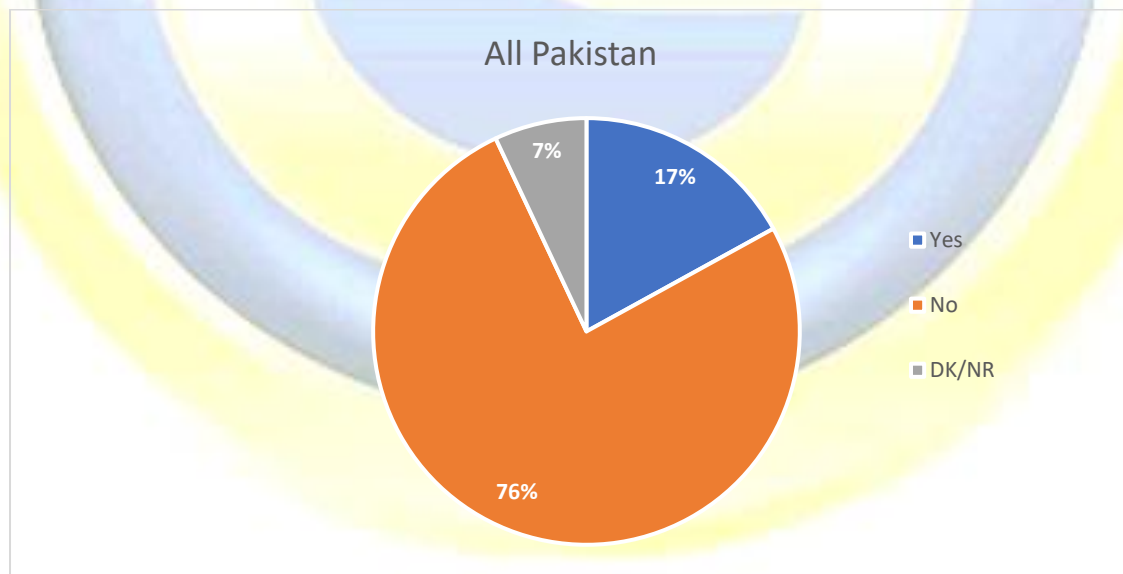

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, only 17% of Pakistanis say they got the chance to watch the final match of the Under-19 cricket team, where Pakistan defeated India, while a large majority of 76% report that they did not watch the match.

A nationally representative sample of adult Pakistanis from across the country was asked the following question: ***“Did you get the chance to watch the final match of the Under 19 cricket team, where Pakistan defeated India?”***. In response, 17% said “Yes,” indicating that a relatively small proportion of Pakistanis followed the match. In contrast, 76% said “No,” while 7% fell into the Don’t Know/No Response (DK/NR) category.

These findings suggest that while cricket remains widely followed in Pakistan, viewership of youth-level matches, even those involving traditional rivals such as India, remains limited among the general population. The results point toward a stronger public engagement with senior-level or high-stakes international matches, compared to junior competitions.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 787 respondents across urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 15 January 2026 to 03 February 2026. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
