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EDITOR'S NOTE

Dear Readers,

June 2026 represented another dynamic period for Gallup Pakistan, with a wide range of releases spanning public opinion research, administrative data analysis, digital analytics, media collaborations, and international survey work.

During the month, Gallup Pakistan released nationally representative Daily Polls on key themes including the economy, society, public safety, transport, and education. These studies continued our commitment to providing timely, evidence-based insights into the views and everyday experiences of Pakistanis.

A major focus this month was our continued analysis of publicly available administrative and survey datasets. Drawing on Punjab Development Statistics from 1971–72 to 2021–22 and ASER Pakistan 2025, we published a series of Big Data Analysis releases examining long-term shifts in transport, public finance, print media, school infrastructure, teacher qualifications, multigrade teaching, and foundational learning. Collectively, these analyses highlighted both Pakistan's development trajectory and the persistent challenges facing the country's education, infrastructure, and public service sectors.

Our digital analytics platforms also continued to expand. During June, we launched and updated key dashboards, including the Commodity Prices–Inflation Dashboard and the Flight Dashboard based on Civil Aviation Authority data. These tools are part of Gallup Pakistan's broader effort to strengthen public access to data by transforming complex datasets into accessible, interactive, and policy-relevant insights.

Gallup Pakistan's research and analytical outputs continued to generate substantial media attention during the month. Collaborative publications with Macro Pakistani explored a range of social and economic issues, including domestic aviation, female labour force participation, cryptocurrency adoption, poverty, and changing marriage patterns in Pakistan. In addition, Gallup Pakistan's analyses on educational inequalities, teacher qualifications, and school infrastructure were featured in national media outlets, reflecting sustained public and media interest in rigorous, data-driven discussion on Pakistan's social and economic transformation.

June also marked an important contribution to international public opinion research. WINMR released findings from its latest Worldviews Survey, conducted across 45 countries with over 45,000 respondents, showing that global concern about climate change remains high, though attitudes are beginning to soften in some regions. The survey highlights how economic pressures, trust in institutions, and confidence in individual action are shaping public engagement with sustainability. Gallup Pakistan conducted the fieldwork for Pakistan as part of this international survey, contributing the Pakistani perspective to a broader global conversation on climate concern and environmental responsibility.

As always, we remain committed to producing high-quality research, advancing data literacy, and contributing evidence-based perspectives to national and global conversations. We thank our readers, partners, and stakeholders for their continued trust and engagement.

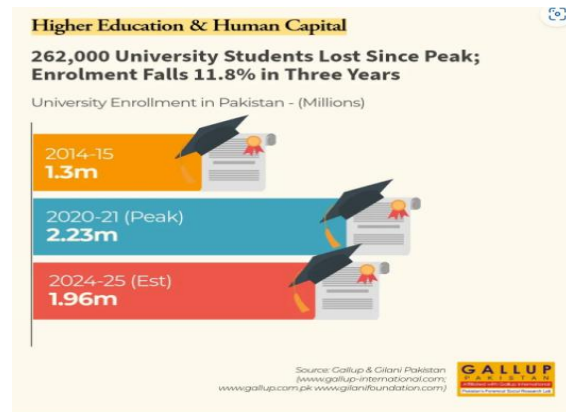
In June 2026, Gallup Pakistan released:

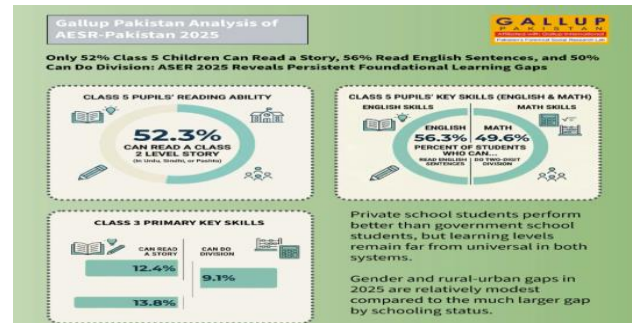

BIG DATA ANALYSIS PRESS RELEASES

- Gallup Pakistan's analysis of publicly available data from *Punjab Development Statistics* from 1971–72 to 2020–21 reveals a significant shift in Pakistan's transport system from rail to road. The analysis shows that registered vehicles in Punjab increased more than 100-fold over this period, while railway passenger volumes and fleet capacity declined substantially. ([Access here](#))

- Gallup Pakistan's analysis of publicly available data from *Punjab Development Statistics* (1972–2021) shows that Punjab's print media sector expanded substantially from the 1970s through the late 1990s, before entering a period of sharp contraction. By 2021, the province's newspaper and periodical landscape had become significantly smaller and more concentrated. ([Access here](#))
- Gallup Pakistan's analysis of publicly available data from *Punjab Development Statistics* from 1971–72 to 2021–22 shows a substantial expansion in Punjab's development spending over the past five decades. The analysis also highlights a major shift in financing patterns, with development financing moving away from federally supported programmes toward greater provincial financing and externally funded development projects. - Gallup Pakistan's analysis of publicly available data from *ASER Pakistan 2025* (National, Rural-Urban) highlights that while most schools in Pakistan provide basic infrastructure facilities, substantial disparities persist between government and private schools. The analysis shows that gaps remain particularly visible in access to electricity, sanitation, and learning-support resources such as libraries, computer labs, and science laboratories. The analysis shows that government schools report higher rates of multigrade teaching, alongside lower availability of basic infrastructure, technological resources, and learning facilities. - Gallup Pakistan's analysis of publicly available data from *ASER Pakistan 2025* reveals persistent gaps in foundational learning outcomes among school-age children in Pakistan. Gender Gaps in the Labour Market

Gallup Pakistan published an analysis of the *Pakistan Labour Force Survey 2024–25*, highlighting significant gender disparities in labour force participation, employment, informality, and social protection coverage. The analysis emphasized that Pakistan's labour market challenge extends beyond unemployment, pointing to the broader issue of women's exclusion from secure and formal economic participation. Pakistan's Domestic Aviation Market Serves a Fraction of Its Potential

Macro Pakistani, in collaboration with Gallup Pakistan, released an analysis highlighting the limited accessibility of domestic air travel in Pakistan due to high fares, limited route competition, and constrained connectivity. FAQs

What new technologies are research labs using to improve the quality of survey data?

Research labs are increasingly using digital data collection platforms, artificial intelligence (AI), and automated quality-control systems to enhance the accuracy of survey research. These technologies help researchers identify inconsistencies, detect fraudulent or duplicate responses, monitor fieldwork in real time, and improve sampling procedures. Advanced statistical software and data validation techniques also enable research labs to produce more reliable and timely insights for policymakers, businesses, and academic institutions.

KNOW YOUR PAKISTAN

- Pakistan successfully launched its indigenous Electro-Optical satellite (EO-1), enhancing the country's capabilities in precision agriculture, disaster management, environmental monitoring, and urban planning. The satellite provides high-resolution Earth observation data to support national development planning and scientific research.

- Pakistan's digital payment infrastructure, Raast, expanded significantly, processing billions of transactions and providing low-cost instant payments to individuals and businesses.
