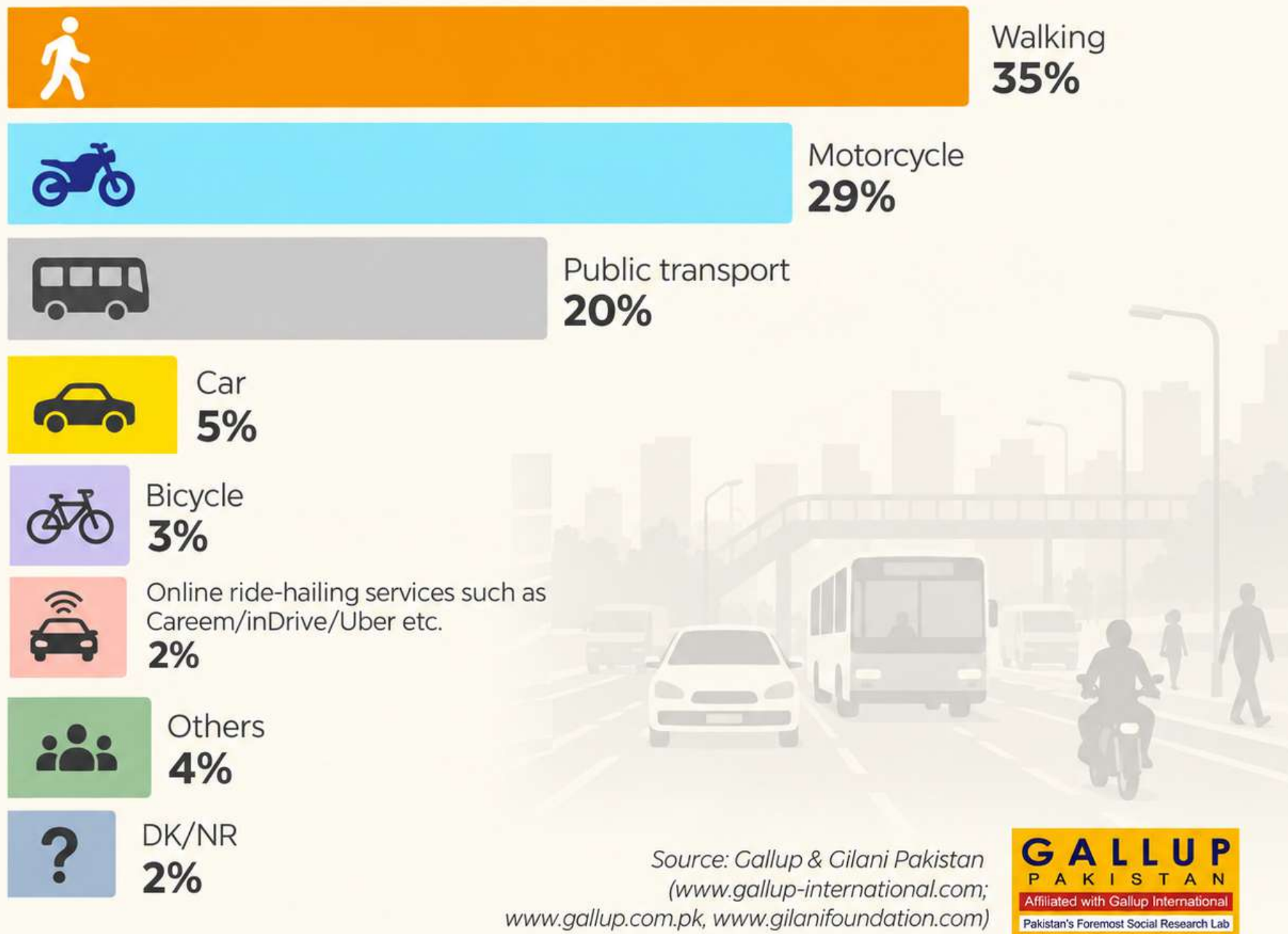


Opinion Poll | Modes of Daily Travel in Pakistan

Modes of Daily Travel in Pakistan

Walking Is the Most Common Mode of Daily Travel in Pakistan (35%), Followed by Motorcycles (29%) and Public Transport (20%) — Gallup & Gilani Survey

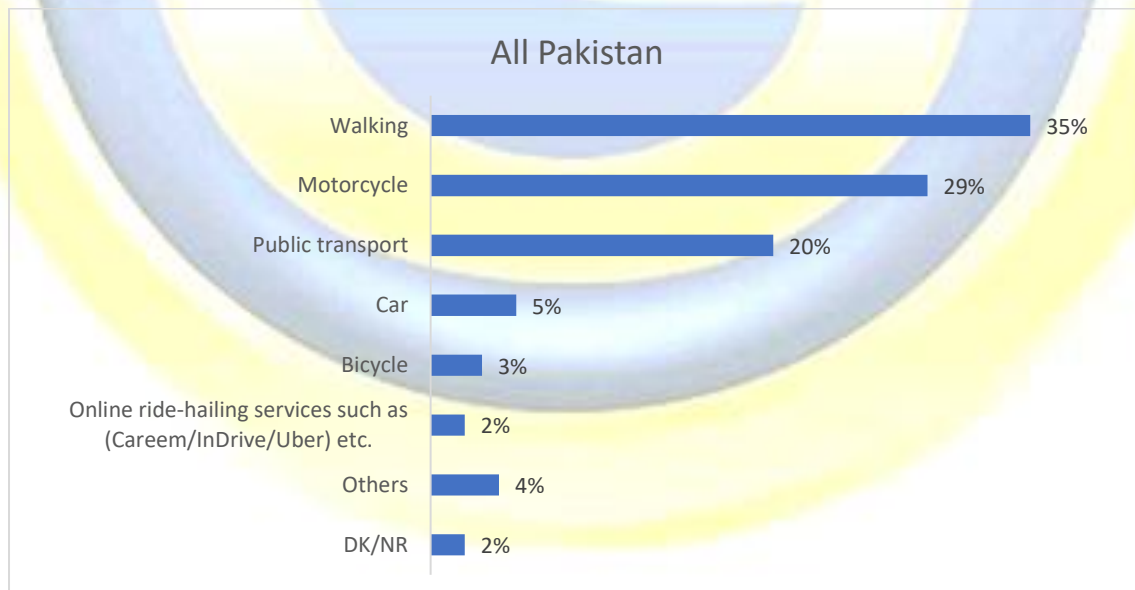

According to a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan survey, walking is the most commonly reported mode of daily travel among Pakistanis, with 35% saying they mostly walk for their daily travel. This is followed by motorcycles (29%) and public transport (20%).

A nationally representative sample of adult Pakistanis from across the country was asked the following question: **“Please tell me which of the following modes of transport you mostly use for daily travel?”** In response, 35% reported walking as their primary mode of daily travel, followed by motorcycle (29%) and public transport (20%). Smaller proportions primarily use a car (5%), bicycle (3%), or online ride-hailing services such as Careem, inDrive or Uber (2%), while 4% reported using other modes of transport and 2% gave a DK/NR response.

Overall, the findings indicate that daily travel among Pakistanis is primarily reliant on walking, motorcycles and public transport, with walking emerging as the most commonly reported mode of transportation.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 811 married men and women, in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from March 18, 2026 to March 31, 2026. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
